Application of Columbia Gas of Kentucky to Continue its Energy Efficiency

Conservation Rider and Energy Efficiency Conservation Program.

Pursuant to a Commission Staff ("Staff") Notice issued on August 23, 2016, an informal conference ("IC") was conducted on August 24, 2016. Attached is a copy of the attendance roster.

The purpose of the IC was to discuss Columbia Gas of Kentucky's ("Columbia") Demand Side Management ("DSM") program, also known as its Energy Efficiency Conservation Program. Columbia provided further clarification regarding its cost effectiveness test methodology and results and its DSM program purposes. Columbia noted that, unlike electric utility DSM programs, the purpose of its gas program is not to shave peak but to promote conservation and to offer programs its customers have come to expect due to DSM programs offered by the electric utilities that serve Columbia's service area. Staff also asked about the proposed increase in replacement cost for the Low-Income High Efficiency Furnace Replacement Program. Columbia responded that at the current maximum reimbursement level of \$2,200, the Community Action Council reported that it is unable to acquire any bids for installation, and thus Columbia is proposing to increase the furnace replacement cost to \$2,800 without no overall increase in the program.

There being no further discussion, the IC was then adjourned.
