Sentra Corporation, by counsel, submits a corrected motion for a

deviation, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001(22) from the customer notice

publication regulation. The motion filed on January 6th, cited 807 KAR

5:001(17) as requiring publication of the customer notice of a proposed rate

adjustment. The correct citation is 807 KAR 5:076(5)(2).

(2) Customer Notice.

(a) If a utility has twenty (20) or fewer customers, the utility shall mail a written notice to each customer no later than the date on which the application is submitted to the commission.

(b) If a utility has more than twenty (20) customers, it shall provide notice by:

1. Including notice with customer bills mailed no later than the date the application is submitted to the commission;

2. Mailing a written notice to each customer no later than the date the application is submitted to the commission:

3. Publishing notice once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a prominent manner in a newspaper of general circulation in the utility's service area, the first publication to be made no later than the date the application is submitted to the commission:

On November 17, Sentra caused to be published the corrected

customer notice in the Thompkinsville News. That notice was published for

two consecutive weeks. However, due to a misunderstanding, the

newspaper did not publish on the third week. After Sentra discovered the

error, it contacted the newspaper and requested the third publication, which

was scheduled for December 15th. This publication was not consecutive with the prior notice of November 24. Additionally, the notice published on December 15th was incorrect. As the attached email from the newspaper acknowledges, the error was its fault. Upon discovering the error, Sentra requested an additional publication of the corrected notice, which occurred on January 5, 2017. Copies of the tear sheets and affidavits of publication as well as emails from Sentra to the newspaper are attached.

Because of the failure to publish for three consecutive weeks, Sentra has not complied with the regulation. While it has published the correct notice three times, only two of those publication dates were in consecutive weeks. Based on Sentra's best efforts to arrange for consecutive week publication, the failure of the newspaper to do so is beyond its control. Despite multiple notices, no customer has requested intervention and no customer comments have been submitted.

For these reasons, Sentra requests a deviation to allow the acceptance of the notices as published.






