REQUEST:

Provide the following information for the existing East Bend Landfill:

- a. Original cost;
- b. Accumulated depreciation;
- c. Year in service;
- d. Depreciable life; and
- e. Capacity in terms of tons or cubic yards.

RESPONSE:

- a. The original cost of Duke Energy Kentucky's initial 69% share is at least \$5.4 million, based upon Company records found to date. Due to the manual nature of records prior to 2000, it is difficult to identify costs specific to the East Bend Landfill, and all of its cells prior to that time. Duke Energy Kentucky does not have an original cost for the DP&L share. Duke Energy Kentucky only recently acquired 100% interest in the East Bend Generating Station for a total of \$12.4 million.
- b. The accumulated depreciation on the \$5.4 million is approximately \$1.6 million based upon our records. Duke Energy Kentucky does not have an accumulated depreciation for the DP&L share.
