Aquatic Weed Herbicide Safety, Technology

Aquatic herbicides are chemicals used to kill aquatic plants or severely interrupt their growth. About 200 herbicides are registered by the EPA for use in the United States, but only six are labeled for use in aquaculture sites. It is important that aquaculturists continue to use these registered herbicides in a safe and effective manner. SRAC Publication No. 361, "Aquatic Weed Management: Herbicides," discusses herbicide selection and dosage calculations. SRAC Publication No. 360, "Aquatic Weed Management: Control Methods," contains information on methods of controlling undesirable weeds in fish ponds.

Herbicide safety

Restricted-use pesticides
Herbicides with a high potential for damaging the environment require special handling. Those who use them must be specially trained. These products are classified as restricted-use pesticides and can be purchased and applied only by licensed, certified applicators or persons working under their direct supervision. Fortunately, most aquatic herbi-

cides are not restricted-use pesticides. If you use aquatic herbicides, read the label carefully and follow the directions. Make sure you are receiving proper training.

Preventing exposure
It is very important to read the label safety data sheet steps a handler should follow to prevent exposure to aquatic herbicides. Understand the label before using it.

The main types are oral, in contact with the skin, and eye protection. Oral exposure is not a concern before eating, accidentally getting into the mouth. Sure is often a concern. Herbicides in ponds breathing dust herbicides will protect eye protection. Eye protection is usually the eyes with or handling by eye protection.

As for Yarmuth, "while he's disappointed that she didn't make this race ... he's confident Kentucky Democrats will have a strong candidate against Senator McConnell, who is the least popular senator in the country," George said.

Attention will now turn to another possible candidate: Kentucky Secretary of State Alison Lundergan Grimes.

Lynn Sowards Zellen, spokeswoman

an for Grimes, said Wednesday evening that the secretary did not have a comment on Judd's announcement. "Secretary Grimes has been focused on her legislative agenda," Zellen said.

Other Democrats have either ruled out a race or shown no interest in it, including Yarmuth, Gov. Steve Beshear, Lt. Gov. Jerry Abramson, Attorney General Jack Conway, and former Rep. Ben Chandler, D-6th District.

Former Lt. Gov. Dan Mongiardo, who lost two close races for U.S. Senate (in 2004 to Republican Jim Bunning and in 2010 to Conway) said he is not interested in taking on McConnell.
