ORDER REGARDING REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

On July 8, 2013, Duo County Telephone Cooperative Corporation, Inc. ("Duo County") moved pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, that certain materials filed with the Commission be afforded confidential treatment and not be placed in the public record subject to public inspection.

In support of its Petition for Confidential Treatment, Duo County states that the information it is requesting to be held confidential is contained in its Application and is more particularly described as Exhibit 6, consisting of data related to revenue changes due to adjustment of terminating access rates pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission's Order dated November 18, 2011.

Having carefully considered the petition and the materials at issue, the Commission finds that:

1. The materials for which Duo County seeks confidential treatment meet the criteria for confidential treatment and are exempted from public disclosure pursuant to KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13.

2. The materials for which Duo County seeks confidential treatment should not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for a five-year period of time from the date of this Order, or until further Order of this Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Duo County's Petition for Confidential Treatment is hereby granted. The materials for which Duo County seeks confidential treatment shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for a five-year period of time from the date of this Order, or until further Order of this Commission. Use of the materials in question in this proceeding shall be in compliance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).

2. Duo County shall inform the Commission if the materials in question become publicly available or no longer qualify for confidential treatment.

3. If a non-party to this proceeding requests to inspect materials granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the materials have been granted confidential treatment has not run, Duo County shall have 20 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the materials still fall within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If Duo County is unable to make such demonstration, the requested materials shall be made available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.

4. The Commission shall not make the requested materials available for inspection for 20 days following an Order finding that the materials no longer qualify for confidential treatment in order to allow Duo County to seek a remedy afforded by law.
