

MOTION OF  
NOLIN RURAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE CORPORATION  
TO ACCEPT A REVISED DATA RESPONSE AND  
FOR APPROVAL OF TARIFF SHEET CORRECTIONS

Nolin Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (“Nolin”) respectfully requests that the Commission accept the filing of a revised data response in this proceeding and to issue an Order approving an increase in the rate for certain security lighting contained in Nolin’s tariff, Sheet No. 28 for Schedule 5 – Security Lights. In support of this Motion, Nolin states as follows:

On August 29, 2010, the Commission approved a monthly rate of \$34.17 for security lights described as Acorn Contemporary Type 400 Watt HPS (“400 Watt HPS”) and a monthly rate of \$32.73 for a security light described as Santa Rosa Contemporary Type 150 Watt HPS (“150 Watt HPS”). Through an inadvertent oversight, these new security light rates were not included in the tariff sheet information filed with the Commission on December 9, 2010 and December 15, 2010.<sup>1</sup> Consequently, when the Commission issued its January 14, 2011 Order in this proceeding, the tariff sheets attached to that Order did not include these new security light rates. However, when Nolin filed its new tariff sheets pursuant to the January 14, 2011 Order, it


light rates. However, when Nolin filed its new tariff sheets pursuant to the January 14, 2011 Order, it included the 400 Watt HPS and the 150 Watt HPS security lights and listed the rates approved on August 29, 2010.<sup>2</sup>

Attached to this Motion are two copies of Sheet No. 28 for Schedule 5 – Security Lights. The first copy shows the proposed changes in rates by cross-out and italicized inserts. The second copy is a clean version of the same tariff sheet. The increase in the rates for the 400 Watt HPS and 150 Watt HPS security lights reflects a 3.95 percent increase, which is the overall multiplier utilized to determine the increase for security lights.<sup>3</sup> Nolin believes the application of this percentage for the 400 Watt HPS and 150 Watt HPS rates is consistent with the approach applied to all its other security light rates.

WHEREFORE, Nolin respectfully requests that the Commission accept the attached tariff sheets included with this Motion as a revision to the responses to Items 3 and 4 of the December 15, 2010 filing. Nolin also respectfully requests that the Commission issue an Order that approves the new rates for the 400 Watt HPS and 150 Watt HPS security lights.
