By order in this matter dated May 1, 2017, the Public Service Commission ("Commission") granted the joint motion of the parties for an order holding this matter in abeyance until July 20, 2017. By order dated August 1, 2017 the Commission granted the parties' request that the abeyance be extended for an additional 30 days, until August 20, 2017, with a status report due on or before August 20, 2017.

Big Rivers Electric Corporation ("Big Rivers") writes to report to the Commission that the efforts of the parties to resolve a number of issues among them, including the dispute that is the subject of this proceeding, have still not produced an agreement.
