Mr. Derouen:

I am writing in response to the meeting that we had on Tuesday April 9, 2014. Before I begin I want to thank you for the opportunity to meet with you and your staff regarding the Rt. 504 gas line so I could respond to your questions.

As stated, at the meeting, I was contacted by Rep. Rocky Adkins and told that the shut off date for the gas line has been moved to May 1, 2014 due to weather conditions. I have already constructed a burn pipe to dispose of the gas once it is disconnected on May 1, 2014. The gas line will be shut off on May 1 and I will immediately begin disconnecting the existing gas line and moving it to the oil property and on property that I personally own on Rt. 504. I hope this satisfies the commission and puts this issue to an end. Like I said at the meeting I have no desire to be considered a utility.


I formally request that I be allowed to run a new gas line based upon the PSC's Guidelines to two mobile homes that I own and were placed in service as rental units. The mobile homes are located approximately 1 mile west of the oil property on Rt. 504. I will need to run the line on the following land owners property and plan to offer them free gas service in return for an easement on the properties. The individuals are Miriam Andrews, who I referred to as the Conley family, Virgil Flannery, Jamie Maggard, and Alan Harper. The Conley family have 1 home, Virgil Flannery has one mobile home, Jamie Maggard has two homes, Alan Harper has two homes, and I have two mobile homes.

I have discussed this with the identified landowners and they have agreed to help pay for the purchase and installation of the line running from the oil wells to my mobile homes and they would follow guidelines in running the line and connecting it to their homes. Any payments of money is for the purchase of pipe, fittings, and installation of the pipe and not for gas. This is a one time contribution and there will never be any charges in the future. In addition, legal documents will be drawn up and signed stating the arrangement, identifying all participants as joint owners of the new line, and guaranteeing future

service as long as the wells operate even when sold in the future. All this is based upon the final cost of the line and its feasibility. If for some reason we are not able to construct the new line and I am not able to get gas to my two mobile homes, I formally request that Miriam Andrews, the Conley Family, be allowed to run gas pipe to her home based upon the PSC's gas line guidelines. Her home was the home of the landowner at the time the wells were drilled and placed in service. She really needs this gas and I would rather see her have it than just burn it off. In the time needed to construct this proposed new line the gas will be disposed of in the burn pipe that I constructed on the oil property.

I thank you for the considerate way you agency has handled this issue and hope that the Commission considers my proposal. In addition, I request that the PSC send me a copy of their guidelines so the new line may be properly installed if approved.
