Topic 1:

Corrosion Prevention in Water

Presenter:

Randy Bush, Thornton, Musso, and Bellemin, Inc.

This session will cover basic corrosion prevention in drinking water facilities. Topics will include corrosion inhibitors used in drinking water treatment. Attendees will learn how to determine what inhibitors will work with their water and how to determine proper feed rates. Discussion will also include how corrosion inhibitors relate to the Flint, Michigan drinking water emergency.

Topic 2:

Algae Control and the Use of Chlorine Dioxide in Water Treatment

Presenter:

Randy Bush, Thornton, Musso & Bellemin, Inc.

The control of algae within treatment plans is a problem for many utilities. This session will cover the impacts of algae on water treatment, both from a taste & odor issue as well as disinfection by-products. Also covered will be the control of algae within drinking water treatment plants, the chemical used, dosage requirements, and effects on other plant treatment processes. Discussion will include the use of chlorine dioxide as a disinfectant, its pros and cons, and its disinfection potential.

In the aftermath of the lead crisis in Flint, Michigan, corrosion control and the Lead and Copper Rule are receiving new attention from the public, the media, regulators, water utilities, and other groups. This session will provide an overview of the Lead and Copper Rule, lead and copper sampling, and how utilities manage the rule. Discussion will include corrosion control: the chemistry knowledge necessary for corrosion control, the Langelier Index and what it tells you, and how to prevent corrosion in distribution systems.

Dell holds an Associate Degree from the Elizabethtown Community College and has both a class IV Distribution license and a class IVA Treatment license.
