Dear Ms. O'Donnell:

On December 18, 2007, the Commission granted the requests of Nextel and Nextel Partners (collectively "Nextel") to adopt the currently effective interconnection agreement ("Agreement") between BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Kentucky, Inc. ("AT&T Kentucky") and Sprint Communications Company Limited Partnership, Sprint Communications Company L.P., Sprint Spectrum L.P. On December 21, 2007, AT&T Kentucky filed motions for reconsideration of the Commission's Orders in the Nextel Dockets ("Motions"). In its Motions, AT&T Kentucky requested that the Commission grant rehearing to permit AT&T Kentucky to provide factual evidence--to be adduced at hearing--demonstrating that, for substantive reasons (beyond the procedural basis that was before the Commission in AT&T Kentucky's Motion to Dismiss) adoption of the Agreement is improper.

On January 10, 2008, the Commission granted AT&T Kentucky's Motions. Therefore, AT&T Kentucky respectfully requests the Commission enter a procedural scheduling order setting these matters for a hearing on the merits.
