Session 1: Operator Responsibilities

Presenter: Steve Capps, Kentucky Rural Water Association

The position of operator requires highly ethical behavior as operators often do not have someone looking over their shoulder watching their every move. This session will cover responsibilities and ethics with respect to properly conducting the duties of an operator and the possible consequences of failing to operate in an ethical manor.

Session 2: Asset Management

Presenter: Steve Capps, Kentucky Rural Water Association

Asset management is a crucial practice for drinking water and wastewater utilities. This session will cover the basics for asset management and creating asset management plans including such things as what needs to be included in the plan, the importance of the plan, and why it needs to be followed in the long term. Examples of what can happen when utilities fail at asset management will also be addressed.

Session 3: Valve Maintenance for Water and Wastewater Utilities

Presenter: Tim Blanton, Kentucky Rural Water Association

Valves are perhaps the most forgotten infrastructure component in water and wastewater utilities...until you need them. It is not uncommon for valves to go years between uses. In other cases, valves at wastewater or water treatment facilities can be used on a regular basis. These two modes of usage can present different maintenance needs. This session will cover the basics of valve maintenance, the benefits of regular maintenance, and some real world comparisons of the costs of replacement vs maintenance.

Session 4: Line Location

Presenter: Tim Blanton, Kentucky Rural Water Association

This session will cover the basics of locating buried drinking water and wastewater pipelines. Topics will include methods for location, equipment used for location, and problems to watch out for. Equipment used for line locating will be demonstrated in class.

SPEAKER BIOS

Steve Capps came to Kentucky Rural Water Association in 1994 from the City of Burkesville, Kentucky where he had served as Director of Public Works for twelve (12) years. He also had experience as the Water Treatment Plant Operator and also the Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator for six (6) years. He is currently certified in water treatment, wastewater treatment and holds a certificate as a water distribution system operator. Mr. Capps served as the Wastewater Technician for the Kentucky Rural Water Association from June 1994 to June 1999. His primary duties as Wastewater Technician were to provide technical assistance and hands-on training to rural wastewater utility personnel throughout Kentucky. Mr. Capps' position with the Kentucky Rural Water Association from June 1999 to the present is that of Wastewater Trainer/Technician and Compilance. In that capacity he provides on-site technical assistance and training to small rural municipal wastewater treatment systems and rural systems in unincorporated areas.

Tim Blanton came to work for Kentucky Rurai Water Association in June, 2007 as a Circuit Rider. His many years of experience in water, wastewater, and public works began in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado. For 10 years he held various positions in billing and collections for the departments of water and solid waste. He gained knowledge of public relations, billing & collections, water system operations, metering, leak locating and repairing, welding and much more. After moving to Vermont, Tim continued his career in the water and wastewater industry for another 11 years. He served as the Public Works Manager for the Village of Derby Center before taking a position as the Regional Manager for a contract utility operations business. His responsibilities included the management and operations of 36 municipal water systems and six sewer systems. Tim holds an Associate Degree in Architecturai Structural Design.
