In Re: PSC v. Tompkinsville Natural Gas System, your Case No. 2012-00362

Dear Ms. Honaker:

In order to update you with regard to the progress of the City of Tompkinsville and its gas system, I would like to advise you of the following:

1. All excess flow valves have arrived and should be installed no later than the close of business, 12/18/12;
2. An eight inch Dixon seven day recorder, chart recorder device as requested, was ordered at 1:00 P.M., on Tuesday, 12/11/12, with a one week lead time having the purchase order number of 968097. As soon as it is installed, I will advise you in writing;
3. Documentation for leaks is being completed by Jason Warren of Martin Contracting, Inc. and should be completed and submitted to you no later than the close of business, Friday, the 21st of December, 2012;
4. Jason Warren of Martin Contracting is currently the on call person for a gas system issue and it is within his discretion as to who to call to maintain the system, due to the circumstances surrounding the issue, subject to a City of Tompkinsville employee being properly trained and appointed for the weekend on call issues;
5. The City of Tompkinsville, at its last meeting, wherein the Settlement Agreement was approved, unanimously voted to appoint Shawn Martin of Martin Contracting as our gas system supervisor pending a search to hire a permanent gas system supervisor;
6. Further, four main inline valves have been replaced, consisting of three 2 inch valves and one 3 inch valve, those valves being previously inoperable.
