
Question 1.

Refer to pages 17 and 18 of the Direct Testimony of Nancy Brockway ("Brockway Testimony"), which indicates that Louisville Gas and Electric Company's estimated low-income usage level is contrary to much other data. Provide the data on which AARP is relying which shows usage patterns of low-income customers.

Response 1:

Published reports and analyses consistently show that low-income utility customers on average have lower usage than non-low-income customers. Examples of such reports are listed below. Ms. Brockway did not review any particular study in the preparation of her testimony.
