8. Exhibit 4 sets out the employees, date of hire, job duties, benefits. No

overtime is paid. No salaries were capitalized. See CD for additional information. There are no vacant positions. See Exhibit 5, for the notification from the KRS.

- 9. All benefits are listed on CD and Exhibit 4.
- 10. Exhibit 4 contains the most recent information regarding health insurance. The water district reimburses the county (fiscal court) for insurance paid for Sandra Cole. The district does not receive an invoice from the insurance agency but from Montgomery County Treasurer.
- 11. Exhibit 6, contains invoices relating to general liability and workers compensation.
- 12. With regard to question 12, see Exhibit 7 for information on purchased power expense.
- 13. Exhibit 8 sets out the Stage 2H5 and THM testing requirements and cost of test.

- 15. Montgomery County does not have a more detailed breakdown in its depreciation schedule than the schedules shown in its annual report.



PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT

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This **PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT** (the "Agreement") made and entered into as of the <u>1'3</u> day of January, 2009, by and between **GREGORY GARLAND and TINA GARLAND, his wife,** 2940 Cooper Lane, Mount Sterling, Kentucky 40353, parties of the first part, hereafter collectively referred to in the singular as "Seller" and **MONTGOMERY COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 1,** a statutory water district, whose current mailing address is 4406 Camargo Road, Mount Sterling, Kentucky 40353, party of the second part, hereinafter referred to as "Buyer", WITNESSETH:

For the purchase price herein specified, and upon the terms, conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth, the Seller agrees to sell to Buyer, who agrees to buy from Seller, that certain real property on Camargo Road in Montgomery County, Kentucky, currently designated as 4412 Camargo Road, Mount Sterling, Kentucky 40353 (the "Subject Property), same being set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference, the same as though fully copied herein.

It is further covenanted, agreed and understood by and between the parties as follows:

1. <u>Purchase Price</u>. The purchase price for the Subject Property which Buyer agrees to pay, and the Seller agrees to accept, is the sum of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$45,000.00) (the "Purchase Price"), payable in full at closing (as hereinafter specified) in immediately available funds.

2. <u>Earnest Money</u>. Simultaneously with the execution of this Agreement, and as evidence of good faith binding this Agreement, Buyer has deposited with Seller earnest money in the non-refundable sum of TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000.00), the same to be applied on the Purchase Price at closing or retained by Seller if Closing does not occur.

3. <u>Closing</u>. The closing of the transaction (the "Closing") shall occur at the offices of White Peck Carrington, LLP, 26 Broadway, Mt. Sterling, Kentucky 40353, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., local time, on a date (the "Closing Date") to be specified in writing by Buyer to Seller, but in no event later than November 4, 2009, **time being of the essence in all respects hereunder**, or such other time, date and place as may be mutually agreed upon in writing by the parties.

4. <u>Condition of Improvements</u>.

Buyer stipulates and agrees that they have inspected the Subject Property, and the improvements thereon, to their full satisfaction and have purchased, and are accepting, said property and the improvements thereon in its present "as-is" condition, except as set forth below. No warranties, representations or guarantees have been made by Seller, nor are they intended, as to the condition of the improvements on the above described property and/or the components thereof.

Seller agrees, at Seller's sole expense, to raze and demolish the existing house that is presently located on the real property and to fill in the hole(s), if any, left by the removal of the house with gravel and to level the gravel used to fill said hole(s) prior to Closing. The existing structure, designated between Buyer and Seller as the "shop" located on the Subject Property shall remain in its present "as-is" condition.

5. <u>Title to be Conveyed</u>. A fee simple title to the Subject Property, fully marketable in all respects such as any reputable title insurance company licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky will insure at standard rates, shall be conveyed by Seller to Buyer by General Warranty Deed containing the usual covenants, including that against liens and encumbrances, but excepting restrictions and utility easements of record.

6. <u>Contingency</u>. There are no contingencies, except a good and clear title to the Subject Property.

7. <u>Possession</u>. Full possession of the Subject Property shall be surrendered by Seller to Buyer on the Closing Date.

8. <u>Default</u>. If either party fails to carry out the terms of this Agreement or refuses to perform his or her obligations hereunder upon proper tender of the other party to close, then: If Buyer be the party in default, Seller may, at Seller's option, treat this Agreement as null and void or, if Seller be the party in default, Buyer may, at Buyer's option, treat this Agreement as null and void or, the party not in default may sue to require specific performance of this Agreement by the defaulting party, or may pursue any other remedy available to them at law or equity.

9. <u>No Broker or Sales Agent</u>. Both Seller and Buyer acknowledge that no real estate agent, broker or other person, firm or entity acted as agent or broker for either of the parties negotiating this transaction and that no real estate commissions or fees or any type of finder's fees are due or payable to anyone as a result of this transaction.

10. <u>Expenses of Closing</u>. Seller agrees to pay the cost of (a) the preparation of this Agreement and the General Warranty Deed and (b) the applicable Kentucky deed transfer tax due thereon.

Buyer will pay for the cost to obtain any loan or grant Buyer may need, including fees for application, appraisal and commitment and survey, if required by lender. Buyer will also pay the closing fee for the transaction and any attorneys' fee incident to title examination and recording and other such legal and/or accounting services rendered on behalf of Buyer.

RISK OF LOSS - Notwithstanding the execution hereof, the risk of loss remains 11. with the Seller until delivery of deed. If the improvement(s) on the Subject Property is/are substantially damaged or destroyed to the extent of 80% or more of their value prior to the Closing, the Buyer shall have the option of: (a) Accepting an assignment of, and receiving, the proceeds of any insurance payable in connection therewith while continuing to be bound hereby, or (b) Waiving all rights to said insurance proceeds and terminating this agreement by withdrawing from the transaction, in which latter event of termination all funds and documents shall be returned to the parties depositing them and both parties shall be released from all further liability hereunder, but Buyer's exercise of the option to terminate must be made in writing within thirty (30) days after such loss or damage occurs or Buyer shall be deemed to have elected to continue to be bound; provided, however, an election by Buyer to receive the proceeds if made within said thirty (30) day period shall not then bind Buyer irrevocably, or if loss or damage shall not be satisfactorily adjusted with the insurer within sixty (60) days from the date of said loss, the Buver may still at Buyer's option, elect to terminate this Agreement by notice in writing to the Seller at the expiration of said sixty (60) day period. Loss or damage shall be deemed adjusted within the meaning of this Agreement when the amount thereof has been agreed upon and the insurer is ready, willing and able to pay it.

12. <u>Proration of Taxes</u>. All ad valorem real property taxes assessed against the Subject Property for 2009, due and payable in the Fall of 2009, will be prorated between Seller and Buyer on a calendar year basis as of the Closing Date.

<u>Notices</u>. All notices and demands shall be given in writing by (a) personal service;
(b) certified mail, postage prepaid and return receipt requested; or (c) by federal express; (d)
express mail; or (e) any other commercial delivery service which guarantees overnight delivery

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(and "Overnight Service"). Notice shall be considered given when personally served or refused three (3) days after the date of certified mail notice deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid and return receipt requested, or the day following the day deposited with an overnight service marked for overnight delivery. Notices shall be addressed to the parties as appears in the first grammatical paragraph of this Agreement unless, and until, either party gives the other party written notice of a change in name or address.

14. Miscellaneous Provisions.

A. A waiver by any party of the other party's default or waiver by a party of the conditions set forth herein or any failure by a party to exercise any right granted to that party hereunder shall not constitute a subsequent waiver or failure to exercise such right.

B. Although this Agreement has been prepared for and on behalf of Seller, it shall not be construed in favor of, or against, either party by reason of such preparation.

C. 



During the 2009 Regular Legislative Session, the Kentucky General Assembly amended KRS 16.645 to require the KRS Board of Trustees to establish employer contribution rates for the County Employees Retirement System that will phase in to the full actuarially required contribution for the health insurance fund over a ten (10) year period using the 2007-2008 fiscal year employer contribution for health insurance fund as a base employer rate and incrementally increasing the employer rate from fiscal year 2008-2009 through fiscal year 2017-2018. In conformance with the requirements of KRS 16.645, as amended, and as recommended by the System's actuary, the KRS Board met on April 2, 2009 and re-established the CERS employer rates for 2009-2010 as follows:

CERS nonhazardous	16.16%
CERS hazardous	32.97%

These employer contribution rates will become effective July 1, 2009.

Please distribute copies of this memorandum to the individuals responsible for your budget. Employer contribution rates for all systems may be changed if legislation affecting the rates is enacted in upcoming sessions of the Kentucky General Assembly.



Stage 2 DBPR IDSE Standard Monitoring Factsheet

WHAT IS THE STAGE 2 DBPR?

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published the Stage 2 Disinfectants and Disinfection Byproducts Rule (Stage 2 DBPR) on January 4, 2006. The Stage 2 DBPR builds on existing regulations by requiring water systems to meet disinfection byproduct (DBP) maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) at each monitoring site in the distribution system to better protect public health.

WHAT IS THE IDSE PROVISION OF THE STAGE 2 DBPR?

The Stage 2 DBPR includes a provision requiring all community water systems (CWS) and only nontransient noncommunity water systems (NTNCWS) serving more than 10,000 people to conduct an initial distribution system evaluation (IDSE). NTNCWS serving less than 10,000 are exempted from IDSE requirements, but will need to comply with the Stage 2 DBPR compliance monitoring requirements. The goal of the IDSE is to characterize the distribution system and identify monitoring sites where customers may be exposed to high levels of total trihalomethanes (TTHM) and haloacetic acids (HAA5). There are four ways to comply with the IDSE requirements: Standard Monitoring, System Specific Study, 40/30 Certification (40/30), and Very Small System (VSS) Waiver. The Standard Monitoring option requires the system to collect 1 year of TTHM and HAA5 data at a specified frequency and locations to characterize TTHM and HAA5 levels in the distribution system. In addition to this data, the system must use available Stage 1 DBPR compliance data to determine the best locations for Stage 2 DBPR compliance monitoring. Any system may conduct Standard Monitoring to meet the IDSE requirements of the Stage 2 DBPR. This factsheet only provides information regarding the Standard Monitoring option.

STANDARD MONITORING REQUIREMENTS

Systems opting to conduct Standard Monitoring will need to:

- Step 1: Prepare and submit a Standard Monitoring Plan by the date specified in Table 1 (below).
- Step 2: Conduct one year of Standard Monitoring in the distribution system.
- Step 3: Prepare and submit the IDSE Report.
- Step 4: Prepare a Stage 2 DBPR compliance monitoring plan.



C. Storage Facilities

One elevated storage tank with a capacity of 30,000 gallons was constructed in 1962-1964. No other treated water storage exists in the system except for plant clearwell (30,000). This tank is welded steel structure located at a central point in the distribution system. Overflow elevation is 1033' MSL.

This tank was sand blasted and repainted inside and out in 1978. Other repairs and improvements are needed such as installation of an altitude valve and an overflow pipe from tank top to ground level.

III. PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

A. Water Supply

Water supply improvements proposed herein are abandoning the existing supply and constructing a transmission main from Mount Sterling along U.S. Highway 460 East of Camargo. This project would require construction of a master meter at the point of connection, approximately 23,000 feet of 8 inch water line and a pressure reducing valve. Approximately eleven new customers will be served by this transmission line. Pumping will not be required since Mount Sterling's tank supplying Camargo has an overflow of 1174 MSL.

Exhibit II shows the overall scheme of service provided by these proposed lines.

Β. Distribution System

1. Extensions - Two extensions of the existing system are proposed (in addition to supply mains). One is along Oldham Road for approximately 9,200 feet. This extension will serve a minimum of 13 new customers. The other extension is along Whitaker Lane

(KY 646) from US 460 to Spencer Pike (KY 713). Approximately 17 new customers will be added on this 10,000 foot section of 4 inch water line. Exhibit II shows these extensions.

2. Existing System Improvements - Existing system improvements proposed consist of the following: 1) Replace all dead end 2 inch and 3 inch existing pipe segments with 4 inch (minimum) pipe; 2) construct a 1,700 foot, 8 inch water line from the new tank to Camargo Elementary School to enable meeting fire flow demands; and 3) installing approximately 18 new 4 inch and 6 inch fire hydrants throughout the District's service area. These improvements are shown in Exhibit III.

C. Storage Facilities

A new 200,000 gallon elevated storage tank is proposed to be constructed near the existing tank with the overflow elevation set at 1055 MSL. The existing tank will be dismantled and removed. Exhibit III shows the proposed tank location.

A tank level control valve station (TCV) will be constructed near the Camargo Heights area which will regulate water level in the new tank. This valve station also separates the supply system (Mount Sterling) high pressure range from the lower pressure service area in Camargo. Exhibit III shows the proposed tank location.

IV. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

A. Project Cost

Appendix "A" presents construction cost estimates for the proposed project. Appendix "B" contains a summary of these costs plus other estimated costs which will be incurred plus the project funding sources. A total project cost of \$605,000 is estimated.



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A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSION OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NUMBER ONE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY, PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION OF MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO THE DISTRICT'S EXISTING MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS SYSTEM; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SAID DISTRICT'S \$431,000 "WATERWORKS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES OF 1983," TO PAY THE COSTS THEREOF (TO THE EXTENT NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED TO BE PAID), SUCH BONDS TO BE ISSUED IN ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE SECURITY RIGHTS OF THE HOLDERS OF CERTAIN PREVIOUSLY ISSUED AND OUTSTANDING BONDS; MAKING AND CONFIRMING PROVISIONS FOR THE COLLECTION, SEGREGATION, DISTRIBUTION AND DISBURSEMENT OF THE REVENUES OF SAID SYSTEM, AND FOR THE ALLOCATION THEREOF TO VARIOUS SPECIAL FUNDS HERETOFORE AND HEREIN CREATED, IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE ORDERLY PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; SETTING FORTH CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS UNDER WHICH ADDITIONAL BONDS MAY BE ISSUED IN THE FUTURE, PAYABLE FROM SAID REVENUES AND RANKING ON A BASIS OF PARITY WITH THE BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; PROVIDING FOR THE RIGHTS OF THE HOLDERS OF THE BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED AND THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR AN ADVERTISED, PUBLIC, COMPETITIVE SALE OF THE BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED.

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> WHEREAS, upon petition and hearing, and upon proper public notice according to the provisions of Chapter 74 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes ("KRS"), an Order and Judgment was duly entered by the County Court of Montgomery County, Kentucky, on August 10, 1954, determining necessity for and creating and establishing the Montgomery County Water District Number One (the "District"), defining the geographical area thereof, and appointing Water Commissioners, the same thereupon constituting and being a public body corporate with all powers and authority as provided in KRS Chapter 74; and the District is at this time a de jure Water District situated wholly in Montgomery County, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution of the Commission of the District adopted on November 2, 1960 (the "1960 Resolution"), the District authorized and thereafter issued its "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1960" (the "1960 Bonds") for the purpose of providing funds for the initial construction and installation of a water distribution system (the "System") to serve the area of the District; and WHEREAS, it is provided in and by Section 10 of the 1960 Resolution that the District may issue additional bonds or other obligations in order to pay the costs of additions, improvements and extensions to the System provided that such additional bonds or other obligations are issued in express recognition of the priorities, liens and rights created and existing for the security, source of payment and protection of the 1960 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, in proceedings before the Public Service Commission of Kentucky, the District has obtained the right and authority to construct and operate major extensions and additions to the System, and plans and specifications have heretofore been prepared by Kennoy Engineers, Inc., Lexington, Kentucky, and approved by the District's Commission and all State and supervisory authorities having jurisdiction thereof; and it is the opinion of the Commission of the District that it is feasible to undertake the construction and installation of such new facilities at this time; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined upon the basis of public bids for construction duly solicited in the manner required by law, and upon the basis of other costs and estimates, that the aggregate of all costs and expenses in connection with the aforesaid project will be \$605,000, and to provide such funds the District has received from FmHA an offer to make a FmHA loan to the District in the amount of \$431,000, which will be supplemented by a grant from the Appalachian Regional Commission ("ARC") in the amount of \$169,000 and by available funds of the District in the amount of \$5,000; and

WHEREAS, it is now appropriate for the District to provide for borrowing said sum of \$431,000 through issuance and sale of its "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983" (the "1983 Bonds") according to authority of Kentucky Revised Statutes ("KRS") Chapter 74 and KRS Sections 96.350 to 96.510, inclusive, and the provisions of the 1960 Resolution permitting the issuance of subordinate bonds or other obligations; and the 1983 Bonds shall be payable as to both principal and interest solely (except as to capitalized interest) from the income and revenues to be derived from the operation of the System, as extended from time to time, and shall not constitute an indebtedness of the District within the meaning of debt-limiting provisions of the Constitution of Kentucky, provided that, as aforesaid, the 1983 Bonds shall be subject to the prior and superior pledges, liens and rights of the outstanding 1960 Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NUMBER ONE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

AFFIRMATION OF PREAMBLE RECITALS; AUTHORIZATION OF THE PROJECT; DECLARATION OF NECESSITY

All statements and recitals set forth in the preamble of this Resolution, including the terms defined therein, are hereby affirmed and adopted as a part of this Resolution.

It is hereby further determined and declared to be necessary in the interests of the general welfare of the citizens and inhabitants of the District that the District undertake at this time the construction and installation of major additions and extensions to the District's municipal waterworks system (the "Project"), all substantially according to the plans, specifications and designs prepared for the District by Kennoy Engineers, Inc., Lexington, Kentucky (the "Engineers"). Immediate undertaking of such construction and installation is hereby authorized.

SECTION 2

PROJECT TO BE MUNICIPALLY OWNED AND OPERATED

The construction and installation of the Project is undertaken by the District for public purposes and same shall constitute and be a part of the District's municipal waterworks system (the "System," as expanded and improved by the Project), and so long as any of the 1983 Bonds hereinafter authorized, or bonds issued on a parity therewith, shall remain outstanding and unpaid as to principal or interest, the System shall continue to be municipally owned, controlled, operated and maintained by the District for the security and source of payment of the 1983 Bonds hereinafter authorized to be issued, and all other parity bonds outstanding any any such parity bonds which may be hereafter issued, subject, however, to the provisions of Section 3 hereinafter. The Project is to be constructed, installed and acquired and the System is to be operated pursuant to the provisions of KRS Sections 74.370 and 96.350 to 96.510, inclusive, now in full force and effect.

SECTION 3

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF OUTSTANDING BONDS AND PRIOR SECURITIES THEREOF; 1983 BONDS AUTHORIZED; CERTAIN TERMS AND DETAILS

The District acknowledges that it has previously issued or incurred, and that there are outstanding at this time, the 1960

Bonds, as identified and described in the preamble hereof, and further that the 1983 Bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be subordinate and inferior as to security and source of payment to the outstanding 1960 Bonds so long as same are outstanding and unpaid. It is acknowledged and affirmed by the District that said outstanding 1960 Bonds possess prior and superior liens and rights with respect to the System and its income and revenues, and nothing in this Resolution shall be construed as impairing, amending or in any way diminishing said security rights, liens and interests. In this connection, the provisions of the 1960 Resolution are hereby reaffirmed. The District hereby agrees and covenants that so long as the 1983 Bonds herein authorized are outstanding, it will not issue any bonds ranking on a parity with said outstanding 1960 Bonds.

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For the purpose of providing funds to defray the costs of the Project (to the extent not otherwise provided to be paid), including all necessary and proper appurtenances, and expenses incident thereto and incident to the issuance of the 1983 Bonds hereinafter authorized, there are hereby authorized to be issued the District's "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983" (the "1983 Bonds"), in the principal amount of Four Hundred Thirty One Thousand Dollars (\$431,000), with reservation of right on the part of the District to issue additional bonds in the future, payable from the income and revenues of the System, subject to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter prescribed and set forth. The 1983 Bonds hereby authorized shall be offered at public sale as provided in Section 4 hereof and shall be issuable in the form of a single fully registered bond as provided in Section 5 hereof.

The 1983 Bonds shall be dated as of the date of delivery to the original purchaser thereof; shall mature as to principal in installments on January 1 in each of the years 1985 to 2022, inclusive, as set forth in the schedule appearing below; and shall bear interest from their date until payment of principal, such interest to the respective principal maturity dates to be payable semiannually on January 1 and July 1 of each year, and such interest to be at such rate as may be established by a supplemental Resolution upon the basis of competitive sale of the 1983 Bonds as hereinafter provided. The installments of principal of 1983 Bonds in fully registered form as aforesaid shall be as set forth in the following schedule:

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provided, however, that installments of principal of 1983 Bonds maturing on and after January 1, 1994, shall be subject to prepayment at the option of the District prior to maturity in whole or from time to time in part in inverse order of maturities (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot) on any interest payment date on and after January 1, 1993, upon terms of par plus accrued interest without any prepayment premium, upon thirty (30)

days' prior written notice mailed to the registered holder or holders of the 1983 Bonds; provided, that so long as FmHA is the owner of any of the 1983 Bonds, same may be prepaid in whole or in part at any time at par plus accrued interest, and without notice of prepayment or prepayment premium. The 1983 Bonds may be prepaid only in increments of \$1,000.

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Both principal of and interest on the 1983 Bonds shall be payable, without deduction for exchange or collection charges, in such coin or currency of the United States of America as at the time of payment shall be legal tender for the payment of debts due the United States of America, to the registered holder at the address shown on the registration books of the District or, so long as FmHA is the registered holder, at the office or address as may be designated by FmHA from time to time.

If any District officer whose signature appears on any 1983 Bond shall cease to be such officer prior to delivery, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and binding for all purposes, the same as if such officer had continued in office until the time of delivery of such 1983 Bond. The 1983 Bonds, together with the interest thereon, and any bonds which may hereafter be issued on a basis of parity therewith subject to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter set forth, shall be payable only out of the "Waterworks Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983 Bond and Interest Sinking Fund," as hereinafter more specifically provided, and shall be a valid claim of the holder thereof only against said Fund and the fixed portion or amount of the revenues of the System which the District has pledged to said Fund, subject to the terms hereof.

SECTION 4

PROVISIONS RELATING TO SALE OF BOND ISSUE

The 1983 Bonds authorized by this Resolution shall be publicly offered for sale according to a "Notice of Sale of Bonds" conforming to the requirements of KRS Chapter 424 (and particularly KRS 424.140(3) and KRS 424.360), which shall be published one time, not less than seven (7) days nor more than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date therein specified (by and at the discretion of the Chairman of the Commission of the District) for the opening and consideration of purchase bids, in each of the following: (a) the Mt. Sterling Advocate, a legal newspaper published in Mount Sterling, Montgomery County, Kentucky, which is qualified under KRS 424.120 to publish advertisements for said District; (b) The Courier-Journal, Louisville, Kentucky, a legal newspaper having statewide circulation; and (c) The Daily Bond Buyer, New York, New York, a financial newspaper or journal of general circulation among bond buyers.

Said Notice shall state the name and amount of 1983 Bonds to be sold, the time of the sale and other details concerning the 1983 Bonds and the sale and shall inform prospective bidders that a copy of the "Official Notice of Bond Sale," setting out the maturities, security of the 1983 Bonds, provisions as to redemption prior to maturity, and related information, may be obtained from the District. Such Official Notice shall contain, <u>inter alia</u>, substantially the following bidding requirements:

(A) Bidders are required to bid a cash price of not less than par value for the 1983 Bonds.

(B) Interest rate must be in a multiple of 1/8 or 1/10 of one percent.

(C) Bids will be considered only for the entire 1983 Bond issue.

(D) Bidders (except FmHA) are required to deposit a good faith check by cashier's check or certified check in the minimum amount of 2% of the face amount of the 1983 Bonds, which good faith deposit may be applied as partial payment for the 1983 Bonds, or as liquidated damage in the event that such bidder, if successful, fails to comply with the terms of his bid.

(E) Preference in award will be given to the bid resulting in the lowest net interest cost to the District.

(F) The lowest net interest cost will be determined by deducting the total amount of any premium bid from the aggregate amount of interest upon the 1983 Bonds bid for, computed from the first day of the month following the date of sale of the 1983 Bonds (even though the 1983 Bonds will bear interest only from the date of delivery) to the final maturity specified in each respective bid.

(G) The District expects to deliver, and the successful bidder must be prepared to accept delivery of and pay for, the 1983 Bonds at the office of the District within 45 days after notice is given of the award. If the 1983 Bonds are not ready for delivery and payment within forty-five days from the aforesaid date of sale, the successful bidder shall be relieved of any liability to accept delivery of the 1983 Bonds, except that 1983 Bonds purchased by any agency of the Federal government will be delivered to it at a place and time designated by such agency in accordance with its established practices and procedures.

(H) The District reserves the right, in its discretion, to determine the best bid or bids, to waive any informality or irregularity and to reject any or all bids.

(I) The District will furnish the 1983 Bonds, together with evidence of approval of the 1983 Bond issue by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky pursuant to the requirements of KRS Chapter 278 and customary closing documents, including no-litigation certificate.

(J) The 1983 Bonds will be tendered within said 45-day period and the successful bidder will receive the approving legal opinion of Harper, Ferguson & Davis, Bond Counsel, Louisville, Kentucky, as to the legality of and tax-exempt status of interest on the 1983 Bonds, without additional cost to the successful bidder.

In the event that there is no bid, or that all bids are rejected, the District may re-advertise the sale pursuant to this Resolution.

Bond Counsel having submitted to the Commission of the District forms of the "Notice of Sale of Bonds" and the "Official Notice of Bond Sale," together with an "Official Bid Form" for use by all bidders except FmHA, said documents are hereby approved and authorized for use in connection with the aforesaid sale of the 1983 Bonds.

SECTION 5

1983 BONDS TO BE ISSUED IN FULLY REGISTERED FORM; FULLY REGISTERED BOND FORM

Upon the sale of the 1983 Bonds, the District shall issue a single 1983 Bond, numbered R-1 (hereinafter referred to as the "Fully Registered Bond"). The Fully Registered Bond shall be in the aggregate principal amount of the 1983 Bonds it represents, maturing as to principal in installments as set out in Section 3 hereof. The Fully Registered Bond shall be of type composition, on paper of sufficient weight and strength to prevent deterioration until the last day of maturity of any installment of principal as stated therein, and shall conform in size to standard practice. The Fully Registered Bond shall, upon execution on behalf of the District (which execution shall be by manual signatures of the Chairman and Secretary of the Commission, and actual impression of the corporate seal), constitute a part of the 1983 Bond issue herein authorized and referred to, shall be non-negotiable, without interest coupons, registered as to principal and interest, payable as directed by the payee, and be in substantially the form hereinafter set forth.

The Fully Registered Bond shall be in substantially the following form (with appropriate insertions):

This Bond is the Bond in fully registered form representing a total authorized issue of Bonds in the principal amount of \$431,000 issued by the District pursuant to the Constitution and Statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including among others Chapter 74 and Sections 96.350 to 96.510, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, and pursuant to a duly adopted resolution of the

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District, for the purpose of paying the costs (to the extent not otherwise provided to be paid) of the construction and installation of major extensions and additions to the District's municipal waterworks system (the "System"), together with appurtenant facilities, and incidental expenses.

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> This Bond and the issue which it represents, together with such additional bonds ranking on a parity therewith as may hereafter be issued and outstanding from time to time in accordance with the conditions and restrictions set forth in the resolution authorizing the issuance of this Bond, are payable from and secured by a pledge of a fixed portion of the income and revenues to be derived from the operation of the System, subject, however, to the priorities hereinafter recited, which fixed portion shall be sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on this Bond and the issue of which it forms a part, and any outstanding parity bonds, as and when the same shall become due and payable, and which shall be set aside as a special fund for that purpose and identified as the "Waterworks Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983 Bond and Interest Sinking Fund"; provided, however, the District has outstanding certain of its "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1960," dated June 1, 1960, which are secured by a pledge of and lien on the income and revenues of the System which are prior and superior to the security rights created for this Bond and the issue of which it is a part; and so long as any of said bonds dated June 1, 1960 are outstanding and unpaid, the District will comply in all respects with the requirements of the resolution authorizing said bonds dated June 1, 1960, and it is acknowledged that this Bond and the issue of which it is a part are subject to the prior pledges, liens and rights securing said previously issued and outstanding bonds so long as any of the same remain outstanding and unpaid.

> A statutory mortgage lien upon the System and appurtenant facilities, together with all future additions and improvements thereto, and extensions thereof, is created by Section 96.400 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes for the benefit and protection of the holder of this Bond, and the same shall continue as a lien upon the System and appurtenant facilities, together with all future additions and improvements thereto, extensions thereof and the revenues derived from the operation thereof until payment in full of the principal of and interest on this Bond, said statutory mortgage lien being subject and subordinate, however, to the similar lien created and existing as security for the District's outstanding "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1960," dated June 1, 1960.

> This Bond does not in any manner constitute an indebtedness of the District within the meaning of the Statutes and Constitution of Kentucky, and the District is not and shall not be obligated to pay this Bond or the interest hereon except from said special fund. The District, acting by and through its Commission, covenants that

it will fix, and if necessary adjust from time to time, such rates and charges for use of the services and facilities of the System and will collect and account for the income and revenues therefrom sufficient, after providing for the requirements of the resolution authorizing said previously issued and outstanding bonds dated June 1, 1960 to pay promptly the interest on and principal of this issue of Bonds, and all other bonds ranking on a parity therewith as may be issued and outstanding from time to time in accordance with the conditions and restrictions prescribed in that connection, as well as to pay the costs of operation and maintenance of the System.

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> This Bond shall be registered as to principal and interest in the name of the holder hereof, after which it shall be transferable only upon presentation to the Secretary of the District, as the Bond Registrar, with a written transfer duly acknowledged by the registered holder or his duly authorized attorney, which transfer shall be noted upon this Bond and upon the books of the District kept for that purpose.

The District, at its option, shall have the right to prepay, on any interest payment date on and after January 1, 1993, in the inverse chronological order of the installments due on this Bond, the entire principal amount of this Bond then remaining unpaid, or such lesser portion thereof in multiples of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) as the District may determine, at a price in an amount equivalent to the principal amount to be prepaid plus accrued interest to the date of prepayment, without any prepayment premium. Notice of such prepayment shall be given by registered mail to the registered holder of this Bond at least thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for prepayment. Provided, however, that so long as the United States of America, Farmers Home Administration, is the registered holder of this Bond, this Bond may be prepaid at any time in whole or in part, at par or face value and without notice or prepayment premium.

Upon default in the payment of any principal or interest payment on this Bond or upon failure by the District to comply with any other provisions of this Bond or with the provisions of the resolution authorizing the issuance of this Bond, the registered holder may, at his option, institute proceedings to enforce all rights and remedies provided by law or by said resolution.

This Bond is exempt from ad valorem taxation in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED, RECITED AND DECLARED that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Bond do exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the face amount of this Bond, being the total authorized amount of Bonds of the issue of which this Bond is a part, together with all other obligations of the District, does not exceed any limit prescribed by the Constitution or Statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

SECTION 6

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DISPOSITION OF 1983 BOND PROCEEDS; CONSTRUCTION FUND

The Treasurer of the District shall be the custodian of all funds belonging to and associated with the System, as expanded and improved from time to time, and such funds shall be deposited in The Mt. Sterling National Bank, Mount Sterling, Kentucky, or in such other bank or banks in Kentucky as the Commission of the District may from time to time designate (hereinafter sometimes referred to, singularly and collectively, as the "Depository Bank"). All such moneys of the District deposited in the Depository Bank in excess of the amount insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") shall be secured by the Depository Bank in accordance with U. S. Treasury Department Circular No. 176. The Treasurer shall execute a fidelity bond in an amount and with a surety company approved by FmHA so long as it is the holder of any of the 1983 Bonds; and FmHA and the District shall be named co-obligees in such surety bond, and the amount thereof shall not be reduced without the written consent of FmHA. The proceeds of the 1983 Bonds shall be applied as follows:

Upon the issuance and delivery of the 1983 Bonds authorized by this Resolution, the entire proceeds thereof shall be deposited in an account designated "Montgomery County Water District Number One Series of 1983 Construction Fund" (the "Construction Fund") created by separate interim financing Resolution of the Commission of the District adopted concurrently herewith. Said 1983 Bond proceeds shall constitute a part of the Construction Fund and shall be applied, to the extent necessary, in paying the costs incident to constructing, installing and acquiring the Project, including expenses incurred in the issuance of the 1983 Bonds and paying interim financing obligations (both principal and interest) incurred in connection with the Project as authorized by said separate interim financing Resolution of the Commission of the District; provided, however, any 1983 Bond proceeds so used to pay such interim financing obligations may be disbursed directly to the appropriate lending institution(s) without the requirement of being deposited to the Construction Fund. There shall also be deposited in the Construction Fund, as received, the proceeds of all grants in aid of construction of the Project and the sum of \$5,000 (as specified in the conditions of the FmHA loan to the District) constituting available funds of the District collected from new customers to be served by the Project as subscription or connection fees, unless said sums, or any portions thereof, have already been expended for authorized Project purposes.

A sum in the Construction Fund estimated to be equal to interest which will accrue on the 1983 Bonds (following delivery thereof) during construction and development of the Project shall be earmarked, used and applied to the payment of interest on the 1983 Bonds next becoming due.

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Disbursements from the Construction Fund shall be made by checks signed by the District Treasurer, and such disbursements shall be authorized and approved in writing by the District Chairman and Secretary and, if FmHA is the purchaser of the Bonds, by FmHA. Reference is made in this connection to the provisions of the separate interim financing Resolution adopted concurrently herewith.

Pending disbursement, the 1983 Bond proceeds shall be deposited, as aforesaid, in the Construction Fund, and to the extent that such deposit causes the aggregate deposits by the District in the Depository Bank to be in excess of the amount insured by FDIC, the same shall be secured by a surety bond or bonds furnished by a surety company or companies qualified to do business in Kentucky and approved by the Commission of the District, or by a valid pledge of direct obligations of the United States Government, or obligations as to which the payment of principal and interest are guaranteed by the United States Government, having a market value at least equivalent to such deposit.

Where the moneys on deposit in the Construction Fund exceed the estimated disbursements on account of the Project for the next 60 days, the District shall direct the Depository Bank to invest such excess funds in direct obligations of, or obligations the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States Government, which shall mature not later than six months after the date of such investment and which shall be subject to redemption at any time by the holder thereof. The earnings from any such investments shall be deposited in the Construction Fund by the District, unless otherwise authorized by FmHA.

In the event any unexpected balance shall remain in the Construction Fund after completion of the Project, and payment of all of the costs thereof, as certified by the Engineers, such unexpended balance, subject to the terms and conditions of the aforesaid FmHA loan, and to FmHA approval, shall be transferred and deposited in the Sinking Fund and shall be used at the earliest practicable date for the retirement of 1983 Bonds by purchase thereof (or principal prepayment) in inverse numerical and maturity order.

In the event that the amount hereinabove provided to be set aside from 1983 Bond proceeds for payment for interest during the construction and development of the Project should prove to be insufficient for such purpose, additional moneys may, upon approval by FmHA, be withdrawn from the Construction Fund and so applied, inasmuch as interest during such period is a proper part of the cost of the Project, to the extent authorized by FmHA. Pending disbursements for the authorized purposes, the proceeds of all 1983 Bonds at any time issued pursuant to this Resolution shall be subject to a first and paramount lien and charge in favor of the holders of 1983 Bonds issued and outstanding hereunder and for their further security.

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SECTION 7

OPERATION OF SYSTEM; FLOW OF FUNDS; ACCUMULATION OF REVENUES

All proceedings preliminary to and in connection with the issuance of the 1960 Bonds, particularly the 1960 Resolution, whereby provision was made for the operation of the System on a revenue-producing basis, for the segregation, allocation and custody of revenues derived from the operation of the System, and for the enforcement and payment of the 1960 Bonds, are hereby ratified and confirmed and shall continue in full force and effect, the same as if such provisions and proceedings were herein set out in full, and nothing herein shall be construed as altering, revising or amending said contractual relationships; and so long as the 1960 Bonds remain outstanding and unpaid, the District shall maintain all funds required to be maintained and created by the terms of the 1960 Resolution.

Consistent with the foregoing, it is hereby resolved and provided that from and after issuance and delivery of the 1983 Bonds herein authorized, and so long as any of the 1983 Bonds or parity bonds remain outstanding and unpaid, the System shall continue to be operated on a fiscal year basis, and on that basis the cash income and revenues of the System shall be collected, segregated, accounted for and distributed as follows:

A separate and special fund or account of the (A) District, distinct and apart from all other funds and accounts, was created by the 1960 Resolution identified as the "Montgomery County Water District Number One Revenue Fund" (the "Revenue Fund"), which shall be maintained in the Depository Bank; and the District covenants and agrees that it will deposit therein, promptly as received from time to time, all cash income and revenues of the System. The moneys in the Revenue Fund from time to time shall be allocated to the respective accounts therein and shall be used and disbursed and applied by the District only for the purposes, and in the manner and order of priorities, specified in the 1960 Resolution. After making from the Revenue Fund the separate account allocations and all disbursements and payments required to be made in fulfillment of the contractual commitments made in connection with the 1960 Bonds (as provided in the 1960 Resolution), the moneys in the Revenue Fund from time to time shall be used and disbursed and applied by the District, as permitted by applicable statutes, as follows:

(B) A separate and special fund or account of the District is hereby created to be deposited and maintained in the Depository Bank, distinct and apart from all other funds and accounts, and the same is designated and identified as the "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983 Bond and Interest Sinking Fund" (the "Sinking Fund"), which shall be maintained so long as any of the 1983 Bonds herein authorized or parity bonds herein permitted to be issued are outstanding; and all moneys deposited therein from time to time shall be used and disbursed and applied, and are hereby irrevocably pledged, solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the 1983 Bonds and any parity bonds as may have been issued and outstanding from time to time pursuant to the provisions of this Resolution.

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Following delivery of and payment for the 1983 Bonds herein authorized, there shall be transferred on or before the 20th day of each month from the Revenue Fund (having due regard to the priorities in connection with the outstanding 1960 Bonds) to the Sinking Fund not less than the following amounts:

- beginning with and including the month in which interest shall last be payable from 1983 Bond proceeds, a sum equal to one-sixth (1/6) of the next succeeding interest installment to become due on all 1983 Bonds then outstanding; and
- (ii) beginning on January 15, 1984, a sum equal to one-twelfth (1/12) of the principal of all 1983 Bonds maturing on the next succeeding January 1.

In the event additional parity bonds are issued pursuant to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter prescribed in that connection, the monthly deposits to the Sinking Fund shall be increased to provide for payment of interest thereon and the principal thereof as the same respectively become due.

Moneys from time to time in the Sinking Fund may be held in cash, in which event the same shall be secured (to the extent not insured by FDIC) by a valid pledge of bonds, notes, or certificates of indebtedness of the United States Government having at all times an equal market value; or the same may, upon order of the Commission, be invested and reinvested in interest-bearing obligations of, or obligations the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States Government, maturing no later than five (5) years from the date the investment is made, or the final maturity date of 1983 Bonds or parity bonds issued pursuant to this Resolution, whichever date is the earlier. Income from any such investments shall be accumulated in the Sinking Fund, and may be invested in the same manner.

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The District has previously, by the 1960 Resolution, created special funds for purposes of the 1960 Bonds and the System, identified as the "Waterworks Bond and Interest Sinking Fund" (including the Debt Service Reserve therein), the "Waterworks System Depreciation Fund" and the "Operation and Maintenance Fund." All provisions relating to said identified special funds are hereby ratified, readopted and affirmed; said Funds shall continue to be maintained according to the resolutions establishing same; and so long as the 1983 Bonds herein authorized are outstanding, the Revenue Fund and the aforesaid Depreciation Fund and Operation and Maintenance Fund created by the 1960 Resolution shall continue in effect, with the District making such monthly transfers to said Depreciation and Operation and Maintenance Funds from the Revenue Fund as are required by the terms of the 1960 Resolution, and the minimum sum to be accumulated in the Depreciation Fund with respect to the 1983 Bonds shall be \$26,000, with monthly payments into said Depreciation Fund from the Revenue Fund with respect to the 1983 Bonds to be at least \$220.

SECTION 8

COVENANTS TO BONDHOLDERS

In addition to and not in derogation of the covenants contained in the 1960 Resolution in favor of the holders of the 1960 Bonds, the District hereby irrevocably covenants and agrees with the holder or holders of any and all 1983 Bonds and parity bonds at any time issued and outstanding pursuant to authority of this Resolution that so long as the same or any part thereof or interest thereon remain outstanding and unpaid:

(A) It will faithfully and punctually perform all duties with reference to the System required by the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and by the terms and provisions of this Resolution.

(B) It will at all times operate the System on a revenue-producing basis, and will permit no free services to be rendered or afforded thereby.

(C) It will maintain the System in good condition through application of revenues accumulated and set aside for operation and maintenance, as herein provided; and will make unusual or extraordinary repairs, renewals and replacements, as the same may be required, through application of revenues accumulated and set aside for such purposes.

(D) The District covenants and agrees that, so long as any of the 1983 Bonds are outstanding, it will not (subject to the pre-existing rights of the holders of the 1960 Bonds) sell or otherwise dispose of any of the System facilities or any part thereof, and, except as provided for in this Resolution and in the 1969 Resolution, it will not create or permit to be created any charge or lien on the revenues thereof ranking equal or prior to the charge or lien of the 1983 Bonds. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the District may at any time permanently abandon the use of, or sell at fair market value, any of its System facilities, provided that:

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> (i) it is in compliance with all covenants and undertakings in connection with all of its 1983 Bonds then outstanding and payable from the revenues of the System;

> (ii) it will, in the event of sale, apply the proceeds to either (1) redemption of outstanding 1960 Bonds and then 1983 Bonds in accordance with the provisions governing prepayment of said Bonds in advance of maturity, or (2) replacement of the facility so disposed of by another facility the revenues of which shall be incorporated into the System as hereinbefore provided;

(iii) it certifies, prior to any abandonment of use, that the facility to be abandoned is no longer economically feasible of producing net revenues; and

(iv) notwithstanding all of the foregoing, no such sale, abandonment or transfer of System facilities shall be made so long as FmHA owns any of the 1983 Bonds herein authorized, without the written consent and approval of FmHA.

(E) It will establish, enforce and collect rates and charges for services rendered and facilities afforded by the System; and the same shall be reasonable and just, taking into account and consideration the cost and value of the System, the costs of operating the same and maintaining it in a good state of repair, proper and necessary allowances for depreciation and for additions and extensions, and the amounts necessary for the orderly retirement of all outstanding bonds as aforesaid and the accruing interest thereon, and the accumulation of reserves as herein provided; and such rates and charges shall be adequate to meet all such requirements as provided in this Resolution, and shall, if necessary, be adjusted from time to time in order to comply herewith.

On or before the date of issuance of the 1983 Bonds, the District will adopt a Budget of Current Expenses for the System for the remainder of the then current fiscal year of the System, and thereafter, on or before the first day of

each fiscal year so long as any 1983 Bonds are outstanding, it will adopt an Annual Budget of Current Expenses for the ensuing fiscal year, and will file a copy of each such Budget, and of any amendments thereto, in the office of the Secretary of the District, and furnish copies thereof to the holder of any Bond upon request. The term "Current Expenses," as herein used, includes all reasonable and necessary costs of operating, repairing, maintaining, and insuring the System, but shall exclude any allowance for depreciation, payments into the Depreciation Fund for extensions, improvements, and extraordinary repairs and maintenance, and payments into all sinking funds established for the 1960 Bonds. The District covenants that the Current Expenses incurred in any year will not exceed the reasonable and necessary amounts therefor, and that it will not expend any amount or incur any obligations for operation, maintenance and repairs in excess of the amounts provided for Current Expenses in the Annual Budget, except upon resolution duly adopted by the Commission of the District determining that such expenses are necessary in order to operate and maintain the System. At the same time, and in like manner, the District agrees that it will prepare an estimate of cash income and revenues to be derived from operation of the System for each fiscal year, and to the extent that said cash income and revenues are insufficient to provide for all payments required to be made into the said sinking funds during such ensuing fiscal year, and to build up and maintain the reserves specified and referred to in Section 7 of this Resolution, and to pay Current Expenses, the District covenants and agrees that it will revise its rates and charges for services rendered by the System, so that the same will be adequate to meet all of such requirements.

(F) It will not at any time make any reduction in any prevailing schedule of rates and charges for use of the services and facilities of the System without first obtaining the written determination of a Consulting Engineer of national reputation that the proposed reduction will not adversely affect the ability of the District to meet all the requirements set forth in this Resolution.

(G) It will at all times segregate the revenues of the System from all other revenues, moneys, and funds of the District, and will promptly and regularly make application and distribution thereof into the special funds provided in this Resolution, in the amount and with due regard for the priorities herein attributed thereto. (H) It will keep proper books of record and account, separate and clearly distinguishable from all other municipal records and accounts, showing complete and correct entries of all transactions relating to the System, and the same shall be available and open to inspection by any Bondholder, and any agent or representative of a Bondholder.

It will, within ninety (90) days after the end of (I) each fiscal year, cause an audit to be made of the books of record and account pertinent to the System, by an independent state-licensed accountant not in the employ of the District on a monthly salary basis, showing all receipts and disbursements, and reflecting in reasonable detail the financial condition and records of the System, including the status of the several funds hereinbefore created, the status of the insurance and fidelity bonding, the number and type of connections, and the current rates and charges, with comments of the auditor concerning whether the books and records are being kept in compliance with this Resolution and in accordance with recognized accounting practices, and will promptly cause a copy of the Audit Report to be filed in the Office of the Secretary where it will be available for public inspection, and will promptly mail a copy thereof to the original recipients of 1983 Bonds issued hereunder. Ιf requested to do so, the District will furnish to any Bondholder a condensed form of the Balance Sheet, and a condensed form of the Operating Report, in reasonable All expenses incurred in causing such audits to be detail. made, and copies distributed, shall constitute proper expenses of operating and maintaining the System, and may be paid from revenues allocated for such purposes, as herein provided. Provided, so long as FmHA holds any of the 1983 Bonds herein authorized, the District shall furnish operating and other financial statements in such form and substance and for such periods as may be requested by FmHA.

(J) Any holder of 1983 Bonds or of any of the coupons may either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, or other proceedings, enforce and compel performance by said District and its officers and agents of all duties imposed or required by law or this Resolution in connection with the operation of the System, including the making and collecting of sufficient rates and segregation of the revenues and application thereof.

(K) If there be any default in the payment of the principal of or interest on any of the 1983 Bonds, then upon the filing of suit by any holder of said Bonds or any of the coupons, any court having jurisdiction of the action may appoint a receiver to administer the System on behalf of the District (but not in derogation of any of the prior rights and security interests created in connection with the 1960 Bonds), with power to charge and collect rates sufficient to provide for the payment of any bonds or obligations outstanding against the System, and for the payment of Current Expenses, and to apply the revenues in conformity with this Resolution and the provisions of said statute laws of Kentucky aforesaid.

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> (L) The District will cause each municipal officer or other person (other than depository banks) having custody of any moneys administered under the provisions of this Resolution to be bonded at all times in an amount at least equal to the maximum amount of such moneys in his custody at any time; each such bond to have surety given by a surety corporation qualified to do business in Kentucky and approved by the Commission, and the premiums for such surety shall constitute a proper expense of operating the System, and may be paid from moneys available in the Operation and Maintenance Fund.

(M) It will procure, and at all times maintain in force, insurance of all insurable properties constituting parts of, or being appurtenant to, the System to the full insurable value thereof, against damage or destruction by fire, windstorm, and the hazards covered by the standard "extended coverage" policy endorsements or provisions, the premiums therefor to be paid from the Operation and Maintenance Fund; and will deposit all sums collected under the terms of such policies in the Depreciation Fund. Such insurance shall be in amounts sufficient to provide for not less than full recovery whenever a loss from perils insured against does not exceed eighty percentum (80%) of the full insurable value of the damaged facility.

(N) The District will procure and at all times maintain Public Liability Insurance relating to the operation of the System, with limits of not less than \$200,000 for one person and \$500,000 for more than one person involved in one accident to protect the District from claims for bodily injury and/or death; and not less than \$100,000 from claims for damage to property of others which may arise from the District's operation of the System.

(O) The District will carry suitable Workmen's Compensation Insurance in accordance with law.

(P) If the District owns or operates a vehicle in the operation of the System, the District will procure and at all times maintain Vehicular Public Liability Insurance with

limits of not less than \$200,000 for one person and \$500,000 for more than one person involved in one accident to protect the District from claims for bodily injury and/or death, and not less than \$100,000 against claims for damage to property of others which may arise from the District's operation of vehicles. Provided, notwithstanding (M), (N), (O) and (P) above, that so long as FmHA holds any 1983 Bonds, the District will procure and maintain insurance of such types and amounts as FmHA may specify.

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(Q) So long as FmHA is the holder of any bonds of the District, the District shall not issue any bonds or other obligations for the purpose of defeasing or otherwise terminating the lien of such bonds held by FmHA without immediately prepaying all of such bonds held by FmHA.

SECTION 9

PARITY BONDS PERMITTED; TERMS

The 1983 Bonds authorized to be issued hereunder and from time to time outstanding shall not be entitled to priority one over the other in the application of the revenues herein pledged, regardless of the time or times of their issuance, it being the intention that there shall be no priority among the 1983 Bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Resolution, regardless of the fact that they may actually be issued and delivered at different times. No other bonds or other obligations shall be issued by the District and made payable from the income and revenues of the System unless the pledge of revenues for the same is expressly made subordinate and inferior to the lien and pledge herein created; provided, however, the District hereby reserves the right and privilege of issuing additional bonds, from time to time, payable from the revenues of the System, ranking on a basis of equality and parity as to security and source of payment with the 1983 Bonds herein authorized, for the following purposes and subject to the following conditions and restrictions:

(A) The District covenants and agrees that in the event the cost of constructing the Project, together with incidental expenses, shall exceed the cost upon which the dollar amount of 1983 Bonds herein authorized has been computed, it shall pay the amount of such excess out of funds available to it for such purpose. The District may provide such excess (but only such excess) through the issuance of parity bonds, provided that it has obtained (i) the consent of FmHA, and (ii) if any 1983 Bonds are owned by persons other than FmHA, the consent of the holders of two-thirds in principal amount of the outstanding 1983 Bonds so held. (B) The District shall have the right to add new System facilities and related auxiliary facilities by the issuance of one or more additional series of bonds to be secured by a parity lien on and ratably payable from the revenues and any other security pledged to the 1983 Bonds, provided in each instance that:

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> (i) the facility or facilities to be built from the proceeds of the additional parity bonds is or are made a part of the System and its or their revenues are pledged as additional security for the additional parity bonds and the outstanding 1983 Bonds and parity bonds, if any;

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- (ii) the District is in compliance with all covenants and undertakings in connection with all of its bonds then outstanding and payable from the income and revenues of the System or any part thereof; and
- the net revenues (defined as gross revenues less (iii) essential operation and maintenance expenses) of the System for the fiscal year preceding the year of issuance of additional parity bonds are certified by an independent certified public accountant to have been equal to at least one and twenty hundredths (1.20) times the average annual requirements for principal and interest on all 1983 Bonds and parity bonds, if any, then outstanding and on the additional parity bonds then to be issued. Provided, however, the foregoing conditions and limitations prescribed in this subparagraph (iii) may be waived or modified by the written consent of the holders of at least seventy-five percent (75%) in principal amount of the then outstanding 1983 Bonds and any parity bonds.

(C) The District hereby covenants and agrees that in the event additional series of parity bonds are issued, it shall:

- (i) adjust the monthly deposits into the Sinking Fund on the same basis as that prescribed in Section 7(B) hereof to reflect the annual debt service on the additional bonds;
- (ii) adjust and increase appropriately the monthly amount to be deposited into the Depreciation Fund in accord with controlling resolutions to give recognition to the facilities and equipment to be constructed or acquired with the proceeds of such additional bonds; and

(iii) make such additional bonds payable as to principal on January 1 of each year in which principal falls due and payable as to interest on January 1 and July 1 of each year.

(D) The additional parity bonds (sometimes herein referred to as "permitted" to be issued), the issuance of which is restricted and conditioned by this Section, shall be understood to mean bonds payable from the revenues of the System on a basis of equality and parity with the 1983 Bonds herein specifically authorized, and shall not be deemed to include other bonds or obligations, the security and source of payment of which are subordinate and subject to the priority of the 1983 Bonds and parity bonds herein authorized to be issued. The District expressly reserves the right to issue its bonds or other obligations payable from the revenues herein pledged, and not ranking on a basis of equality and parity with the 1983 Bonds and parity bonds herein otherwise referred to, without any proof of previous earnings or net revenues, but only if such bonds or other obligations are issued to provide for additions or extensions or improvements of the System, and only if the same are issued in express recognition of the priorities, liens and rights created and existing for the security, source of payment, and protection of the 1983 Bonds and parity bonds herein authorized and permitted to be issued. Provided, however, that nothing in this Section is intended or shall be construed as a restriction upon the ordinary refunding of the initially authorized 1983 Bonds, and/or of any bonds which may have been issued and are outstanding under any of the provisions of this Resolution, if such refunding does not operate to increase, in any year until the final maturity of the refunding bonds, the aggregate of the principal and interest requirements of the bonds to remain outstanding and the bonds proposed to be refunded.

SECTION 10

PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION CONSTITUTE CONTRACT

The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the District and the holders of the 1983 Bonds herein authorized and any parity bonds herein permitted to be issued, and after the issuance of any of the 1983 Bonds, no change, variation, or alteration of any kind of the provisions of this Resolution shall be made in any manner except as herein provided until such time as all of the 1983 Bonds and parity bonds issued hereunder, and the interest thereon, have been paid in full.

SECTION 11

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STATUTORY MORTGAGE LIEN ACKNOWLEDGED

A statutory mortgage lien upon the System, together with all appurtenances and additions thereto and extensions thereof, and including the revenues thereof, is granted and created by Section 96.400 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes for the benefit and protection of the holders of the 1983 Bonds issued and parity bonds permitted to be issued under authority of this Resolution, and of the interest coupons thereto annexed, which lien is subject and subordinate, however, to the similar lien created and existing as security for the outstanding 1960 Bonds; and said statutory mortgage lien is hereby recognized and shall be effective upon delivery of any of the 1983 Bonds and shall continue in full force and effect so long as there shall remain unpaid any part of the principal of or interest on the 1983 Bonds and any parity bonds.

SECTION 12

TAX COVENANT

(A) In this Section, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

- "Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 of the United States of America, Title 26 of the United States Code, as amended to the date of adoption of this Resolution or as hereafter amended, including valid Regulations of the Department of the Treasury thereunder;
- (ii) Reference to a provision of the Code by number or letter includes reference to any law hereafter enacted as amendment to or substitute for such provision;
- (iii) Words which are used herein and in Section 103 of the Code shall have the meaning given to such words in or pursuant to said Section.
 - (B) The District certifies that:
 - (i) It is reasonably expected that the amount received from the purchaser(s) of the 1983 Bonds will not exceed the cost of construction of the Project and will be expended for purposes of the Project within two (2) years;
 - (ii) The District will incur a substantial binding obligation to construct the Project prior to 1983

Bond delivery and work on the Project will begin within thirty (30) days following such delivery and will proceed with due diligence to completion;

(iii) It is reasonably expected that the Project will not be sold or otherwise disposed of in whole or in part prior to the last principal maturity of the 1983 Bonds;

(iv) With respect to investment of any 1983 Bond proceeds, as such term is defined in Section 103 of the Code, reference is hereby made to the covenants contained in the following paragraphs of this Section 12.

(C) The District shall at all times do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary or desirable in order to assure that interest paid by the District on the 1983 Bonds shall, for the purposes of Federal income taxation, be exempt from income taxation under any valid provision of law.

(D) The District shall not permit at any time or times any of the proceeds of the 1983 Bonds or other funds of the District to be used directly or indirectly to acquire any securities or obligations the acquisition of which would cause any such 1983 Bond to be an "arbitrage bond" as defined in subsection (c) (2) of Section 103 of the Code as then in effect and to be subject to treatment under subsection (c) (1) of said Section as an obligation not described in subsection (a) (1) of said Section, unless, under any valid provision of law hereafter enacted, the interest paid by the District on the 1983 Bonds shall be excludable from the gross income of a recipient thereof for Federal income tax purposes without regard to compliance with the provisions of subsection (c) of Section 103 of the Code.

(E) In order to assure compliance with this Section, thereby better securing and protecting the 1983 Bonds and the District, the District from the date of adoption of this Resolution covenants that it shall not purchase any obligation or invest or direct the Treasurer or Depository Bank to, and the Treasurer and Depository Bank shall not, invest the proceeds of the 1983 Bonds, or moneys in the aforesaid Funds, in any obligations that produce a yield in excess of such applicable maximum yield as may be permitted by the Code.

(F) The District further covenants that prior to the issuance of the 1983 Bonds and as a condition precedent to such issuance the District shall certify by issuance of a certificate of an authorized officer of the District having responsibility,

together with other officers of the District, for issuing the 1983 Bonds, the reasonable expectations, facts and estimates required by Section 1.103-13 of the proposed Income Tax Regulations promulgated under Section 103 of the Code.

SECTION 13

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

SECTION 14

REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 15

WHEN RESOLUTION EFFECTIVE

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, approval and attestation as provided by law.

Gentlemen:

We have examined certified copies of pertinent proceedings of the Montgomery County Water District Number One, Montgomery County, Kentucky (the "District"), precedent to and in connection with the authorization and issuance by the District of its "Waterworks System Revenue Bonds, Series of 1983," in the principal amount of \$431,000, in the form of a single fully registered bond, of even date herewith, bearing interest at five percent (5%) per annum (payable on January 1 and July 1 of each year) and maturing as to principal on January 1 of each year as shown in the following schedule:

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provided, however, that principal installments of said fully registered bond maturing on and after January 1, 1994, are subject to prepayment at the option of the District on any interest payment date on or after January 1, 1993, subject to notice and other conditions set forth in the bond-authorizing Resolution of the District, and at par. It is our opinion that said bond issue and said fully registered bond have been authorized in conformity with the Constitution and applicable laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, particular reference being made to Chapter 74 and Sections 96.350 to 96.510, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, now in full force and effect.

Based upon our examination of the foregoing evidence, it is our opinion that said bond issue in the amount of \$431,000 is legally binding upon the District according to the import thereof, and that said issue, together with bonds ranking on a parity therewith which may hereafter be issued and outstanding from time to time under the restrictions and conditions set forth in said proceedings, will be payable only from and secured by a pledge of a fixed portion of the income and revenues to be derived from the operation of the District's municipal waterworks system, which fixed portion, according to the terms of said bond-authorizing Resolution, shall be sufficient to pay the maturing principal of and interest on said issue of bonds and any such outstanding parity bonds, all <u>subject</u>, <u>however</u>, to the prior and superior pledges, liens and rights securing the District's outstanding Waterworks System Revenue Bonds dated June 1, 1960.

It is our further opinion that said issue of bonds in the amount of \$431,000 is exempt from all present Kentucky ad valorem taxes, and interest thereon is exempt from present Federal and Kentucky income taxes; provided, however, if any bonds of said issue are acquired by the Federal government, or any agency thereof, and sold on an insured basis from the Agricultural Credit Insurance Fund or the Rural Development Insurance Fund, as provided in the last sentence of Section 306(a)(l) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act (7 U.S.C. 1926(a)(l)) and in Section 309A(h) of said Act (7 U.S.C. 1929a(h)), respectively, no opinion is expressed as to the exemption from Federal and Kentucky income taxation of interest derived in respect of said issue of bonds.
