ATTORNEY GENERAL'S RESPONSE TO MOTION
TO RESCHEDULE HEARING

Comes now the Intervenor, the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by and through his Office of Rate Intervention, and submits this Response to Motion of City of Hunters Hollow and City of Hillview to Reschedule Hearing.

Currently, the Hearing in the above captioned case is scheduled to take place on March 18, 2015. Counsel for City of Hunters Hollow and City of Hillview has requested by Motion that the Commission reschedule the Hearing for a date after March 19, 2015. The Attorney General does not object to Counsel's request, such that objection is withheld limited to rescheduling the Hearing for a new date on or before March 27, 2015. This provides the Commission with one additional week in which a Hearing may be held. For any date after March 27, 2015, the Attorney General must object to a rescheduled Hearing.

As a basis for the objection, the Attorney General states that his Office of Rate Intervention, including counsel of record in this matter, carries an extremely voluminous caseload. Following March 27, 2015, the Commission has scheduled multiple Hearings in at least three (3) proceedings in which the Attorney General is a key party. Further, these hearings are scheduled to last nearly a week and will require at least ten (10) days of pre-trial preparation. The potential rate increase from the Hearings scheduled for the weeks following March 27, 2015

is approximately \$270 Million. Those Hearings are in addition to the multitude of other priority cases the Attorney General is currently a party to before the Commission.

Therefore, rescheduling the Hearing in the above captioned matter for any date following March 27, 2015 would be nearly impossible for counsel for the Attorney General, requiring the Office of Rate Intervention to provide less than preferred resources to either the Hearing in this case, or one of his many other cases. As such, the attorney General would be prejudiced by a hearing rescheduled for any date following March 27, 2015.


