ORDER

On February 27, 2014, an informal conference was held in this matter. In the course of the conference, the parties agreed to reassess the request for service from the complainant, Frank McAninch, (“Complainant”) and agreed to hold the case in abeyance pending the possible resolution of the issues complained of herein.¹ On April 7, 2014, Taylor County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation (“Taylor RECC”) sent a letter, which the Commission will treat as a motion, to the Commission in which it stated that the parties have met to discuss Complainant’s service request and that Taylor RECC is currently awaiting Complainant’s final approval to proceed. Accordingly, Taylor RECC requests this matter be continued for 30 days.


The Commission, having considered Taylor RECC’s motion, finds that good cause exists to hold this matter in abeyance for a period of 30 days from the date of Taylor RECC’s request.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:
