MARTIN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT'S RESPONSE TO  
COMMISSION STAFF'S THIRD REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

1. Refer to Martin County's letter dated August 6, 2015.<sup>1</sup> The letter states that "[d]eposits for 6" and 8" meters will be \$45.00 per customer." Explain how Martin County determined the amount for the 6-inch and 8-inch meter deposits.

**Response:** The 6" and 8" meter class was not addressed in previous filings because the District intends to remove those meter classes from the tariff. The District has never had a customer request the need for either class of meter. A new tariff sheet reflecting this change will be filed with the Tariff Branch immediately following the Commission's Final Order in this case.

2. Martin County has proposed to increase the deposits for all meters from 5/8-inch through 4-inch to a range from \$90.00 to \$700.00.

a. Explain why corresponding increases for the 6-inch and 8-inch meters were not proposed.

b. Explain why the proposed \$45.00 deposit for the 6-inch and 8-inch meters is reasonable.

**Response:** By removing the 6" and 8" meter class the response to questions 2(a) and 2(b) becomes moot.

3. Confirm that Martin County does not intend to increase the 6-inch and 8-inch meter deposits. If Martin County intends to increase the deposits, state the new deposit amount and provide support for the revised amount.

**Response:** The District does not intend to increase the 6" and 8" meter deposits but will instead remove the 6" and 8" class meters.
