
Through this letter the Office of Attorney General advises that it does not seek an order of procedure and does not have any requests for information to the applicant or comments upon the application pending in Kentucky Public Service Commission Case No. 2012-00040. While the Attorney General reserves the right to fully participate in any proceedings the Commission may hold, he provides notice that he has no objection to the submission of the application for a decision based upon the existing record.

With regard to the 1 February 2012 Tariff Filing by the Villas of Woodson Bend Sewer System which includes a request for the establishment of a \$75.00 connection inspection fee as a special non-recurring charge, it is the understanding of this Office that the fee will apply prospectively, to customers added to the system following the establishment of the charge. Otherwise stated: Current customers will not be assessed the \$75.00 fee. The Attorney General does not plan to file a request for the establishment of a docket for the tariff filing.
