APPLICATION OF OWEN ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE CORPORATION FOR REVISIONS TO ITS METER READING TARIFF TO ACCOMMODATE MANUAL METER READING CHARGES IN INSTANCES WHERE ITS ADVANCED METERING INFRASTRUCTURE IS PROHIBITED FROM BEING UTILIZED FOR ITS INTENDED PURPOSE

<u>APPLICATION</u>

Owen Electric Cooperative Corporation, hereinafter called the "APPLICANT", respectfully advises the Commission that:

- APPLICANT is engaged in the sale of electric power over its approximately 4,500 miles of line at retail rates to its approximately 57,500 meters in Boone, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Grant, Kenton, Owen, Pendleton and Scott Counties, Kentucky.
- The address of APPLICANT is 8205 Hwy 127 N., P O Box 400, Owen, Kentucky 40359-0400 and its Articles of Consolidation are on file with the Commission in Case No. 2008-00154, styled "ADJUSTMENT OF RATES OF OWEN ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE CORPORATION".
- 3. This Application is for the purpose of requesting approval of revisions to its Meter Reading Tariff in accordance with the terms set forth in the proposed tariff filed herewith as "Exhibit A".
- 4. The purpose of this proposed tariff is to provide reimbursement to Owen in those situations where it is prohibited from using meters associated with its advanced metering infrastructure to remotely read the meters for monthly billing purposes. A detailed discussion is contained in "Exhibit B".

- 5. Exhibit C provides a justification for the proposed rate that Owen is seeking.
- 6. Exhibit A contains the proposed tariff that Owen is requesting in this application.

WHEREFORE, the APPLICANT now moves the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to grant approval for this proposed revision to its meter reading tariff applicable to Applicant's members as outlined in the tariff attached hereto as "Exhibit A".

PREPARED TESTIMONY OF JAMES R. ADKINS

- 1Q. Please state your name and business address.
- 1R I am James R. Adkins and business address is 1041 Chasewood Way, Lexington, KY 40513-1731.
- 2Q. Have you ever appeared as witness before this Commission?
- 2R. I have appeared as witness before this Commission many times since 1978.
- 3Q. What has been your role in the preparation of this application?
- 3R I provided assistance to Owen in the development of the proposed rate and the tariff.
- 4Q. What is the purpose of this tariff?
- 4R. Several members of Owen Electric have stated that they do not wish to be metered for electric service using Owen Electric's advanced metering infrastructure. Because of this fact, these members will have to have their electric meters manually read by a service employee. This Owen Electric service employee will need to make a trip to the member premises and take a manual reading from their meter.

5Q. Why do some members not want Owen Electric to meter their monthly usage

through its advance metering infrastructure?

- 5R. Some members have a fear of these types of meters because of medical, privacy, or personal reasons.
- 6Q. Why does Owen Electric feel that a tariff is needed in this situation and what is the basis for the proposed rates contained in this tariff?
- 6R. Owen Electric feels that a tariff is needed in this situation for the purpose of billing these members for the additional costs that will be incurred to manually read their meters. Owen Electric feels that this additional cost should not be borne by its other members and should be borne by those members who cause the cost to be incurred. The proposed rate is based on the current wage rate for the type of employee who will perform this service. In addition to the wage rate, we have factored in the employee average cost of benefits and the average hourly rate for the use of a vehicle that will be utilized to read these meters. Finally, Owen Electric estimates that most of these manual reading of these meters will take approximately one half hour. Exhibit C provides the details on this rate development.
- 7Q. Does this conclude your testimony?
- 7R. Yes, this concludes my testimony.
