#### Learning Objectives:

The objective of this session is to provide useful information to attendees to help them better perform their roles as drinking water personnel and enhance the operations at their facilities.

#### Session 1: Paperwork and Recordkeeping

Most managers of water utilities have worked their way up through the ranks. They may be great operators, but often haven't had any training on the management and administration. Drinking water utilities have a bewildering array of items to keep track of in order to maintain compliance with State and Federal regulations. This two-day session will cover a variety of issues for attendees concerning drinking water compliance. Topics covered on day one will include in-depth reviews of the following:

- 2. CCRs.
- 3. PNs
- 4. Lead and Copper letters
- 5. PSC requirements
- 6. Chain of Custody

#### Session 3: Drinking Water Compliance

The training on the second day will cover compliance with a focus on drinking water rules and regulations. The session will cover current rules and upcoming changes to existing rules. In addition, proper sampling techniques will be covered. The Total Coliform Rule will be replaced with the Revised Total Coliform Rule. Included in this session will be a discussion of the changes brought about by the RTCR and how they will affect operations and recordkeeping. This session will also include a primer on the Lead and Copper Rule and potential changes that EPA may be considering to the rule. Topics for the day will include in-depth reviews of the following:

- 1. Lead and Copper Rule
- 2. Revised Total Coliform Rule
- 3. Stage 2 Disinfection By-Product Rule
- 4. Flushing and Distribution System Maintenance
- 5. Tank inspections
- 6. Sampling protocols and SOPs.
