COMMISSION STAFF'S SECOND REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

TO EAST KENTUCKY POWER COOPERATIVE INC.,

CUMBERLAND VALLEY ELECTRIC, FARMERS RURAL ELECTRIC

COOPERATIVE CORPORATION AND OWEN ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC.

East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. ("EKPC"), Cumberland Valley Electric ("Cumberland Valley"), Farmers Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation ("Farmers RECC"), and Owen Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Owen Electric"), pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, are to file with the Commission the original and six copies of the following information, with a copy to all parties of record. The information requested herein is due on or before November 12, 2015. Responses to requests for information shall be appropriately bound, tabbed and indexed. Each response shall include the name of the witness responsible for responding to the guestions related to the information provided.

Each response shall be answered under oath or, for representatives of a public or private corporation or a partnership or association or a governmental agency, be accompanied by a signed certification of the preparer or person supervising the

preparation of the response on behalf of the entity that the response is true and accurate to the best of that person's knowledge, information, and belief formed after a reasonable inquiry.

Any party shall make timely amendment to any prior response if it obtains information which indicates that the response was incorrect when made or, though correct when made, is now incorrect in any material respect. For any request to which any party fails or refuses to furnish all or part of the requested information, the party shall provide a written explanation of the specific grounds for its failure to completely and precisely respond.

Careful attention should be given to copied material to ensure that it is legible. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request. When filling a document containing personal information, EKPC shall, in accordance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 4(10), encrypt or redact the document so that personal information cannot be read.

- Refer to the Direct Testimony of Isaac S. Scott ("Scott Direct Testimony"),
 and the Addendum to the August 2014 monthly Environmental Surcharge Report.
 Clarify whether the Scott Direct Testimony, pages 8 through 10, and the Addendum to
 the August 2014 Environmental Surcharge Report describe the same error or different
 errors. Provide a more complete description of the error or errors.
- 2. Refer to the response to Staff's First Request for Information ("Staff's First Request"), Item1, Summary of Net Revenue Requirement E(m). For the expense months of January through July 2014, explain why the amounts listed in the column

titled "Monthly Difference due to Spur 1 v. 2 Proj 03330 Allocation" were not included with the adjustment made to the August 2014 monthly environmental surcharge filing.

- 3. This question is addressed to Cumberland Valley. Refer to the response to Staff's First Request, Item 8. The response indicates the billing period of May 2015 was used for calculating the residential bill impact. The supporting schedules indicate that the billing factors used in the residential bill impact calculation were for March 2015. Explain this discrepancy. Provide a revised residential bill impact calculation if required.
- 4. This question is addressed to Farmers RECC and Owen Electric. Refer to your respective responses to Staff's First Request, Item 2. For comparison purposes, provide the residential bill impact calculation using a six-month amortization period.
