Session Topic: Pipeline Materials, Pipe Repair, Coupling, and Restraining Methods for Drinking Water Mains Presenters: Mike Rullo, Smith-Blair, Inc.

This session will cover basics concerning pressurized pipelines. Topics covered will include choosing the proper pipe for the specific water application, pipe size, pipe materials, and how to choose the best pipe for the task. Also covered will be topics dealing with pipe coupling types and their usage, restraining pressurized water mains, repairing pressurized water mains, valve insertions, tapping, etc. The instructor will provide a visual display to help explain materials being covered in the session.

Session Topic: Revised Total Coliform Rule

Presenters: Randall Kelley and Clem Wethington, Kentucky Rural Water Association

This session will cover the Revised Total Coliform Rule. Recently drinking water utilities in Kentucky received a letter from KDOW concerning the January 1, 2016 compliance date for the Revised Total Coliform Rule. This session will talk about that letter, what it means for drinking water utilities and compliance with the RTCR. Additional discussion will cover the RTCR more generally, going over the rule, Level 1 and Level 2 Assessments, new reporting requirements and changes the RTCR will be making in the CCR.

Speaker Bios

Randall Kelley has been with Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) since January, 2006. Since joining KRWA, Randall has held the positions of Wastewater Circuit Rider, ARRA Circuit Rider and Training Specialist.
