NORTH CENTRAL'S RESPONSE TO POST-HEARING REQUESTS

North Central Telephone Cooperative Corporation ("North Central"), by counsel, hereby files with the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Commission"), its response to the Commission's post-hearing data requests.

REQUEST NO.1

Provide North Central's interstate and intrastate access rates in Tennessee and Kentucky.

Responsible Witness: F. Thomas Rowland

<u>RESPONSE</u>:

North Central's intrastate access tariffs in Kentucky and Tennessee, which are on file with the Commission and the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, respectively, are attached hereto as Exhibit A. North Central participates in the National Exchange Carrier Association's interstate access tariff. Access charges are comprised of a variety of rate elements including transport, which is billed on a per access minute per mile basis as well as the switches (that is, host, remote, tandem) required to deliver access traffic. Therefore, terminating access charges vary based on the distance the call is transported and the office serving the end user. For illustrative purposes, North Central estimated its interstate and intrastate originating and terminating access charges based on a sampling of a single, large carrier in its largest Tennessee exchange and its only Kentucky exchange. The estimated terminating access charges are as follows:

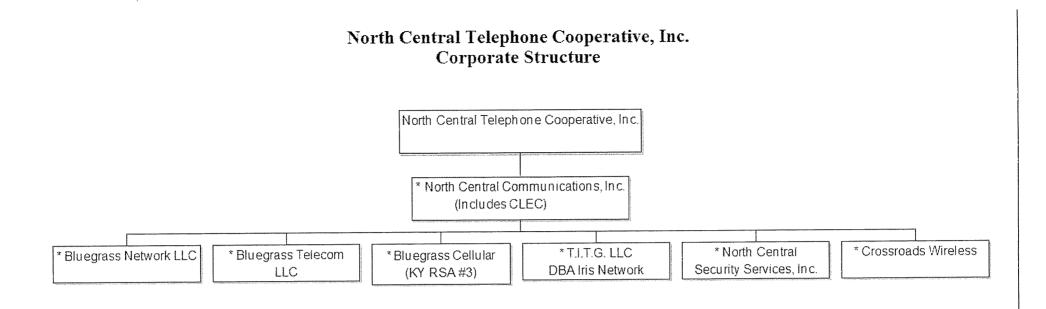
