Course Title: Northeast Regional Meeting

Location: Ponderosa Steak House, Morehead, Kentucky

Date: July 13, 2010

#### **Learning Objectives:**

The objective of this session will be to show operators, managers, and decision makers methods of dealing with common problems encountered in the operation of a water system.

Session: Common Problems Encountered by a Water System

Presenter: Jeff Lee, Kentucky Rural Water Association

Water systems encounter a variety of problems that must be dealt with on a daily basis. The operation of a water system involves continuous monitoring of the treatment facilities, the chemical feed, analysis equipment, and the distribution network. Every operator and manager of a water system needs to develop troubleshooting skills in order to overcome the problems in a safe and efficient manner. This session will be used to provide a group discussion of problem-solving techniques and case histories.

## Biography – Jeff Lee, Kentucky Rural Water Association

Jeff Lee joined the Kentucky Rural Water Association staff in December 1996, as a Circuit Rider. He has several years of experience working with surface water, water distribution, waste-water collection systems, and backflow prevention.

In 1988, Jeff began his career as a Water Treatment Operator with Georgetown Municipal Utilities, where he acquired Class III-A and Class III-D Operator Licenses. He also obtained a Class III Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator License while working for Wilmore. In June 1995, Mr. Lee was promoted to Water and Wastewater Supervisor and also gained certifications in backflow prevention and meter testing. Jeff also oversaw, under contract, the water and wastewater operations for the City of Stamping Ground, KY, and worked part-time as an operator at the Beechfork Water Commission Treatment Plant in Powell County, KY.

Jeff holds a Class IV-A, a Class IV-D Operator Licenses (1996) He also has specialized training in blower maintenance lift station trouble shooting, meter testing, blackflow prevention, and confined space. He has completed correspondence courses through the University of Sacramento and has attended classes at the University of Kentucky Community College in Lexington, KY.

Session: Securing Hydrants in a Distribution System

Presenter: Corey Harper, SHK Enterprises, Inc.

Homeland Security is concerned about the potential threats and vulnerabilities in water systems. Water experts nationwide agree the most vulnerable portion of our domestic water supply is the water distribution system. They further agree that fire hydrants represent the most accessible point in that distribution system. This session will focus on methods and devices to protect hydrants from backflow contamination and tampering.

**Instructor Bio:** Corey Harper is one of the co-owners of SHK Enterprises. SHK is a company specializing in assisting utilities as a water treatment specialist and chemical supplier. Corey has been involved with the water industry since the time of his infancy as he would accompany his father who worked at a water treatment facility. Corey has assisted many water systems with the setup and use of various treatment chemicals. He has presented instruction at numerous training events for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Operators Association, the Kentucky Rural Water Association, AWWA and other water industry association meetings.
