Call Waiting -- Easy To Use!

Alerts you to an incoming call while you're on the phone.

1. Press the switchhook once to put your call on hold and take the 2nd call.
2. Repeat to go back to the 1st call.

Cancel Call Waiting -- No Incoming Calls!

Place a call and don't worry about being interrupted with an incoming call.

1. Before placing a call, dial *70 (1170 rotary) and listen for a special tone.
2. Place your call.
3. As soon as you hang up, your Call Waiting will be reactivated.

Call Forwarding -- Take Your Calls With You!

Forwards your calls to another number.

1. Lift the receiver and dial 72# (72 rotary) and wait for a special tone.
2. Dial the number you want your calls forwarded to. When that call is answered, Call Forwarding is activated.
3. If no answer or if busy, hang up and repeat the above steps. If you do this within 2 minutes, you'll hear two short tones notifying you when Call Forwarding is activated.
4. When Call Forwarding is activated, the phone will make one short ring each time a call is forwarded.
5. If you forward a call to a long-distance number, you (not the caller) will be billed the long-distance charges.
6. To discontinue Call Forwarding, dial 73# (73 rotary) and wait for a confirmation tone.

Three-Way Calling -- Great For Families!

Adds a third person to your phone conversation.

1. Press the switchhook to place the first caller on hold.
2. When you hear a special tone, dial the third person.
3. When the third person answers, you may speak privately first then press the switchhook again and all three will be on the line. If there's no answer, press the switchhook to get back to the first caller.
4. To disconnect the third caller, press the switchhook. To disconnect the first caller, hang up.

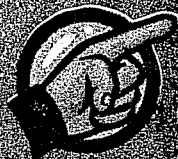

Speed Calling – Fast Action Dialing!

Stores up to 30 numbers for simple 2-digit dialing.

To Program:

1. Lift the receiver and dial 75# (75 rotary) and listen for a special tone.
2. Dial a 2-digit code (20-49) to assign a telephone number.
3. Dial the phone number you want to be Speed Dialed. (For long-distance numbers, dial "1" plus the area code.)
4. When you hear two short tones, that 2-digit Speed Dialed number is activated.

To Use Speed Calling:

1. Pick up the phone and dial the 2-digit assigned number.
2. Press # sign.

To Change Your List:

1. Lift the receiver and dial 75# (75 rotary) and wait for the special tone.
2. Dial the 2-digit number you wish to change.

Anonymous Call Rejection – Keep Your Privacy!

Rejects anonymous or private number calls.

1. ★88 activates the feature.
2. ★87 disconnects the feature.

Warm Line – A Security Measure!

Automatically dials a predetermined number.

1. Call NCTC to establish a predetermined number to be dialed or to change an existing number.
2. When the receiver is off the hook for a few seconds, the number will be dialed automatically.

Automatic Call Back – A Time Saver!

Automatically redials a busy number.

1. When you get a busy signal, hang up and lift the receiver again and dial ★66 (1166 rotary) and hang up.
2. When the line is free, your phone will ring a short-short-long tone. When you pick up, the earlier number will be dialed.

Automatic Recall – One Easy Step!

Redials the last number to call you.

1. Lift the receiver and dial ***69** (1169 rotary) to hear a recorded announcement telling you the last number to call your line. Dial "1" to call that number or dial ***89** (1189 rotary) to temporarily turn this feature off.

Call Trace – Protect Yourself!

Traces calls for law enforcement.

1. Call NCTC to get details on putting a trace on your line.
2. Once that is established and you get a nuisance call, dial ***57** (1157 rotary) and listen for a tone confirming the call has been traced. The number you traced will be held at NCTC. We will release it to law enforcement upon your request.

Teen Line – Managing Busy Households!

Assigns two numbers with different rings to the same line.

1. NCTC will give you a second phone number with a two short ring tone, on your existing line.
2. Your main line will ring normally. When you hear the two short ring tone you know it is a call to the teen line.

Selective Call Block – Avoid Unwanted Calls!

Rejects calls from preprogrammed numbers. Holds 12 numbers.

1. Dial ***60** (1160 rotary) to hear a message telling you if the feature is on or off.
2. Press "3" to activate or to deactivate.
3. To block the last number to call you, press # (12 rotary), dial "01" and press # again.
4. To block a specific number, press # (12 rotary), dial the number you want to block and press #. Those calls will be routed to a rejection message.
5. To remove a number from your list, dial ***** (12 rotary), and dial the number you want to receive calls from and press the ***** again.

Call Forwarding Remote Access – Calls From Anywhere!

Use Call Forwarding from any location.

1. Dial the appropriate access number (see list on page 6).
2. Enter the 7-digit phone number to forward, followed by your PIN (set by NCTC).
3. Enter a code to activate or deactivate. Dial **72#** to activate.

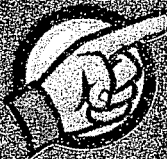

Call Forwarding (No Answer/Busy) – Manage Your Calls!

Directs your calls to another number.

Call Forward No Answer

1. Dial ***92** and dial the number to forward your calls to.
2. If the call is answered, Call Forward No Answer is activated. If no answer or the line is busy, hang up and repeat step 1. You will hear a confirmation tone.
3. To set up the number of rings before the call is forwarded, dial ***96** and listen for two beeps.
4. Dial the number of rings you want, then hang up after two beeps.
5. To deactivate this feature, dial ***93**.

Call Forward Busy

1. Dial ***90** and the number your calls will be forwarded to.
2. If the call is answered, the feature is activated, if no answer or the line is busy, hang up and repeat step 1. You will hear a confirmation tone.
3. To deactivate, dial ***91**.

Caller ID/Call Waiting Deluxe – One Simple Step!

Shows the name and number of a caller while you're on the line.

1. Requires a Caller ID/Call Waiting Deluxe Display device (sold separately).
2. The name and number of a caller will appear on the device between the first and second ring while you're on the line. If you wish to answer, press the switchhook.

Caller ID with Name/Number – A Great Feature!

Shows the name and number of a caller.

1. Install your Caller ID device (sold separately) to see the name and number of callers. This will appear between the first and second ring.

Caller Number Delivery Blocking – One Simple Step!

Blocks your number on other Caller ID devices.

1. Dial ***67** (1167 rotary) before dialing a number (a free service from NCTC)

Controls who makes toll calls from your phone.

1. Lift the receiver and dial 1 + area code + number. You will hear a message that call blocking is activated. Enter your PIN (set by NCTC) and # sign to override.

Control long-distance calls.

1. To change your PIN, lift the receiver and dial *97 and enter a feature access code for the PIN you want to change (*94) followed by # sign.
2. Enter your PIN and # sign.

Voice Mail w/Call Forwarding No Answer – A Great Service!

Stores all your messages without an answering machine.

Setting Up Your Voice Mail

1. Dial *92 and listen for 2 beeps.
2. Dial the appropriate access number (see list below) and wait for Voice Mail to answer. Then hang up.
3. Dial *96 to set the number of rings before Voice Mail answers.
4. Listen for 2 beeps and enter the number of rings desired.
5. Listen for 2 fast beeps then hang up. Voice Mail is now set up.
6. To deactivate, dial *93.

Accessing Your Voice Mail

From the phone subscribed to the service: Dial the Voice Mail Access Number listed on page 8.
From a different phone:

1. Dial Voice Mail Access Number.
2. Enter your 10-digit mailbox number (area code and phone number).
3. Enter your password and press #. (Default password 0000)

Retrieving Your Messages:

1. Access your Voice Mailbox.
2. Your first new message may play immediately. If not, press 1 to listen to your messages.
3. Press 1 to listen to new messages.
4. Press 2 to listen to saved message.
5. Press 3 to delete the message and play the next.
6. Press 4 to save the message.
7. Press 5 to reply to the message. (will not reply back to long-distance numbers)

8. Press 6 to forward the message.
9. Press 7 to skip backward in the message.
10. Press 8 to pause the message.
11. Press 9 to skip forward in the message.

Recording a Greeting

1. Access your Voice Mailbox.
2. Press 9 for the mailbox set up menu.
3. Press 1 for greeting options.
4. Press 4 to record your greeting.
5. Record your greeting and then press #.
6. Press 2 to keep your greeting.

Changing Your Password

1. Access your Voice Mailbox.
2. Press 9 for mailbox set up menu.
3. Press 2 to change your password.
4. Enter your new password and then press #.
5. When prompted to verify password, enter it again and press #.

Using the Voice Mail to E-Mail Feature

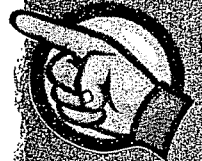
1. Check your e-mail as normal.
2. When you get a voice mail message, you will receive an e-mail from "your telephone" delivered to your inbox. The message will have an attachment.
3. Open the attachment and your media player will play the message.
4. You can save the attachment onto your PC or delete it.

Special Programs: NCTC® Helping Customers Find Solutions

North Central Telephone is offering two unique programs that will help some customers in paying their phone bills. The federally funded programs — called Lifeline and Link-Up — provide special discounts to qualifying customers.

Lifeline

This program provides a \$8.25 monthly discount to qualifying low-income subscribers in Tennessee and a \$13.50 monthly discount to qualifying low-income subscribers in Kentucky. The new rate waives the customer's federal subscriber line charge and reduces the local service charge.

Link-Up

This program provides a discount of up to 50 percent off the cost of basic telephone service installation (up to a maximum of \$30) to qualifying low-income subscribers.

To Qualify for the Programs:

You must receive benefits from at least one of the following agencies and provide proof of receipt to North Central Telephone Cooperative:

- Medicaid
- Food Stamps
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance/ Section 8
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Program (TANF)
- National School Lunch Free Lunch Program (NSL)

Tennessee subscribers may be eligible if their total household income is at or below 125% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Telecommunications Devices Access Program (TDAP)

This program, implemented by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, will distribute appropriate telecommunications devices so that persons who are deaf, deaf and blind, severely hard-of-hearing and vision-impaired or severely speech-impaired may effectively use basic telephone service. Devices are issued on a first-come, first-served basis, without charge. However, there are certain qualifiers that may enable individuals to receive devices on a priority basis. Information on distribution, eligibility requirements and qualifiers and an application may be found on the TRA website at www.state.tn.us/tra or by calling 1-800-342-8359, ext. 179 (V) or 1-888-276-0677 (615-253-4698) (V/TTY).

Dial 7-1-1 To "Relay Your Way"

To connect to the Tennessee or Kentucky Relay System, all you have to do is dial 7-1-1 in your state. This is a toll-free number that will connect you automatically.

The Relay Systems for Tennessee and Kentucky are state-funded services that enable persons who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, deaf/blind or speech-disabled to communicate over the phone with standard telephone users. Callers can access operators 24 hours a day and will be connected by voice or by text to the person they want to call.

Local calls placed from a pay phone through Relay are free of charge. People who use a pay phone to make long-distance calls through Relay must give the calling assistant a way to bill the call either through a credit card or collect dialing. Coins cannot be used to pay for a long-distance Relay call from a pay phone.

In Kentucky, dial 711 or 1-800-648-6056. For voice calls, dial 1-800-648-6057. For Spanish-to-Spanish, dial 1-866-490-4403. For speech-to-speech, dial 1-888-244-6111.

GUIDELINES FOR CUSTOMER PROVIDED EQUIPMENT:

With the deregulation of the telephone industry, many changes have taken place. Now customers may choose to maintain their own equipment. This choice, made by several subscribers, has caused changes to be made in your Repair Service Department. Also, different questions must be answered when reporting trouble to ensure you, the member, of "top-quality service." To assist our customers, we have prepared some basic guidelines designed to improve response time and prevent unnecessary expense.

WHAT YOU SHOULD CHECK BEFORE REPORTING TROUBLE:

1. If you have any customer owned equipment and/or wiring, disconnect to see if trouble clears. If we make a service call to your premises and determine that the trouble is caused by your equipment, a premises visit charge plus expenses will be added to your account.
2. Check all phones to make sure they are hung up properly.
3. Check phones to determine if trouble exists on all phones or just one.

TO CHECK CUSTOMER PROVIDED EQUIPMENT:

Go to the House Protector attached to the outside of the building. Plug the working phone directly into the test jack. If the phone operates, the fault is with the inside wiring. If the phone does not operate, call repair service, 666-2155.

Kentucky Relay Service

Kentucky Relay Service presents a new and easier way to reach the Relay. Simply dial "711" to reach the service that allows people with speech or hearing impairments who use a text telephone (TTY/TDD) to communicate with people who use a conventional telephone.

WARNING

The law provides that any person who fails to relinquish a public-pay telephone when informed that such a line is needed for an emergency call to a fire department, or for medical aid or ambulance service, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Annoyance Calls

The law provides that it should be unlawful for any person or persons to communicate to another within this state by means of any telephonic conversation, any lewd, obscene or lascivious remarks, suggestions or proposals manifestly intended to embarrass, disturb or annoy the person to whom the said remarks, suggestions or proposals are made.

The telephone company is concerned about obscene and harassing calls and is trying to help stop them. You don't have to talk or listen to such calls – just hang up. If the call persists, call your Telephone Company Business Office. We have electronic equipment available to assist in determining offenders, which we will use if necessary, with the help of local law enforcement authorities. We also retain the right to disconnect or remove the phone service of anyone making such calls. We want you to know that we're doing all we can to help you and your family.

Obtaining Telephone Service By Fraudulent Means

The law provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to obtain or attempt to obtain telephone service by fraudulent means with the intent to avoid payment for lawful charges. This includes not only the obtaining of local service but the obtaining of long distance service by fraudulent schemes, devices, means or methods, with intent to avoid payment.

Any person or persons violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof will be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by fine not exceeding \$1,000, or by both, in the discretion of the court.

County-Wide Calling: A Member Advantage

As part of the membership advantage of North Central Telephone, all cooperative members can call anywhere within their own county toll-free. This program, which is part of a state-wide County-Wide Calling Program, allows many of our subscribers to make toll-free calls to areas within their county where they conduct a lot of business.

However, you must still dial a "1" for calls within these counties which are outside of the NCTC service area. (If you could dial the number regularly before October 1, 1993, you can still dial it regularly. However, if you had to dial a "1" before October 1, you must still dial a "1" before the number.)

The change will be made on your bill – calls within your county will not be included on your telephone bill.

Please refer to the chart below to figure out which calls are toll-free for you and whether or not you must dial a "1" for those calls.

In order for county-wide calling to function properly, NCTC is dependent on connecting carriers to participate in the county-wide file sharing process of telephone numbers. NCTC makes every effort to provide county-wide calling, however contingent upon the cooperation of connection carriers, some telephone numbers may not be eligible for county-wide calling.

Types of Calls

STATION-TO-STATION

Call Station-to-Station if you wish to talk with anyone who answers. Rates for calls that you dial yourself are lower rates than calls dialed by the "OPERATOR". Charging begins when the called telephone is answered.

PERSON-TO-PERSON

Call Person-to-Person when you wish to talk to a particular person or extension number. Tell the "OPERATOR" you wish to make a "Person-to-Person" call. Rates are higher than Station-to-Station and also apply when you talk to an alternative person or extension. Charging starts when conversation begins.

CONFERENCE

You can talk to several people in different places at the same time. Tell the "OPERATOR" you wish to make a "Conference" call. A special charge will be made for this type of call.

COLLECT

You can call "Collect" if the person or firm you are calling agrees to pay the charge. If you want to make a "Collect" call, please be sure to tell the "OPERATOR" when you place the call.

COIN CALLS

From coin phones, see the instruction card on or near the phone, or dial "OPERATOR."

CALLING CARD

Customers who have Calling Cards may place calls and charge them to their Calling Card number. These calls require "OPERATOR" assistance to record the Calling Card number and may be either Station-to-Station or Person-to-Person. Customers may apply for a Calling Card by calling their local business office.

PREPAID CALLING CARDS

NCTC offers Prepaid Calling Cards for a flat rate of 20 cents per minute, or a special \$10 Calling Card for 50-minutes of long-distance.

BILL TO THE THIRD

Customers may place calls and transfer the charge to another telephone. This service requires "OPERATOR" assistance. The call may be either Station-to-Station or Person-to-Person.

MOBILE CALLS - AIR-LAND-MARINE

You can make local and long-distance calls to automobiles, trucks, aircraft, boats and ships. Ask the "OPERATOR" for the Mobile, Marine or High Seas Operator. For information on other Communications Common Carriers, consult the Yellow Pages or other business guides.

OVERSEAS CALLS

You can call practically every telephone in the world from your telephone. Tell the "OPERATOR" you wish to place an overseas call and give her the name of the country you are calling.

WIDE AREA TELEPHONE SERVICE (INWARD WATS)

Station-to-station long-distance calls may be made, without charge to you, to those customers who have wide area telephone service. This service is offered to their customers calling from specific locations. Dial "1" then Area Code "800" then the special numbers of the customers having this service.

YOU WILL NOT BE CHARGED:

- If you reach a wrong number. (Dial the "OPERATOR" and tell her. She will make sure that you are not charged for the call.)
- If the telephone you call is busy and does not answer
- If you hang up before dialing the complete number.

THERE IS A CHARGE:

- If you have an "OPERATOR" verify the status of local numbers. The charge will not apply if there is trouble on the line.
- If you ask the "OPERATOR" to interrupt a call so you can get through. The charge applies even if the called party does not agree to release the line
- If you use an "OPERATOR" to complete a local call that you could have dialed yourself.

In March of 1951, North Central Telephone Cooperative, Inc., was the solution to a challenge: how to connect the rural communities of Clay, Macon, Smith, Sumner, and Trousdale counties in Tennessee, and Allen County in Kentucky with state-of-the-art telecommunications service while never losing the hometown perspective. **And now — 56 years later — NCTC can say that it still maintains that same goal of local service with a global approach.**

A lot has changed over the last 56 years. NCTC has grown to provide service to more than 22,000 member/subscribers throughout the Upper Cumberland of Tennessee and Kentucky. **Our service mission has never wavered. Only the technology has changed.**

NCTC encompasses the spectrum of consumer-based telecommunications for the 21st century, including digital telephone service (1969), practical technology of advanced calling features (which have been continuously updated since 1987), the expansion of services adding cellular partnerships with U.S. Cellular and Bluegrass Cellular (1990), equal access to long-distance carriers (1992), Digital Satellite Service (1994), Long Distance (1998), local Internet dial-up and dedicated accounts (1995), computer hardware and software with the addition of North Central Computer Technologies (1999) and residential and business security systems with the addition of North Central Security Services (2000), the availability of Digital Subscriber Line (2000). And the monumental new network in Scottsville City, providing local telephone service, Internet/DSL and video services was introduced in 2002. In 2003, NCTC worked to get DSL to more of its cooperative customers and began building its cooperative digital entertainment network. 2004 marked a big year in network enhancements with the addition of digital entertainment, high-definition TV, a new service allowing customers to download an image from our calendar for a screensaver, and a new office in Westmoreland. As part of its ongoing commitment to the community, NCTC added local school channels for Scottsville, Macon County and Westmoreland (2005) while also continuing to expand the service area for Digital Cable TV. Also in 2005, NCTC introduced WildBlue satellite Internet access for remote customers.

2006 brought online bill payment capabilities, a new more user-friendly website with a kid's website called Telecom Park and the introduction of local programming on the local channel. NCTC also worked throughout 2006 to expand its reach of DSL and Digital Cable TV.

In addition to new services and features, NCTC is always planning for the future. With the construction of fiber-optic technologies, new remote switching stations, additional exchanges, and enhanced local network connections, NCTC's ring of service is ever-widening.

General Information

Bill and Payment Information

All telephone bills are rendered monthly and are due in full 15 days after the bill is rendered. Bills paid after 15 days of the due date are subject to a 2% late charge. These bills cover local service charges, as well as toll (long-distance) charges and any other charges.

Bills may be paid by mail or in person at our business office in Lafayette, Tenn. or Westmoreland, Tenn., or in Scottsville, KY. A depository is located at each business office for the use of subscribers who wish to pay when the office is closed. And, you can use the drive-thru window at both locations.

Automatic Bank Draft

NCTC wants to make your life as easy and convenient as possible, and that is why Automatic Bank Draft is one of our most useful features. Each month, your NCTC payment is automatically withdrawn from your bank account — so you never have to write a check. Plus, you will get a copy of your telephone bill from NCTC before your bank draft payment is withdrawn 10 days after the bill is rendered.

Business Transactions

At North Central Telephone Cooperative, our aim is to render a service that will be satisfactory to our member-subscribers, although difficulties will sometimes occur despite our efforts to avoid them. Through the NCTC business offices, general instructions and information are provided for your convenience regarding placing long-distance calls, reporting telephones that are out of order and making emergency calls. All business transactions, including applications for new service, changes or additions to existing service, and discontinuance of service should be taken up with the NCTC business office either by telephone, personal visit or letter.

Tariffs

Tariffs, which are approved by the Regulatory Commission, show rates, rules and regulations for telephone service and facilities, and are available in our business offices for public inspection.

Advertising Telephone Numbers

North Central Telephone Cooperative reserves the right to change the number of any subscriber. All telephone numbers are the property of NCTC. The rapid expansion of the telephone system sometimes requires the changing of these numbers. For this reason, stationery, signs, cards and other advertising literature should not be printed in large quantities. Residential telephones are installed with the understanding that they will be used for normal social activities and not in connection with any business.

Advertising a residential telephone number for business purposes will be considered sufficient cause for the Corporation to charge business rates.

General Information (continued)

Recording Telephone Conversations

A short "beep" tone heard over the telephone about every 15 seconds indicates that the person with whom you are speaking is recording your conversation by means of connecting an electronic recording machine to the line. The "beep" signal is produced automatically by a device which connects the recorder to the telephone line.

Use of a recorder without this signal is unlawful. If you do not want a record made of what you are saying, ask the person with whom you are talking to disconnect the recording device. If disconnected, you will not hear the signal.

Telephone Directories

Telephone directories distributed from time-to-time by North Central Telephone Cooperative remain the property of North Central Telephone Cooperative. The directories shall not be mutilated and shall be surrendered upon request or upon delivery of the subsequent issue.

All subscribers (both residential and business) are listed alphabetically in the white section of this directory. The yellow and green sections list only those who pay a business rate.

Protecting Yourself in the Long-Distance Game

How NCTC Members Can Prevent Themselves From Being "Slammed"

North Central Telephone Cooperative customers can now choose their long-distance carriers for intraLATA long-distance calls (calls throughout northern Middle Tennessee). NCTC customers have been able to choose their long-distance carrier for all other long-distance calls for several years. This new choice allows customers to use the same long-distance carrier for all long-distance calls or to choose long-distance carriers based on their specific calling needs.

If you would like to change your intraLATA or interLATA long-distance carrier, if you have any questions about who your long-distance carriers are or who your choices are for long-distance calling, please call North Central Telephone at (615) 666-2151 in Lafayette, (270) 622-7500 in Scottsville or (615) 644-6282 in Westmoreland.

According to a recent ruling by the Federal Communications Commission, local exchange carriers like North Central Telephone Cooperative can no longer contact customers to verify requested changes in their long-distance service.

Previously, NCTC mailed letters as a courtesy to make sure that any change in long-distance carriers had actually been approved by the customer. Because of an FCC ruling, we have discontinued this independent verification process for all long-distance carriers except North Central Long Distance.

Without such verification, you may fall victim to "slamming". That means changing your long-distance service without your full knowledge or consent.

If you change your long-distance carrier, you must also contact your new long-distance carrier to set up a billing procedure. If you don't, your new carrier will charge you the "casual dialing" rate for your long-distance calls. This rate is typically higher than the one that may have convinced you to switch.

You can have your long-distance carrier "frozen" so that it cannot be changed without your personal consent. If, however, you are a North Central Long Distance customer, your service was frozen when you signed up. This means you never have to worry about your choice being changed.

NCTC wants you to understand all the implications of changes in your long-distance service. If you want to confirm that your current long-distance carrier is the one you've actually chosen, you can call this number: 1-700-555-4141.

What Is Slamming and Cramming?

NCTC® Gives You the Information You Need

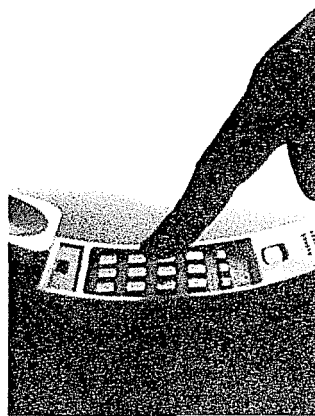
It is important that every NCTC customer watch to make sure their monthly bill does not reflect fees erroneously charged by long-distance companies.

Reportedly, many long-distance companies are "slamming" and "cramming" customers across the country, which means customers are being charged for services they never ordered from companies they never selected.

"Slamming" occurs when a long-distance carrier has been changed without the customer's consent. In a case reported nationally, a long-distance carrier used the acronym "HOLD" as the name of their company. When calling on a potential customer, the representative would ask if the customer could be put on "hold." When the customer agreed to be placed on hold, in reality they agreed to have their long-distance carrier changed to that company.

"Cramming" occurs when a long-distance carrier has charged a customer for features or services the customer does not have. Customers should also review their bills for charges listed under "paging" or "Internet" or some other service that they did not request.

If you discover any unwanted charges on your telephone bill, you should contact your long-distance carrier directly to correct the information. You also have the option of contacting the FCC by visiting its website at www.fcc.gov/consumers/ for information on how to take action, or by calling the FCC toll-free number at 1-888-CallFCC (1-888-225-5322).

Do-Not-Call List

The Tennessee Regulatory Authority and Kentucky Office of the Attorney General have initiated a "Do-Not-Call" list aimed at stopping unwanted telemarketing calls.

Once customers place their information on the appropriate state list, telemarketers are not allowed to contact them for any reason.

Protection You Need

Make sure their monthly bill does not include "cramping" and "cramming" charges for services they never requested.

Cramping has been changed without the consent of their company. When calling on the line, the representative would ask if the customer would like to "hold." When the customer hangs up, in reality they agreed to have their service changed to that company. This occurs when a long-distance carrier changes a customer for features or services they never requested. Customers should also review their bill for unwanted charges on your telephone contact with your long-distance carrier. You also have the option of visiting its website at www.fcc.gov for information on how to take action, or call the number at 1-888-CallFCC (1-888-225-3372).

How To Connect Your Inside Wire To Network Interface Device

The protector or network interface device enables customers to connect their own telephone wiring with the telephone company's network.

To connect your inside wiring to the new multi-purpose protector, follow the steps shown in the illustrations.

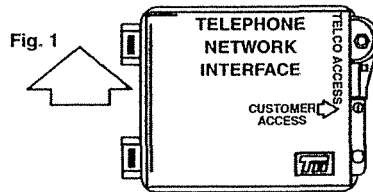

Open the Unit (See Fig. 1)

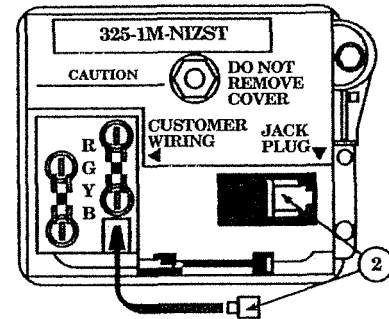
1. Loosen the screw marked "customer access."
2. Open the outer cover.

Connect the Inside Wiring

(See Fig. 2)

1. Disconnect inside wiring modular plug from jack.
2. Your inside wiring ends with separate wires, as shown. Each wire is in a different color — red, green, black, yellow.
3. Insert inside wiring through rubber grommet at bottom of protector. Push any extra wire length back into building.
4. Connect inside wires to screw terminals. WIRE COLORS MUST BE MATCHED WITH COLORS MARKED BESIDE EACH SCREW TERMINAL. In some cases, you may not have a black and/or yellow wire. If a black wire is present, do not use. Bend black wire out of the way.
5. Reconnect inside wiring modular plug to jack.

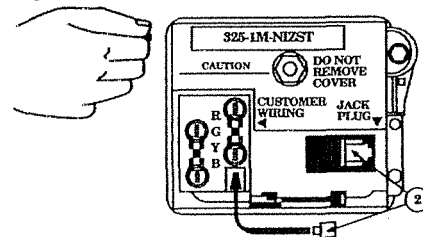
1. Slide the outer cover all the way down over the top of the unit.

How to Test Your Inside Wiring with Network Interface Device

1. Disconnect the inside wiring modular plug from the jack.
2. Connect the modular plug of a working telephone directly into the jack.
3. If the telephone operates correctly, the trouble is in the inside wiring. If the telephone does not act properly, contact repair service at 666-2155.

How To Connect Your Phones

The illustrations below should be helpful to you when installing or disconnecting your telephones.

Illustrations 1 through 4 show wall receptacles (standard jacks) which can accommodate modular telephone cords. To install your phone, match the plug at the end of the telephone cord with the receptacle and insert. To disconnect the phone, squeeze the clip on the plug and pull out the receptacle.

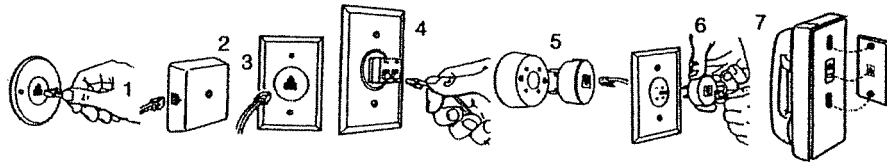
Illustrations 5 and 6 show receptacles (non-standard jacks) which can be made to accommodate modular telephone cords by the use of adapters. The adapters simply plug into the

receptacle. With the adapter in place, follow the above steps to install your phone.

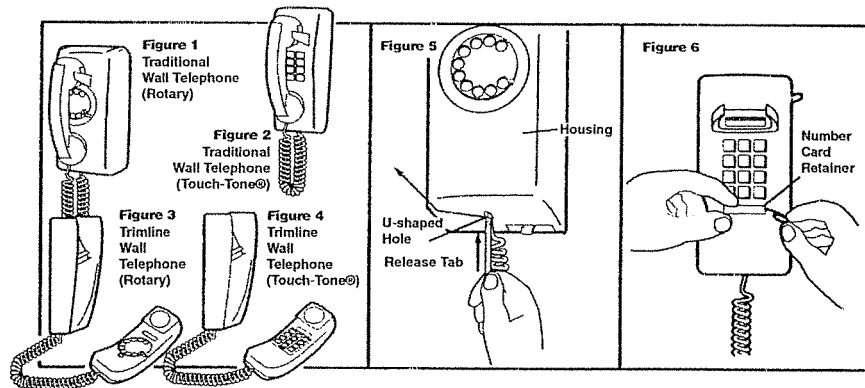
A receptacle for a wall mounted telephone is shown in illustration 7. To connect your wall phone, match the holes in the back of the telephone with the rivets on the wall mounting, push the telephone lightly against the mounting while sliding it down into place over the rivets. To disconnect, slide the telephone up to lift it off the rivets, then pull the phone away from the receptacle. Types of modular jacks other than those shown in the illustrations may be encountered.

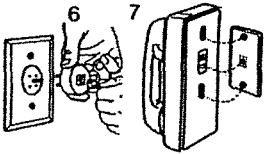

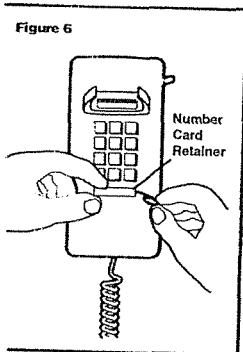

Instructions:

1. **Caution:** Your telephone may have varying amounts of electricity in the wires and screws. Therefore, to avoid the possibility of electrical shock, follow the instructions below:

If you have a telephone at a location other than the one you are converting, take the handset off the hook. (This will keep the phone from ringing and reduce the possibility of you contacting electricity. While you're doing this, ignore messages coming from the handset which ask you to hang up the phone.) If you have only one telephone, take the handset of that telephone off the hook.

- **Avoid hand contact with bare wires or screws.**
- **Use tools with insulated handles or use rubber gloves.**
- **Do not install this device while a thunderstorm is in the vicinity.**

2. Determine if your telephone is already modular. It is, if any of the following conditions exists:

- Both ends of the handset cord can be unplugged.
- The telephone is mounted on a 3" x 4 1/2" stainless steel plate.
- It can be removed by lifting it up and pulling it out.

If your telephone is not modular, follow the instructions below which apply to the wall telephones shown in figures 1-4.

Note: The remaining illustrations found throughout these instructions are intended to show a typical phone. Your specific phone may have slightly different location for number card retainers, telephone wire entry points, screw lugs and mounting screws.

For traditional wall telephone (rotary), see figure 1.

3. Locate the U-shaped hole in the bottom of the wall set (where the handset cord enters the wall set—see figure 5).

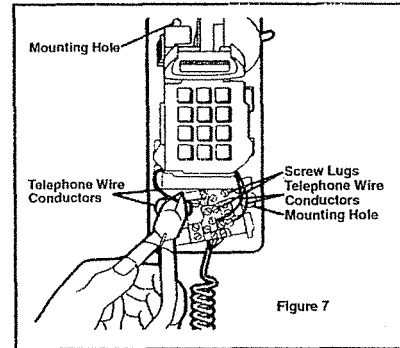

4. Place a blunt object (such as a pencil eraser) against the release tab found in the U-shaped hole (see figure 5).
5. To release the housing, press in on the bottom of the housing while pressing up with the pencil on the release tab.
6. Pull the housing toward you, unhooking the latch from the spring at the top of the phone. Now go to step 11.

For other phones shown in figures 2, 3, & 4, proceed with Step 7.

7. Locate the small hole on the side of the clear plastic number card retainer (see figure 6).
8. Insert a straightened paper clip into the hole and bend outward, causing the plastic to pop out.
9. Remove the number card, exposing two screws.
10. Remove these two screws and lift the housing off the base.

For all wall telephones:

11. Locate the telephone wire(s) entering your phone. You may have to remove the phone from the wall to locate the wire(s). If this is necessary, follow step 13.
12. With wire cutters, cut the four colored conductors (red, green, yellow and black) coming from the wire(s) found above, at the screw lugs (see figure 7).
13. Remove the two screws holding the telephone to the wall and remove the phone.

The Mission of North Central Telephone Cooperative

In 1949, the Rural Electrification Agency (now referred as the Rural Utilities Service) authorized provision of low cost loans to assist in the organization and construction of rural telephone systems. The people in rural Tennessee and Kentucky were largely without good, dependable telephone service because it was not possible for the large for-profit telephone companies to provide that service in areas where the population was so sparse and the territory so rugged.

In March of 1951, the North Central Telephone Cooperative was organized and began the difficult and often arduous process of providing modern communications facilities to the people of North Central Tennessee and South Central Kentucky. Through the dedication and hard work of many members and employees, NCTC has succeeded in its objective of providing its members with reliable telephone communication comparable to that provided in the cities of America.

Today, as in the past, NCTC is owned by the customers it serves. It is governed by a Board of Directors selected by the owner/members. Annual meetings are held each year, and members are encouraged to participate in the activities of the organization.

Members are still sparsely distributed over a terrain where construction is difficult and service a challenge. But the cooperative is determined to continue the tradition of quality service to its constituents.

OBJECTIVES

To clarify its vision and to direct its efforts, the Managers and Directors of North Central Telephone Cooperative affirm these Objectives:

1. TO PROVIDE TOP-QUALITY SERVICE TO THE MEMBERS AT THE LOWEST POSSIBLE COST.

Our members will not be asked to accept less than modern technology can provide because they live in rural areas. We intend to provide the state-of-the-art in quality and in services.

To accomplish this, we must have an organization that is financially secure. We must be efficient stewards of the revenues provided by our subscribers so the equipment can be continuously upgraded.

North Central Telephone Cooperative Bylaws of North Central Telephone Cooperative, Inc.

ARTICLE I: MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1.1. Eligibility. Any person, firm, asso-
ciation, corporation or body politic or subdivision
thereof will become a member of NORTH CENTRAL
TELEPHONE COOPERATIVE, INC. (hereinafter called
the "Cooperative") upon receipt of telecommunications
and information services (hereinafter referred to simply
as "services") from the Cooperative. Membership is
automatic and instantaneous upon receipt of service;
however, each member shall:

- (1) Make a written application for membership for the Cooperative's records;
- (2) Agree to purchase services from the Cooperative in accordance with established tariffs, as well as pay other charges for services that the member uses and the Cooperative is obligated by law or contract to collect;
- (3) Agree to comply with, and be bound by, the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Cooperative and any rules and regulations adopted by the Board; and
- (4) Pay any membership fee as hereinafter may be specified or as may be determined by the Board of Directors in the future.

The status of all memberships shall be as reflected upon the books of the Cooperative and no membership certificates shall be issued.

SECTION 1.2. Definition And Classifications.

(a) Membership in the Cooperative is by:

- (1) Procuring the Cooperative's central office dial tone, or
- (2) Providing a continuing periodic telecommuni-
cations revenue stream for the Cooperative.

The Board will determine under rules of general application the types and amounts of revenue streams or the types and amounts of patronage that give rise to the privileges and obligations of membership

- (b) The Cooperative may have one or more classes of members to accommodate the various types of services. If the Cooperative has more than one class of membership, the definitions, the types, the qualifications and rights of each class shall be determined by the Board and set forth in these Bylaws.
- (c) Exchange and interexchange carriers who participate with the Cooperative in the provision of telecommunications services to members are neither members nor patrons by virtue of division of revenue contracts.
- (d) Each time sharing or interval ownership premise is considered as a single corporate member. The

owner of seasonal, recreational and short-interval rental properties will be deemed to hold the membership.

(e) No member may hold more than one membership of each class in the Cooperative. No membership in the Cooperative shall be transferable, except on the books of the Cooperative and as provided for in these Bylaws.

(f) **JOINT MEMBERSHIP.** A husband and wife may apply for a joint membership and, subject to their compliance with the requirements of Section 1 of this Article, may be accepted for such membership. The term "member" as used in the Bylaws shall be deemed to include a husband and wife holding a joint membership and any provisions relating to the rights and liabilities of membership shall apply equally with respect to the holders of a joint membership. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the effect of the hereinafter specified actions by or in respect of a joint membership shall be as follows:

- (1) The presence at a meeting of either or both shall be regarded as the presence of one member and shall constitute a joint waiver of notice of the meeting.
- (2) The vote of either separately or both jointly shall constitute a joint vote;
- (3) A waiver of notice signed by either or both shall constitute a joint waiver;
- (4) Notice to either shall constitute notice to both;
- (5) Expulsion of either shall terminate the joint membership;
- (6) Withdrawal of either shall terminate the joint membership;
- (7) Either but not both may be elected or appointed as an officer or director, provided that both meet the qualifications for such office.

SECTION 1.3. Membership Fees. The membership fee, if any, shall be determined by the Board at a uniform amount and set for each class of membership. The Board may dispense with the initial payment of a membership fee, allowing the amount of such membership fee to be taken from the first capital credits accruing to the member's account; however, membership fees taken from accrued capital credits shall not be refunded upon termination of membership but will be paid out under the provisions of the Cooperatives General and Special Capital Credit Retirement Bylaws.

SECTION 1.4. Purchase Of Services. Each person who applies for service shall, as soon as service is

available, take service from the Cooperative. The member shall pay therefor monthly at the rates which the Cooperative is obliged to bill and collect by contractual arrangements with other carriers. It is expressly understood that amounts received by the Cooperative for all services in excess of cost are furnished by members from the moment of receipt as capital, and each member shall be credited with the capital so furnished as provided in these Bylaws. However, the Cooperative is not obligated to furnish such credits for services which are not billed and collected by the Cooperative, even when such services are partially rendered over the facilities of the Cooperative. Each member shall pay the above amounts owed by him to the Cooperative as and when the same shall become due and payable.

SECTION 1.5. Termination Of Membership.

- (a) Any member may withdraw from membership upon compliance with such uniform terms and conditions as the Board may prescribe. The Board may, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of all the members of the Board, expel any member who fails to comply with any of the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws or rules and regulations adopted by the Board, but only if such member shall have been given notice by the Cooperative that such failure makes him liable to expulsion and such failure shall have continued for at least ten days after such notice was given. Any expelled member may be reinstated by vote of the Board or by vote of the members at any annual or special meeting.
- (b) Upon the withdrawal, death, cessation of service or expulsion of a member, the membership of such member shall thereupon terminate and will be so recorded on the books of the Cooperative. Termination of membership in any manner shall not release a member of his estate from any debts due the Cooperative.
- (c) In case of withdrawal or termination of membership in any manner, the Cooperative shall repay to the member the amount of any membership fee credited to the member's account, provided, however, that the Cooperative shall deduct from the membership fee, the amount of any debts or obligations owed by the member to the Cooperative.

ARTICLE II RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES OF THE COOPERATIVE AND THE MEMBERS

SECTION 2.1. Service Obligations.

- (a) The Cooperative will use reasonable diligence to furnish adequate and dependable services, but it cannot and does not guarantee uninterrupted services nor will it always be able to provide every service desired by each individual member.

SECTION 2.2. Cooperation Of The Members In The Extension Of Services. The cooperation of members of the Cooperative is imperative to the success-

ful, efficient and economical operation of the Cooperative. Members who are receiving or who are requesting service shall be deemed to have consented to the reasonable use of their property to construct, operate, maintain, replace or enlarge telephone and/or communications lines, overhead or underground, including all conduit, cables, wires, surface testing materials, markers and other appurtenances under, through, across, and upon any real property or interest therein owned or leased or controlled by said member for the furnishing of telephone or communication service to said member, or any other member, at no cost to the Cooperative. When requested by the Cooperative, the member does agree to execute any easement of right-of-way contract on a form to be furnished by the Cooperative.

SECTION 2.3. Nonliability For Debts Of The Cooperative. The private property of the members shall be exempt from execution or other liability for the debts of the Cooperative and no member shall be liable or responsible for any debts or liabilities of the Cooperative.

SECTION 2.4. Property Interest Of Members. Upon dissolution, after:

- (1) All debts and liabilities of the Cooperative shall have been paid;
- (2) All capital furnished through patronage shall be retired as provided in these Bylaws; and
- (3) All membership fees shall have been repaid, the remaining property and assets of the Cooperative shall be distributed among the members and former members in the proportion which the aggregate patronage of each member and former member bears to the total patronage of all such members and such former members on the date of dissolution unless otherwise provided by law.

ARTICLE III: MEETING OF MEMBERS

SECTION 3.1. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the members shall be held at a date and place within the State as selected by the Board and which shall be designated in the Notice of the Meeting for the purpose of electing Board members, passing upon reports for the previous fiscal year and transacting such other business as may come before the meeting. It shall be the responsibility of the Board to make adequate plans and preparations for the annual meeting. Failure to hold the annual meeting at the designated time shall not work a forfeiture or dissolution of the Cooperative nor affect the validity of any corporate action.

SECTION 3.2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the Board, by any three directors, by the President or by not less than ten percent (10%) of all the members, and it shall thereupon be the duty of the secretary to cause notice of such a meeting as hereinafter provided. Special meetings of the members shall be held at the offices of the Cooperative and the time and place thereof shall be specified in the Notice of the special meeting.

SECTION 3.3. Notice Of Members' Meetings. Written or printed notice stating the place, day and hour of the meeting and, in case of special meeting or an annual

and economical operation of the Cooperative. No one is receiving or who are requesting service need to have consented to the reasonable use of property to construct, operate, maintain, replace or telephone and/or communications lines, overhead and underground, including all conduit, cables, wires, surface materials, markers and other appurtenances under, above, and upon any real property or interest owned or leased or controlled by said member for the purpose of telephone or communication service for, or any other member, at no cost to the Cooperative. When requested by the Cooperative, the member shall agree to execute any easement of right-of-way for the purpose to be furnished by the Cooperative.

2.3. Nonliability For Debts Of The Cooperative. The private property of the members shall be exempt from execution or other liability for the debts of the Cooperative and no member shall be liable for any debts or liabilities of the Cooperative.

2.4. Property Interest Of Members. The interest in, and after:

debts and liabilities of the Cooperative shall be paid;

capital furnished through patronage shall be distributed as provided in these Bylaws; and

membership fees shall have been repaid, the real property and assets of the Cooperative shall be distributed among the members and former members in the proportion which the patronage of each member and former member bears to the total patronage of all such members and such former members on the date of liquidation unless otherwise provided by law.

III: MEETING OF MEMBERS

3.1. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the members shall be held at a date and place to be selected by the Board and which is stated in the Notice of the Meeting for the meeting of the Board members, passing upon reports for the fiscal year and transacting such other business as may come before the meeting. It shall be the duty of the Board to make adequate plans and to hold the annual meeting. Failure to hold the meeting at the designated time shall not work a dissolution of the Cooperative nor affect the corporate action.

3.2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the Board of directors, by the President or by a majority (10%) of all the members, and it shall be the duty of the secretary to cause such meeting as hereinafter provided. Special meetings shall be held at the offices of the Cooperative and the time and place thereof shall be stated in the Notice of the special meeting.

3.3. Notice Of Members' Meetings. Written notice stating the place, day and hour of the meeting, in case of special meeting or an annual

meeting at which business requiring special notice is to be transacted, the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, shall be delivered not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days before the date of the meeting, either personally or by mail, by or at the direction of the secretary, or upon a default in duty by the secretary, by the persons calling the meeting, to each member. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the U.S. Mail, addressed to the member at the address appearing on the record of the Cooperative, with postage thereupon prepaid. The accidental or unintended failure of any member to receive notice of an annual or special meeting of the members shall not invalidate any action which may be taken by the member at any such meeting.

SECTION 3.4. Postponement Of A Meeting Of The Members. In the event of inclement weather or the occurrence of a catastrophic event, the meeting of the members may be postponed by the President. Notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given by the President in any media of general circulation or broadcast serving the area.

SECTION 3.5. Quorum. Business may not be transacted at any meeting of the members unless there are present in person at least fifty (50) members or two percent (2%) of all members of the Cooperative, whichever is the lesser; except that, if less than a quorum is present at any meeting, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time-to-time without further notice.

SECTION 3.6. Election Officials And Workers. The Board of Directors shall, at least ten (10) days prior to any meeting of the members, appoint judges and machine operators to conduct any election required to be held at any meeting of the members. The judges so appointed shall be charged with the overall responsibility of conducting any elections required to be held and shall conduct same in a fair and equitable manner including the counting of ballots and certifying the election winners. The judges shall also have the responsibility of determining any questions which may arise as to the qualifications of others, irregularities in voting and all other questions which might arise relating to the election process.

SECTION 3.7. Voting. Each member, who is not in a status of suspension as specified in Section 1.5 hereof, shall be entitled to only one (1) vote upon each matter submitted to a vote at a meeting of the members. All issues with respect to voting shall be governed according to the latest edition of Roberts Rules of Order used by the Cooperative unless otherwise specified by law or the Articles of Incorporation. Voting by members other than members who are natural persons shall be allowed upon presentation to the Cooperative, prior to each member meeting, or at the meeting, satisfactory evidence entitling the person presenting the same to vote. All questions, except those involving multiple choice issues or determinations, shall be decided by a plurality vote. In the election of directors, a voice vote may be permitted if there is no competition for the seat or seats to be filled.

Early voting by members, at either annual or special meetings, may be permitted upon an affirmative vote by

the Board of Directors and held under its directions and authorizations, and at such times and places as shall be convenient to the members.

SECTION 3.8. Proxies. There shall not be any voting by proxy at any meeting of the membership of this Cooperative nor shall proxy voting on any office or issue permitted or contemplated in these Bylaws.

SECTION 3.9. Voting Machines. Any election, regular or special called for by these Bylaws or to be instituted by any provision of these Bylaws shall be held on voting machines unless the directors, by a majority vote of those present and voting, determine that voting machines shall not be used in a specified and particular voting situation.

SECTION 3.10. Order Of Business. The order of business at the annual meeting of the members and, so far as possible at all other meetings of the members, shall be conducted under policies established by the Board and under an agenda essentially as follows, except as otherwise determined by the members at such meeting:

- (1) Report on the number of members present in person in order to determine the existence of a quorum.
- (2) Reading of the Notice of the Meeting and proof of the timely publication or mailing thereof, or the waiver or waivers of Notice of Meeting, as the case may be.
- (3) Reading of unapproved minutes of previous meetings of the members and the taking of necessary action thereon unless minutes presented for approval shall have been furnished by a timely mailing or have been distributed at the meeting to all active members present. In such case, the president may entertain a motion from the floor to dispense with the reading of such minutes.
- (4) Audit report of outside auditors, or, a summary thereof.
- (5) Announcements of the results of the election for the Board of Directors.
- (6) Presentation and consideration of reports of officers, directors and committees.
- (7) Unfinished business.
- (8) New business.
- (9) Adjournment.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Board or the members themselves may, from time-to-time, establish a different order of business for the purpose of assuring the earlier consideration of any action upon any item of business the transaction of which is necessary or desirable in advance of any other item of business; provided, that no business other than adjournment of the meeting to another time and place may be transacted until and unless the existence of a quorum is first established.

ARTICLE IV: BOARD MEMBERS

SECTION 4.1. General Powers. The business and affairs of the Cooperative shall be managed by a

Board of members which shall exercise all of the powers of the Cooperative except such as are by law, the Articles of Incorporation, or these Bylaws conferred upon or reserved to the members.

SECTION 4.2. Election Process And Tenure Of Office.

Directors shall be elected by a secret ballot at each annual meeting when there is competition for the Board seat(s) to be filled. They shall be elected by and from the members to serve a three (3) year term or until their successors have been elected and shall have qualified, and that the terms of the directors shall be staggered to ensure continuity. If an election of directors shall not be held on the day designated herein for the annual meeting or at any adjournment thereof, a special meeting of the members shall be held for the purpose of electing directors at a reasonable time thereafter. Directors shall be nominated and elected as provided hereinafter.

The Cooperative is divided into ten (10) geographic service areas as follows:

1. The Scottsville, KY Exchange which has the prefix of 618 & 622,
2. The Lafayette, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 666 & 688,
3. The Red Boiling Springs, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 699,
4. The Hillsdale, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 633,
5. The Green Grove, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 655,
6. The Westmoreland, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 644,
7. The Oak Grove, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 888,
8. The Bethpage, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 841,
9. The Defeated, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 774,
10. The Pleasant Shade, TN Exchange which has the prefix of 677.

Maps of the above designated geographic service areas shall be available for inspection at the offices of the Cooperative at Highway #52 East Bypass in Lafayette, Tennessee by any person during normal business hours.

The Board of Directors shall, every ten (10) year period after the adoption of these Bylaws, re-examine the areas served by the Cooperative and designated above and shall make such changes and adjustments as to ensure fair and equal representation and taking into account geographic areas served by the Cooperative.

- The 618 & 622 Exchange shall have two Directors.
- The 666 & 688 Exchange shall have two Directors.
- The 699 Exchange shall have one Director.
- The 633 and 655 Exchanges shall have one joint Director.
- The 644 Exchange shall have one Director.
- The 841 and 888 Exchanges shall have one joint Director.
- The 774 and 677 Exchanges shall have one joint Director.

The 618 & 622 Exchange is hereby divided into two districts by Old Highway #31-E and that area north and west thereof shall comprise one district and that area

south and east thereof shall comprise one district.

The 666 & 688 Exchange is hereby divided into two districts by Highway #10 south of Lafayette, Tennessee and by the Akersville or Williams Road north of Lafayette, Tennessee and all members residing to the west and north of said highways shall comprise one district and those members residing to the south and east thereof shall comprise one district.

With respect to the 618 & 622 and 666 & 688 Exchanges, candidates for Directors shall be nominated from the areas above delineated. Provided however that members residing within the two exchange areas of 618 & 622 and 666 & 688 shall be permitted to vote for Directors in their exchange whether residing in or out of a particular district.

Only those members residing within the area or areas from which a Director is to be elected may vote in an election for a Director.

SECTION 4.3. Qualifications To Be Nominated, To Become, Or Remain, A Director.

Any member shall be eligible to be nominated, elected, and remain a director of the Cooperative who:

- (1) Resides in the geographic area from which he or she is elected, and has resided there for more than two hundred and forty (240) days during the last twelve (12) month period.
- (2) Is NOT an employee of the Cooperative or in any way financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business engaged in selling communication services or communication supplies or maintaining communication facilities. However, the Board may grant exceptions for "de minimus" competing enterprise.
- (3) Is NOT closely related to an incumbent director or an employee of the Cooperative. As used here, "closely related" means a person who is related to the principal person by law or in law. A person who is a spouse, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, parent, brother, sister of the principal or a spouse thereof. However, no incumbent director shall lose eligibility to remain a director or to be reelected as a director if he becomes a relative of another incumbent director or of a cooperative employee because of a marriage to which he was not a party; neither shall an employee lose eligibility to continue in the employment of the cooperative if he or she becomes a close relative of a director because of a marriage to which he or she was not a party.
- (4) Provided, however that the provisions of Sec. 4.3 (3) shall not apply to any incumbent directors as long as they continuously remain in office.
- (5) To remain a director, the incumbent must attend two-thirds (2/3) or more of the regular meetings during each twelve (12) month period beginning with the month of his/her election. Upon establishment by the Board of the fact that a director or nominee is in violation of any of the provisions of this Section, that office or nomination shall be deemed vacant unless the Board determines that absences are due to personal illness or other unavoidable circumstances.

Exchange 688 is hereby divided into two highways #10 south of Lafayette, Tennessee Akersville or Williams Road north of Tennessee and all members residing to the north of said highways shall comprise one district and members residing to the south and east shall comprise one district.

Candidates for Directors shall be nominated from the areas above delineated. Provided however that within the two exchange areas of 618 & 688 and 622 & 688 shall be permitted to vote for their exchange whether residing in our district.

Members residing within the area or areas designated by the Director is to be elected may vote in an election.

4.3. Qualifications To Be Nominated, Or Remain, A Director. Any member to be nominated, elected, and remain a Director of the Cooperative who:

resides in the geographic area from which he or she is elected, and has resided there for more than one hundred and forty (140) days during the twelve (12) month period.

is not an employee of the Cooperative or is not financially interested in a competitive business or a business engaged in selling communication services or communication equipment or maintaining communication facilities. The Board may grant exceptions for "non-competing enterprise."

is not closely related to an incumbent director or an employee of the Cooperative. As used here, "related" means a person who is related to the incumbent person by law or in law. A person is related to another person if he or she is the spouse, child, stepchild, grandparent, grandchild, parent, brother, sister of the principal person. However, no incumbent director shall lose eligibility to remain a director or be reelected as a director if he becomes related to another incumbent director or of a family member because of a marriage to a person who was not a party; neither shall an employee lose eligibility to continue in the employment of the Cooperative if he or she becomes a close family member of a director because of a marriage to a person who was not a party.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Sec. 4.3, the provisions of this section shall not apply to any incumbent directors as long as they continuously remain in office.

When a director, the incumbent must attend at least two (2/3) or more of the regular meetings during each twelve (12) month period beginning on the first day of his/her election. Upon establishing the fact that a director is in violation of any of the provisions of this section, that office or nomination shall be vacant unless the Board determines that the director is unable to attend due to personal illness or other extraordinary circumstances.

Nothing in this section shall affect, in any manner whatsoever, the validity of any action taken at any meeting of the Board.

SECTION 4.4. Nominations. It shall be the duty of the Board to appoint, not less than forty (40) days nor more than ninety (90) days before the date of the meeting of the members at which Board members are to be elected, a committee on nominations consisting of not less than three (3) nor more than nine (9) members who shall be selected from different geographic areas so as to ensure equitable representation. At least one (1) member of the committee shall be selected from each geographic area where a director is to be elected. No member of the Board, close relative (as defined herein) of a Board member or employee may serve on such committee. The committee, keeping in mind the principle of equitable representation, shall prepare and post at the principal office of the Cooperative at least thirty (30) days before the meeting, a list of nominations for Board members which shall include as many nominees for each Board position as the committee deems desirable. The secretary shall be responsible for mailing with a Notice of the Meeting, or separately, but at least ten (10) days before the date of the meeting, a statement of the number of Board members to be elected and the names and addresses of the candidates nominated by the committee on nominations. Any fifteen (15) or more members acting together may make other nominations by petition from the district in which the director is to be elected and the secretary shall post such nominations at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted. Nominations made by petition, if any, received at least thirty (30) days before the meeting, shall be included on the official ballot. Such ballot shall arrange the names of the candidates by geographic areas and shall also designate the candidates nominated by the committee and those nominated by petition.

SECTION 4.5. Election Of Directors. Contested elections of directors shall be by a form of secret ballot. The secret ballot shall list the names of the candidates nominated by the committee and by petition with such names arranged by districts.

Each member of the Cooperative present in person at the meeting shall, in any election in which the person is entitled to vote and subject to the delineation and combination of districts as provided for in Section 4.2 hereof, be entitled to one (1) vote for one (1) candidate from each district or districts from which a director is to be elected. Provided however that in any election which involves issues which are relevant and pertinent to the Cooperative as a whole, all members shall be entitled to vote. The candidate or issue receiving the majority of votes shall be declared elected. Failure of an election for a given year shall allow the incumbent directors whose directorships would have been voted on to hold over only until the next member meeting at which a quorum is present. Provided however that no election would interfere with the system of staggered terms as provided in these Bylaws.

SECTION 4.6. Removal Of Board Member By Members And Resignations. Any member residing within a district or exchange and/or exchanges may bring charges for cause against the director representing his district relating to the duties and responsibilities of his position, by filing with the secretary such charges

in writing together with a petition signed by at least ten (10) percent of the members, or two hundred (200), whichever is the lesser, may request the removal of such Board member by reason thereof. Such Board member shall be informed in writing of the charges at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of the members of his district at which the charges are to be considered and shall have an opportunity at the meeting to be heard in person or by counsel to present evidence in respect to the charges; and the person or persons bringing the charges against him shall have the same opportunity. The question of the removal of such Board member shall be considered and voted upon at the meeting of the members of his district. No director shall be removed from office unless by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present. Any vacancy created by such meeting without compliance with the foregoing provisions with respect to nominations

A director may resign at any time by written notice delivered to the Board of Directors, the President or Secretary of the Cooperative. A resignation is effective when the notice is delivered unless the notice specifies a future date. The pending vacancy may be filled before the effective date but the successor shall not take office until the effective date.

SECTION 4.7. Vacancies. Subject to the provisions of these Bylaws with respect to the filing of vacancies caused by the removal of Board members by the members, or by the death or resignation of a Board member, any vacancy resulting therefrom on the Board shall be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members for the unexpired portion of the term, provided, however that in the event the vacancy is not filled by the Board within one hundred and eighty (180) days after the vacancy occurs, the member shall have the right to fill the vacancy at a meeting of the members without compliance with the foregoing provisions in respect to nominations. However, any successor, whether chosen by the Board or the members, must reside in the same district as the vacant directorship and have the same qualifications for office as set forth in Section 4.3.

SECTION 4.8. Compensation. Board members shall, as determined by resolution of the Board, receive a fixed sum for each day or portion thereof spent on Cooperative business, such as attendance at meetings, conferences and training programs or performing committee assignments when authorized by the Board. If authorized by the Board, Board members may also be reimbursed for expenses actually and necessarily incurred in carrying out such Cooperative business or granted a reasonable per diem allowance by the Board in lieu of detailed accounting for some of these expenses. Board members, who elect to participate, may be extended various forms of liability and accident insurance as well as participation in benefits provided to employees except for benefits based on salary.

No Board member shall receive compensation, payments, stipends or profit for serving the Cooperative in any other capacity; nor shall any close relative of a Board member receive payments, compensation, wages, stipends, or profits for serving the Cooperative whether as an employee or independent contractor unless the payment and the amount thereof shall have been certified by the Board as an emergency measure.

SECTION 4.9. Rules, Regulations, Rate Schedules And Contracts. The Board of Directors shall have power to make, adopt, amend, abolish and promulgate such rules, regulations, rate classifications, rate schedules, contracts, security deposits and any other type deposits, payments or charges, including contributions in aid of construction, not inconsistent with law or the Certificate of Incorporation or Bylaws, as it may deem advisable or the management, administration, and regulation of the business and affairs of the Cooperative or, cause such to be submitted for any appropriate governmental regulatory approval. Further, the Board of Directors may constitute itself into committees for the purpose of studying and making recommendations to the full Board in the course of its decisional processes.

SECTION 4.10. Accounting Systems And Reports. The Board of Directors shall cause to be established and maintained a complete accounting system of the Cooperative's financial operations and conditions, and shall, after the close of each fiscal year, cause to be made a full, complete and independent audit of the Cooperative's accounts, books and records reflecting financial operations during, and financial condition at the end of such year. A full and accurate summary of such audit reports shall be submitted to the members at or prior to the succeeding annual meeting of the members. The Board may authorize special audits, complete or partial, at any time and for any specified period of time.

ARTICLE V MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

SECTION 5.1. Regular Meetings. A regular meeting of the Board shall be held without notice, immediately after, and at the same place as, the annual meeting of the members. A regular meeting of the Board shall also be held monthly at such time and place as designated by the Board. Such regular monthly meetings may be held without notice other than such resolution fixing the time and place thereof. A minimum of at least ten (10) regular meetings shall be held each year. Unless specifically prohibited by law, meetings, regular or special, may be conducted through the use of conference telephone or other communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meetings can communicate with each other. Such participation will constitute attendance and presence in persons at the meeting of the persons so participating.

SECTION 5.2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or by any three (3) Board members, and it shall thereupon be the duty of the Secretary to cause notice of the meeting to be given as hereinafter provided. The President or Board members calling the meeting shall fix the time and place for the holding of the meeting.

SECTION 5.3. Notice Of Board Meetings. Written notice of the time, place (or telecommunications conference event) and purpose of any special meeting of the Board shall be delivered to each Board member either personally or by mail, or at the direction of the secretary, or upon default in duty by the secretary, by the President or one of the Board members calling the meeting. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the U.S. Mail, addressed to the Board member at his address as it appears on the records of the Cooperative, with first-class postage thereon prepaid, at least five (5)

days before the date set for the meeting.

SECTION 5.4. Quorum. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum, provided, that if less than such a majority of the Board is present at said meeting, a majority of the Board present may adjourn the meeting from time-to-time; and provided further, that the secretary shall notify any absent Board members of the time and place of such adjourned meeting. The act of a majority of the Board members present and voting at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws or by the parliamentary procedure or special rules adopted by the Cooperative. Board members may not vote by proxy at regular or special Board meetings.

SECTION 5.5. Unanimous Consent In Writing. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, Board actions may be taken without a meeting and without a vote if unanimous consent of the Board is obtained in writing setting forth the action taken in detail and the document is signed by all Board members entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

SECTION 6.1. Number And Titles. The officers of the Cooperative shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and such other officers as may be determined by the Board from time-to-time. The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person.

SECTION 6.2. Election And Term Of Office. The officers shall be elected by ballot, if there is a contest, and if not, by voice vote or any other method designated by the person presiding. They shall be elected annually by and from the Board, at the meeting of the Board held immediately after the annual meeting of the members. If the election of the officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Each officer shall hold office until the first meeting of the Board following the next succeeding annual meeting of the members, or until a successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, a vacancy in any office shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the term.

SECTION 6.3. Removal Of Officers And Agents By The Board. Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board may be removed by the Board for cause related to position whenever in its judgement the best interests of the Cooperative will be served thereby. The officer against whom such charges have been brought shall be informed in writing of the charges at least ten (10) days prior to the Board meeting at which the charges are to be considered and shall have an opportunity at the meeting to be heard in person or by counsel and to present evidence in respect of the charges; and the person or persons bringing the charges against him shall have the same opportunity.

SECTION 6.4. Chairman of the Board. The Chairman of the Board shall:

- (1) Be the principal executive officer of the corporation and unless otherwise determined by the members or the Board, shall preside at all meetings of the members and the Board;
- (2) Sign any deeds, mortgages, deeds of trust, notes, bonds, contracts, or other instruments authorized by the Board to be executed, except in cases in which the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board or

the date set for the meeting.

SECTION 5.4. Quorum. A majority of the Board constitute a quorum, provided, that if less than a majority of the Board is present at said meeting, a majority of the Board present may adjourn the meeting from time-to-time; and provided further, that any member shall notify any absent Board members of the time and place of such adjourned meeting. The act of any one of the Board members present and voting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws.

SECTION 5.5. Unanimous Consent In Writing. Any action of the Board otherwise prohibited by law, Board actions may be taken without a meeting and without a vote if unanimous consent of the Board is obtained in writing setting forth the action in detail and the document is signed by all members entitled to vote.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

SECTION 6.1. Number And Titles. The officers of the Cooperative shall be a president, vice president, treasurer, and such other officers as may be determined by the Board from time-to-time. The offices of president and treasurer may be held by the same person.

SECTION 6.2. Election And Term Of Office. Officers shall be elected by ballot, if there is a contest, by voice vote or any other method designated in the Bylaws. They shall be elected annually by the Board, at the meeting of the Board held immediately preceding the annual meeting of the members. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Officers shall hold office until the first meeting of the next succeeding annual meeting of the members, unless a successor shall have been elected and qualified. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, any vacancy in any office shall be filled by the Board for the remainder of the term.

SECTION 6.3. Removal Of Officers And Agents. Any officer or agent elected or appointed and who may be removed by the Board for cause at any time whenever in its judgement the best interests of the Cooperative will be served thereby. The person to whom such charges have been brought shall in writing of the charges at least ten (10) days before the Board meeting at which the charges are to be heard shall have an opportunity at the meeting to answer the charges in person or by counsel and to present evidence in his defense; and the person or persons bringing the charges against him shall have the same opportunity.

SECTION 6.4. Chairman of the Board. The Board shall:

1. Appoint the principal executive officer of the Cooperative and unless otherwise determined by the Board, shall preside at all meetings of the members and the Board;

2. Execute all deeds, mortgages, deeds of trust, notes, contracts, or other instruments authorized by the Board to be executed, except in those instances in which the signing and execution thereof are expressly delegated by the Board or

these Bylaws to some other officer or agent of the Cooperative, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed; and

- (3) In general perform all duties incident to the Office of Chairman of the Board and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board from time-to-time.

SECTION 6.5. Vice Chairman of the Board. In the absence of the Chairman of the Board, or in the event of the inability or refusal to act, the Vice Chairman of the Board shall perform the duties of the president, and when so acting shall have all the powers of and shall be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chairman of the Board. The Vice Chairman of the Board shall also perform such other duties as from time-to-time may be assigned to him by the Board.

SECTION 6.6. Secretary. The Secretary shall be responsible for:

- (1) Keeping the minutes of the meetings of the members and of the Board in books prepared for that purpose;
- (2) Seeing that all notices are fully given in accordance with these Bylaws or as required by law;
- (3) The safekeeping of the corporate books and records and the Seal of the Cooperative and affixing the Seal of the Cooperative to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the Cooperative under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provision of these Bylaws;
- (4) Keeping a register of the names and post office addresses of all members;
- (5) Keeping on file at all times a complete copy of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Cooperative containing all amendments thereto and at the expense of the Cooperative, furnishing a copy of these Bylaws and of all amendments thereto to each member; and
- (6) In general performing all duties incident to the Office of the Secretary and such other duties as from time-to-time may be assigned to him by the Board.

SECTION 6.7. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be responsible for:

- (1) Custody of all funds and securities of the Cooperative;
- (2) The receipt of and the issuance of receipts for all monies due and payable to the Cooperative and for the deposit of such monies in the name of the Cooperative in such bank or banks as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws; provided, however, that the treasurer shall have authority, with the approval of the Board, to delegate to the general manager the authority to appoint employees of the Cooperative to actually carry out the responsibilities set forth in this Section; and
- (3) The general performance of all the duties incident to the Office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time-to-time may be assigned to him by the Board; provided however, with respect to the duties and responsibilities of the Treasurer, the Cooperative shall indemnify and hold the Treasurer harmless against any and all losses,

claims and/or damages which may be asserted against the treasurer, in his official capacity, unless such claim is a result of an act personally committed or omitted by the treasurer resulting in a loss to the Cooperative.

SECTION 6.8. President-Chief Executive Officer. The Board shall appoint a President-Chief Executive Officer who may be, but who shall not be required to be, a member of the Cooperative. The President-Chief Executive Officer shall perform such duties as the Board may from time-to-time require and shall have authority as the Board may from time-to-time vest in him.

SECTION 6.9. Bonds. The Board shall require the Treasurer and any other officer, agent or employee of the Cooperative charged with responsibility for the custody of any of its funds or property to give bond to in such sum and with such surety as the Board shall determine. The Board in its discretion may also require any other officer, agent or employee of the Cooperative to give bond in such amount and with such surety as it shall determine. The costs of all such bonds shall be borne by the Cooperative.

SECTION 6.10. Compensation. The powers, duties and compensation of officers, agents, employees shall be fixed or approved by the Board, subject to the provision of these Bylaws with respect to compensation for close relatives of Directors.

SECTION 6.11. Reports. The officers of the Cooperative shall submit at each annual meeting of the members reports covering the business of the Cooperative for the previous fiscal year. Such reports shall set forth the condition of the Cooperative at the close of such fiscal year.

ARTICLE VII NON-PROFIT OPERATION

SECTION 7.1. Interest Or Dividends On Capital Prohibited. The cooperative shall at all times be operated on a cooperative non-profit basis for the mutual benefit of its patrons. No interest or dividends shall be paid or payable by the Cooperative on any capital furnished by its patrons.

SECTION 7.2. Patronage Capital In Connection With Furnishing Telecommunications And Information Services. In the furnishing of telecommunications and information services, the Cooperative's operations shall be so conducted that all patrons will, through their patronage, furnish capital for the Cooperative. In order to induce patronage and to insure that the Cooperative will be operated on a non-profit basis, the Cooperative is obligated to account on a patronage basis to all its patrons for all amounts received and receivable from the furnishing of telecommunications and information services in excess of operating costs and expenses properly chargeable against the furnishing of such services. All such amounts in excess of operating costs and expenses at the moment of receipt by the Cooperative are received with the understanding that they are furnished by the patrons as capital. The Cooperative is obligated to pay by credits to a capital account for each patron all such amounts in excess of operating costs and expenses. The books and records of the Cooperative shall be set up and kept in such a manner that at the end of each fiscal year the amount of capital, if any,

so furnished by each patron is clearly reflected and credited in any appropriate record to the capital account of each patron. All such amounts credited to the capital account of any patron shall have the same status as though it had been paid to the patron in cash in pursuance of a legal obligation to do so and the patron had then furnished the Cooperative corresponding amounts for capital.

All other non-operating income received by the Cooperative from its operations in excess of costs and expenses shall, insofar as permitted by law, be:

- (1) Used to offset any losses incurred during the current or any prior fiscal years, and
- (2) To the extent not needed for that purpose, allocated to its patrons on a patronage basis and any amount so allocated shall be included as part of the capital to be allocated to the accounts of the various classes of patrons in an equitable manner as approved by the Board.

In the event of dissolution or liquidation of the Cooperative, after all outstanding indebtedness of the Cooperative shall have been paid, outstanding capital credits shall be retired without priority on a pro rata basis before any payments are made on account of property rights of members. If, at any time prior to dissolution or liquidation, the Board shall determine that the financial condition of the Cooperative will not be impaired thereby, the capital then credited to patrons' accounts may be retired in full or in part. Any such retirements of capital shall be at the discretion and direction of the Board as to timing, method and type of retirement.

Capital credit to the account of each patron shall be assignable only on the books of the Cooperative, pursuant to written instruction from the assignor and only to successors in interest or successors in occupancy in all or in a part of the patrons' premises served by the Cooperative unless the Board, acting under policies of general application, shall authorize other types of assignments. Patrons at any time may assign their capital credits back to the Cooperative and the Cooperative is authorized to negotiate capital credit settlement arrangements with bankrupt patrons.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, the Board, at its discretion, shall have the power at any time upon the death of any natural patron, if the legal representative of his estate shall request in writing, that the capital credited to any such patron be retired prior to the time such capital would be retired in a general retirement under provisions of these Bylaws; to retire capital credited to any such patron immediately on such terms and conditions as the Board, acting under policies of general application, and the legal representative of such patron's estate shall agree upon; provided, however, that the financial condition of the Cooperative will not be impaired thereby.

When the capital credits of any patron no longer receiving service from the Cooperative comes to a total amount of less than a fixed sum determined by the Board of Directors, the same shall be retired in full with such retirements made only when and at the same time that a general retirement to other patrons is made. During a general capital credit retirement, no checks shall be issued for less than a fixed amount determined by the Board, and the amount of such unretired capital credits will be retired in the first following year, when the total amount of capital credits qualifying for retirement exceeds that amount set by the Board, including the

amount carried over. All tax refunds made by the United States Government or any of the states in connection with the final or true cost of service as determined by the capital credits allocation process may be held and used by the Cooperative as furnished patronage and shall be treated in the same manner as furnished capital set out in this Section of these Bylaws.

The patrons of the Cooperative, by dealing with the Cooperative, acknowledge that the terms and provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws shall constitute and be a contract both between the Cooperative and each patron, and further, between all the patrons themselves individually. Both the Cooperative and the patrons are bound by such contract, as fully as though each patron had individually signed a separate instrument containing such terms and provisions with the Cooperative and each of its patrons. The provisions of this Article of the Bylaws shall be called to the attention of each patron of the Cooperative by posting in a conspicuous place in the Cooperative's office or by publication distributed by the Cooperative to its patrons.

SECTION 7.3. Patronage Capital In Connection With Furnishing Other Services.

In the event that the Cooperative should engage in the business of furnishing goods and services other than telecommunications or information services, all amounts received and receivable therefrom which are in excess of costs and expenses properly chargeable against the furnishing of such goods and services shall, insofar as permitted by law, be prorated annually on a patronage basis and returned to those patrons from whom such amounts were obtained at such time and in such order of priority as the Board shall determine.

ARTICLE VIII DISPOSITION AND PLEDGING OF PROPERTY DISSOLUTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS ASSETS ON DISSOLUTION

SECTION 8.1. Disposition And Pledging Of Property. The Cooperative may not sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of or encumber all or any substantial portion in excess of ten percent (10%) of its total assets unless such sale, mortgage, lease or other disposition or encumbrance is:

- (a) Authorized at a meeting of the ten-total members by the affirmative vote cast in person, without proxies, of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total members of the Cooperative, and
- (b) Authorized by the holders of at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the outstanding indebtedness of the Cooperative; and
- (c) Preceded by a notice of meeting at which such sale, mortgage, lease or other disposition or encumbrance is to be voted on.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Section, the members of the Cooperative may, by the affirmative majority of votes cast in person at any meeting of the members, delegate to the Board the power and authority:

- (1) To borrow monies from any source and in any such amounts as the Board may from time-to-time determine are needed in pursuit of the

In the event the Cooperative should engage in the business of providing services other than telecommunications services, all amounts received and from which are in excess of costs and charges chargeable against the furnishing of such services shall, insofar as permitted by law, be returned on a patronage basis and returned to the patrons in the order of priority as the Board

ARTICLE VIII INCORPORATION AND PLEDGING OF PROPERTY DISSOLUTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF SURPLUS ASSETS ON DISSOLUTION

1.1. Disposition And Pledging Of Property. The Cooperative may not sell, mortgage, lease, or otherwise dispose of or encumber all or any part in excess of ten percent (10%) of its assets by such sale, mortgage, lease or other disposition unless the following conditions are met:

(1) At a meeting of the ten-total members of the Cooperative, a majority vote cast in person, without proxy, at least two-thirds (2/3) of the total votes of the Cooperative, and

(2) By the holders of at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the outstanding indebtedness of the Cooperative; and

(3) By a notice of meeting at which such a majority vote is cast in person or by proxy at a meeting at which such a majority vote is to be voted on.

(4) If the foregoing provisions of this Article are not met, the Cooperative may, by the affirmative vote of a majority of votes cast in person at any meeting, delegate to the Board the power

to borrow monies from any source and in any amount as the Board may from time-to-time determine are needed in pursuit of the

Cooperative's business purposes, and

- (2) To mortgage or otherwise pledge or encumber any and all of the Cooperative's property or assets as security therefor, and
- (3) With respect to other cooperative organizations only, to sell and lease back any of the Cooperative's property or assets.

Supplementary to the foregoing paragraphs of this Section and any other applicable provisions of law or these Bylaws, no sale, lease, lease-sale, exchange, transfer or other disposition within a single calendar year, of physical plant of the Cooperative with net value in excess of ten percent (10%) of the Cooperative's total assets, based upon the most recent audit of the Cooperative, shall be authorized except in conformity to the following:

- (1) If the Board looks with favor upon any proposal for such sale, lease, lease-sale, exchange, transfer or other disposition, it shall first cause three (3) independent non-affiliated appraisers, expert in such matters, to render their individual opinions as to the value of the Cooperative with respect to such a sale, lease, lease-sale, exchange, transfer or other disposition, and as to any other terms and conditions which should be considered. The three (3) independent appraisers shall be designated by a district court resident judge for the judicial district in which the Cooperative's headquarters are located. If such judge refuses to make such designations, they shall be made by the Board.

- (2) If the Board after receiving such appraisals (and other terms and conditions which are submitted if any) determines that the proposals should be submitted for consideration by members, it shall first give by notice in appropriate publications other cooperatively organized entities an opportunity to submit competing proposals. Any interested cooperatively organized entity shall be sent copies of any proposals which the Cooperative has already received and copies of the respective reports of the three (3) appraisers. Such other interested cooperatively organized entities shall be given not less than thirty (30) days during which to submit competing proposals, and the actual minimum period within which proposals are to be submitted shall be stated in the written notice given to them.

- (3) If the Board then determines that favorable consideration should be given to the initial or any subsequent proposal, which has been submitted to it, it shall so notify the members not less than sixty (60) days before noticing a special meeting of the members thereon or, if such be the case, the next annual member meeting, expressing in detail each of any such proposals, and shall call a special meeting of the members for consideration thereof and action thereon, which meeting shall be held not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days after giving the Notice thereof to the members: provided that consideration and action by the members may be given at the next annual meeting of the Board so determines and if such annual meeting is held not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days after the giving of notice of such meeting.

- (4) Any fifty (50) or more members, by so petitioning the Board not less than thirty (30) days prior to

the date of such special or annual meeting, may cause the Cooperative, with the cost to be borne by the Cooperative, to mail to all members any opposing or alternative positions which they may have to the proposals that have been submitted or any recommendations that the Board has made.

The provisions of (1), (2), (3) and (4) above shall not apply to a sale, lease, lease-sale, exchange, transfer or other disposition to one or more telephone cooperatives if the substantive or actual legal effect thereof is to merge or consolidate with such other one or more telephone cooperatives.

SECTION 8.2. Dissolution. The Cooperative may be dissolved by filing, as hereinafter provided, certificate which shall be entitled and endorsed "Certificate of Dissolution of NORTH CENTRAL TELEPHONE COOPERATIVE, INC." and shall state:

- (1) Name of the Cooperative, and if such Cooperative is a corporation resulting from a consolidation as herein provided, the names of all the original corporations or cooperatives.
- (2) The dates of filing of Certificate of Incorporation, and if such Cooperative is a Cooperative resulting from a consolidation as herein provided, the dates on which the Certificates of Incorporation of the original corporations were filed.
- (3) That the Cooperative elects to dissolve.
- (4) The name and post office address of each of its directors, and the name, title and post office address of each of its officers.

Such Certificate shall be subscribed and acknowledged in the same manner as an original Certificate of Incorporation by the president or a vice president, and the secretary or an assistant secretary, who shall make and annex and affidavit, stating that they have been authorized to execute and file such certificate by the votes cast in person of at least two-thirds (2/3) of its total membership voting without proxies and that the dissolution has been authorized by at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the holders of the indebtedness of the Cooperative.

A Certificate of Dissolution and a certified copy or copies thereof shall be filed in the same place as the original Certificate of Incorporation and thereupon the Cooperative shall be deemed to be dissolved.

Such Cooperative shall continue for the purpose of paying, satisfying or discharging any existing liabilities or obligations and collecting or liquidating its assets, and doing all other acts required to adjust and wind up its business and affairs, and may sue and be sued in its corporate name.

SECTION 8.3. Distribution Of Surplus Assets On Dissolution. Any assets remaining after all debts and liabilities of the Cooperative shall have been paid shall be disposed of pursuant to the provisions of Section 2.4 above; provided however, that, if in the judgment of the Board the amount of such surplus is too small to justify the expense of making such distribution, the Board may, in lieu thereof, donate or provide for the donation of, such surplus to one or more non-profit, charitable or educational organizations that are exempt from federal income taxation.

ARTICLE IX: SEAL

The Corporate Seal of the Cooperative shall be in the form of a circle and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Cooperative and the words, "State of Tennessee."

ARTICLE X: FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

SECTION 10.1. Contracts. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, the Board may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name and on behalf of the Cooperative and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

SECTION 10.2 Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money and all notes, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Cooperative shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents, employee or employees of the Cooperative and in such manner, as shall from time-to-time be determined in resolution of the Board.

SECTION 10.3. Deposits. All the funds of the Cooperative shall be deposited from time-to-time to the credit of the Cooperative in such institutions as the Board may select.

ARTICLE XI: MISCELLANEOUS

SECTION 11.1. Membership In Other Organizations. The Cooperative may become a member or purchase stock in other profit or nonprofit organizations, associations, partnerships or joint ventures when the Board finds that the general long-term interests of its membership will be served by such membership or participation.

SECTION 11.2. Waiver Of Notice. Any member or director may waive in writing any notice of a meeting required to be given by these Bylaws. The attendance of a member or director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting by such member or director, except in case a member or director shall attend a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business on the grounds that the meeting has not been lawfully called or convened.

SECTION 11.3. Rules And Regulations. The Board shall have power to make and adopt such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, the Articles of Incorporation of these Bylaws, as it may deem advisable for the management of the business and the affairs of the Cooperative.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed by the affirmative vote of the members, at any regular or special Board meeting, but only if the notice of such a meeting shall have contained a copy of the proposed alteration, amendment or repeal, or any accurate summary explanation thereof; provided, however, that the provisions of Section 8.1 relating to a major disposition of the Cooperative's property, and Section 8.2 relating to the dissolution of the Cooperative, may be altered, amended or repealed only by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of all current members of the Cooperative.

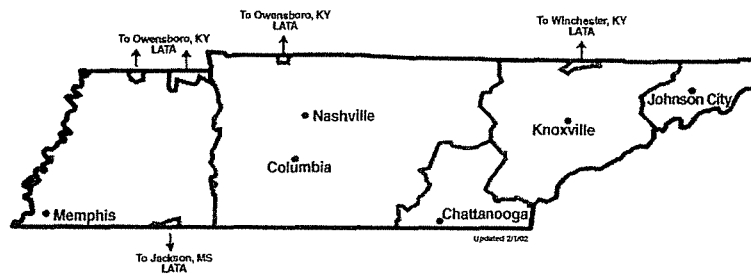

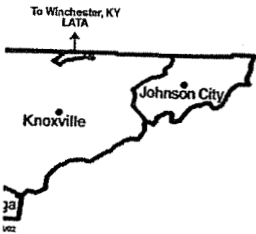

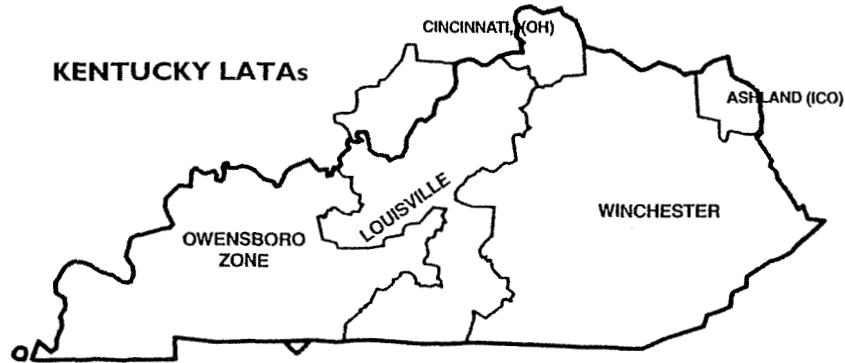

Previously, all calls placed IntraLATA were automatically carried by BellSouth. You can now choose which carrier you would like to handle these calls.

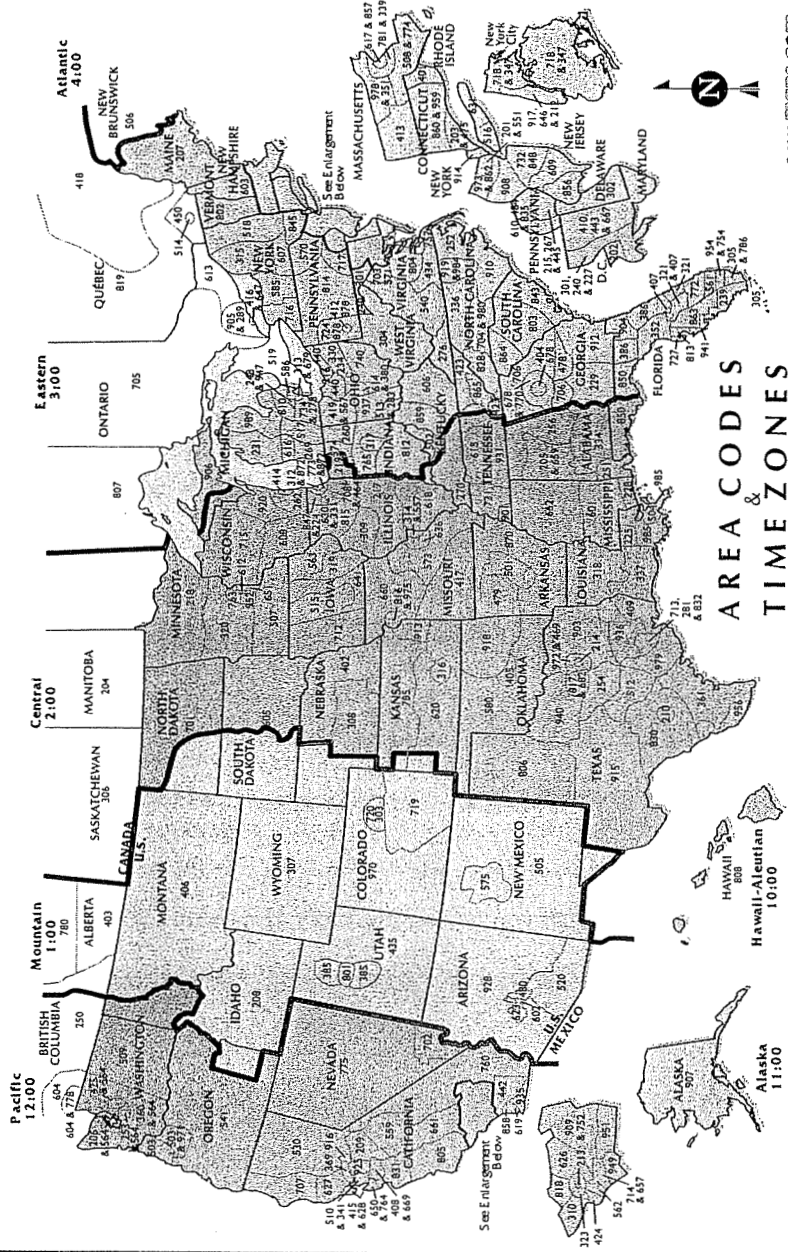

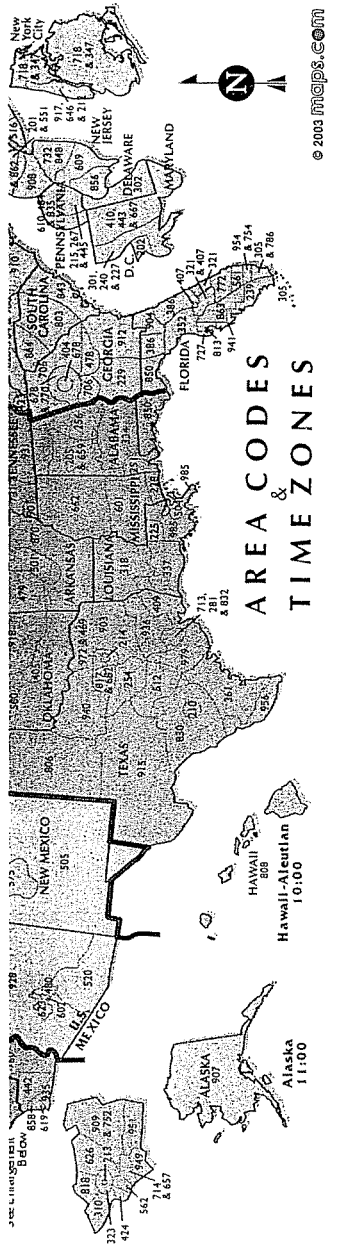

International calling is more convenient today than ever before. Calls can now be dialed to many overseas countries by customers throughout the United States. The following instructions are for placing International Calls.

How It Works.

- 1-First, dial the International Access Code: **011**.
- 2-Next, the Country Code (a 2- or 3-digit number).
- 3-Then, the City Code (a 1- to 5-digit number).
- 4-The Local Number.

To place a dialed station call to London, here's what you would dial:

011 + 044 + 171 or 181 + 1234567			
International Access Code	Country Code	City Code	Local Number

For International Calls that are person-to-person, collect, calling card or billed to another number, follow the instructions given above but use "01" for the International Access Code. The operator will come on the line to ask for information such as the name of the person you are calling or your calling card number.

International Telephone

Tips To Save You Money . . .

1. Dial it yourself and save. You can save money by dialing your calls that do not require special operator assistance.
2. Avoid involving an operator. Operator handled calls are more expensive. For example, a station-to-station call you can dial yourself but choose to go through an operator will be billed at the higher operator assisted station rate. Also billed at a higher rate are: person-to-person, collect, calling card, requests for time and charges and calls billed to another number. These include dialed "01" calls.

3. Call during bargain times. Rates on most calls are lower at night and Sunday.

And Time . . .

4. Dial the International Access Code (011 or 01) without pausing between digits. If you hesitate 3 seconds or more after dialing "0", you'll get your local operator.
5. After dialing the entire International Number, allow 45 seconds for a ring to begin.
6. Frequently overseas telephone numbers on letterheads are preceded by an "0", which is used only for dialing within that country. Just ignore the "0" in the number, and proceed normally (001 or 01 + Country Code + Number Indicated).

Additional Assistance or Information

Dial "0" (Operator) if you need assistance:

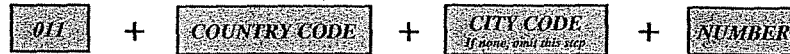

2. To obtain City Routing Codes not listed in this section.
3. For help in completing a call.
4. For credit on a call on which you had difficulty, e.g., reached a wrong number.
5. To obtain rates on calls to International points.

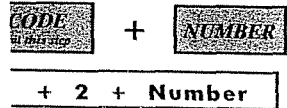

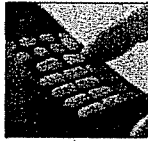

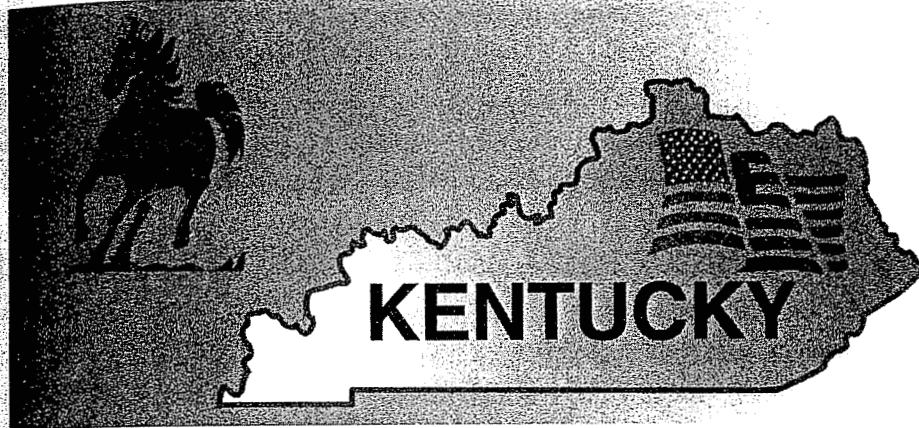
