**TAYLOR COUNTY RURAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE CORPORATION'S
RESPONSE TO COMMISSION ORDER**

Taylor County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation ("Taylor RECC"), acting by counsel, makes the following Response to the Commission's Order entered herein on April 29, 2014:

1. As Taylor RECC has advised the Commission by April 2, 2014 correspondence to staff attorney Jonathan Beyer, Taylor RECC's E&O Manager, Mike Skaggs, by way of immediate follow-up to discussions held at the February 27th informal conference conducted herein, met with Mr. McAninch at the site on March 6th, at which time they discussed extended service to the Mcaninch kiln via a "non sawmill" tariff. The specifics of that discussion, and the agreements reached between Skaggs and McAninch, are set out in a March 10, 2014 memo from Skaggs to McAninch which was

furnished with counsel's April 2, 2014 correspondence to the staff attorney, and an additional copy of which is attached hereto.

2. The understanding reached between Skaggs and McAninch on March 6th was that McAninch would make a final determination as to the nature of the upgraded facilities which he intended to put in place, and Taylor RECC would then build out a service installation to match McAninch's installed facilities. No particular timeline was set as between Skaggs and McAninch for the forthcoming activity on the part of McAninch, which would include the installation and inspection of McAninch's revised/upgraded facilities.


3. On the afternoon of May 6, 2014, McAninch telephoned Skaggs to advise that McAninch had completed the installation and inspection of his desired components, and that McAninch was thus ready for Taylor RECC to build out service to the new installation. Taylor County will thus, on May 7th or May 8th, dispatch a representative to the McAninch property to verify the nature of the necessary extended service, and that inspection will presumably result in the issuance of a work order which will be undertaken as soon as possible, and no later than early in the week of May 12th.

4. Assuming that this matter progresses as it appears it will, Taylor RECC will report further to the Commission immediately upon completion of the project and the energizing of McAninch's additional installation.

WHEREFORE, Taylor RECC requests that this be accepted as its formal Response to the Commission's April 29, 2014 Order, that the parties be permitted to follow up upon extension of service to Mr. McAninch, and to report further to the Commission upon completion of same.

Frank,

Following up on our on-site meeting March 6th, below are Taylor County RECC(TCRECC) requirements in order to provide service to your kiln via a 'non sawmill' tariff. Per discussions at our recent PSC visit, we do need to concentrate on the kiln specifically.

As discussed at our March 6th on-site meeting, TCRECC will build its facilities to match facilities installed by you. Therefore, if the existing single phase main remains in the kiln, and a single phase meter base is added, then a single phase line would be applicable. However, if a three phase main and meter base(per your request of a 400a 120/240v 3phase service) were installed at the kiln, then a three phase line would be applicable.


As discussed, regardless of which avenue you chose, your facilities would need to be in place and an inspection obtained and passed on to TCRECC – the inspectors do call in inspection information but it would be a good idea for you to give our Engineering Department a call as well to advise that the inspection has taken place. Upon receipt of the inspection and verification that installation is as agreed upon, then job would be released to our construction department.

Upon building of the job, TCRECC would place the meter and the transformer(s) would be energized. At this point, minimum billing would be in force if applicable - monthly charge is based on installed transformer capacity, in your case 45kva if 3phase option is chosen.

So, after making your decision, advise TCRECC as such and we'll finalize required job paperwork etcetera. Additionally, we'll have another conversation and/or on-site meeting to verify that we are on the same page and can indeed move forward.

Upon reviewing my notes related to our March 7th phone discussion, I think you'll find that the above requirements may provide a solution to this issue.
