Miller Gas Company has been supplying gas to a rural area called Richardsville for the last few years. This is gas that is pumped into the gas lines that supply these homes.

The Miller Gas Company has sent out a letter that was received today that they are planning to discontinue this service as soon as they can get your approval. They are assuming to have this approval by mid-September.

The options they have listed on their letter is to convert to bottled gas, which would be terrific for Miller so they can get paid for leases on tanks and also money for tanks of gas; or convert to all electric for your home.
