3	II. Time Period
4	9. Big Rivers requests that the Confidential Information remain confidential
5	indefinitely because as long as the transmission system remains in place, the information should
6	be confidential for the reasons stated above. 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(2).
7	III. Conclusion
8	10. Based on the foregoing, the Confidential Information is entitled to confidential
9	protection. If the Commission disagrees that Big Rivers is entitled to confidential protection, due
10	process requires the Commission to hold an evidentiary hearing. Utility Regulatory Com'n v.
11	Kentucky Water Service Co., Inc., 642 S.W.2d 591 (Ky. App. 1982).
12	WHEREFORE, Big Rivers respectfully requests that the Commission classify and protect
13	as confidential the Confidential Information.
