

As stated in the application filed in this case:

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 15(e) the project will be financed by RUS financing and subject to their specifications for OSP and customer premise cable. The initial cost of the FTTH plant is \$2.4M. End user electronic equipment for each premise converted will be approximately \$400, inclusive of labor. Funding for customer premise equipment will be from a combination of RUS loans, general funds, and, if applicable, end user installation fees.

NCTC plans to finance all proposed construction, engineering and electronics using the traditional RUS loan (Tennessee V-545), which was approved on September 11, 2011.

Please supplement that response to include the following information:

The term of the loan is from the date of borrowing through December 31, 2025. Interest will be set at rates determined pursuant to section 6(b) of the Federal Financing Bank Act (12 U.S.C. 2285(b)) and the FFB Lending Policy.

Accordingly, the repayment schedule will be dependent on 1) the timing and size of the withdrawals; 2) interest in effect at the time of the withdrawal; and 3) the length of time the company uses to repay the loan.
