This memorandum is to address the current compensation allowed by the PSC to the owner/manager of a waste water collection and treatment system. This was discussed with the PSC staff at informal hearings in Case # 2006-00028.

The Commission staff stated that the allowed compensation of \$3,600 / year was based upon compensation paid to water district commissioners.

We submit for your review information obtained from the PSC on six (6) water districts

that clearly supports a review of the compensation of a utility manager presently allowed.

We also contend that these districts only buy and sell water and have no treatment, pumping or mechanical equipment to operate and maintain. Additionally, the duties, responsibilities, and decisions that are required by an owner / manager greatly exceed any duty if any performed by a water district commissioner. Furthermore, the owner/manager of a waste water collection and treatment system faces substantially more potential liability than does a water district commissioner.

We offer to provide testimony to this effect if required.

Dear Mr. Robinson:

As we discussed in our telephone conversation on July 17, 2007, I represent the Farmdale Development Corporation. As you are aware, the Farmdale Development Corporation owns and operates the Farmdale Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), which provides sewer service to the residents of the Farmdale Subdivision. The Farmdale Water District has provided billing and collection services to the Farmdale WWTP for a number of years at a charge fifteen percent (15%) of the amount collected. For the last several years, this charge has been fifteen percent (15%) of approximately \$52,995.

The Public Service Commission recently granted Farmdale WWTP an increase in general rates from \$19.05 per month to \$28.00 per month, and a surcharge in the amount of \$9.92 for a period of 5 years or the amount of \$146, The rate of \$28 per month is to cover the normal operating expenses of the Farmdale WWTP, and the monthly surcharge of \$9.92 is for the purpose of recovering the cost of needed repairs and improvements to the Farmdale WWTP. Therefore, the general rate has increased by approximately eleven dollars (\$11) per month, in addition to the \$9.92 surcharge. Because the amount to be paid to the Farmdale WWTP has almost doubled, we are asking that the Farmdale Water District consider reducing the amount of the collection fee. The amount paid by the Farmdale Development Corporation to Farmdale Water District for its collection services on an annual basis was previously approximately \$16,790. The collection cost remains at fifteen percent (15%), the cost of collection will be approximately \$16,790. The collection fee is borne directly by the individuals living in Farmdale Subdivision, and we would like to minimize the fee that will ultimately be paid by the residents. Accordingly, I am requesting that the percentage charge for the collection charge be reduced to 7.5%. This would enable the Farmdale Water District to increase its fee to approximately \$8,393 annually, but not charge the residents an unreasonable amount.

Thank you very much for your consideration of this request, and please feel free to contact me to discuss same. Otherwise, I will call you in the near future to discuss this request.

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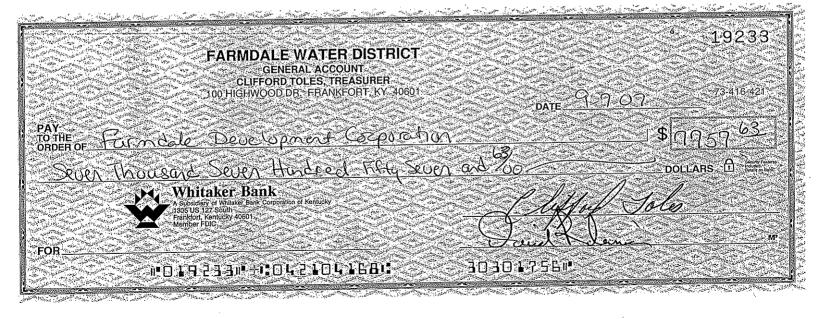

Dear Mr. Cogan:

I have received the information submitted by your office regarding the preparation and filing of a rate application for Farmdale Development. Included in the material you submitted was a draft application suggesting the need for a 76.32 percent rate increase, which if granted would increase Farmdale Development's flat residential rate from \$28.00 to \$49.37. The draft application also included estimated legal and accounting fees for the preparation and review of this draft application.

In the settlement approved by the Commission in Case No. 2006-00028 in April of this year, the terms of the settlement called for Commission Staff to assist Farmdale in the preparation of an application to include in rates the financing related to various sewer system improvements. The purpose of such informal Staff assistance is to benefit all parties by avoiding the need for the utility to hire accounting and legal advisors, and for the ratepayers to pay the associated costs. Based upon the information you submitted to me yesterday, Staff assistance and/or a meeting to discuss this filing no longer appears to be warranted or advisable in this matter.

If you disagree, please respond to me in writing. Otherwise, I will retain the information you provided until such time as you file a formal rate application, unless you request that it be returned to you.

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In accordance with your letter of 8/21/07, Farmdale will proceed with filing a formal application for rate adjustment with the Commission based primarily upon the data submitted to you for review.

In reference to the preliminary rate application data submitted, and in order to prevent any misunderstanding, we wish to point out that approximately two-thirds of the accounting and legal fees being recovered were incurred in Case No. 2006-00209 and Case No. 2006-00028. All of the legal fees and a very large majority of the accounting fees were incurred on or after the informal hearing in April of 2006 in which the Commission and the Attorney General called for the filing of a "Petition for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity" for the \$30,000 lift station.

The filing of this Petition for Certificate required the services of legal counsel and also necessitated a <u>complete</u> revision of the rate application previously submitted in Case No. 2006-00028. Farmdale's request to consolidate Case No. 2006-00209 and Case No. 2006-00028 to make the process more efficient and cost effective was denied. (This was combined in 2007 prior to the issuing of a final order.)

For the record, Farmdale has made every effort to hold down the costs to be recovered in the rate case. Farmdale negotiated a favorable interest rate with Old National, attempted to negotiate more favorable billing and collection costs and is working to reduce other costs. We are disappointed that you were unable to assist in this rate application, which may have helped avoid additional costs to the rate payers. Please retain the information submitted for future use.
