## <u>order</u>

Reid Village Water District ("Reid Village") has applied to the Commission for authority to adjust its proposed rates for water service and certain non-recurring charges. In its filing, Reid Village requested permission to deviate from the filing requirement of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(r), which requires the submission of monthly managerial reports providing financial results for the 12 months in the test period.

In support of its request for permission to deviate from this requirement, Reid Village states that it does not produce monthly managerial reports on a routine basis and that additional expenses would be incurred to produce them at this time.

Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 14, provides the Commission with the authority to permit deviations from its regulations for good cause shown. Having reviewed the filing and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that the information contained in Reid Village's application is sufficient for our review of the application and that requiring the submission of monthly managerial reports in this instance would result in increased rate case expense without any corresponding benefit to the ratepayers, the Commission, or the public.

Finding that good cause exists, the Commission HEREBY ORDERS that Reid Village's request for permission to deviate from the filing requirement of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(6)(r), is granted.
