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MOTION FOR FULL INTERVENTION BY ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY MINISTRIES

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Comes now, **ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY MINISTRIES** ("ACM"), by counsel, and files this Motion for Full Intervention in the above-styled proceeding.

ACM is a Kentucky 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation and its membership is comprised of 15 independent community ministries that provide services to the Louisville Metro area. The common mission for all 15 members is to provide an emergency assistance network in partnership with the Louisville Metro Government, local congregations, and other businesses and organizations. Each Ministry serves a specific geographical area to ensure that all of Louisville Metro is covered under the umbrella of the ACM. Among the social services provided by ACM members are utility assistance programs. ACM members assist low-income households whose utility service is disconnected by Louisville Gas & Electric Co. ("LG&E") because of their inability to pay utility bills by providing both financial assistance and advocacy. ACM members also implement the Winterhelp program. ACM's address is P.O. Box 99545, Louisville, Kentucky 40269.

ACM has an interest in how the issues identified by the General Assembly for consideration in this proceeding may affect low-income utility customers. Issues relating

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to demand management strategies have the potential to affect low-income households, through cost allocation issues, the availability of specific programs for low-income customers, such as low-income weatherization programs and the accessibility of demand management programs in general to low-income customers. Issues relating to rate structures and cost recovery are of interest to ACM since affordable utility service is a critical issue for low-income communities.

ACM is in the process of taking over the advocacy activities previously conducted by Metro Human Needs Alliance ("MHNA"), a frequent intervenor on behalf of lowincome utility customers in Commission proceedings¹. Due to recent staffing and funding limitations, MHNA has had to significantly scale back its activities. ACM has replaced MHNA as a Joint Applicant in the recently approved Home Energy Assistance Program in the Louisville Gas and Electric service territory².

ACM represents an interest that is not otherwise adequately represented, and full intervention by it is likely to present issues and develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering this matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings.

WHEREFORE, the Association of Community Ministries requests that it be granted full intervention as a party to this proceeding.
