OHOP states of the set prov OHOP states of the set of Air Force: Fighter jet makes, emergency landing at base

DAYTON - An Air Force base spokesman says an F-16C fighter jet had to make an emergency landing in Ohio because of a hydraulic leak.

The Dayton Daily News reports the jet landed safely Tuesday at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton. Base spokesman Bryan Ripple told the newspaper that the jet was one of two from the Toledo-based 180th Fighter Wing that landed at the base shortly after 10 a.m.

Firefighters were standing by near the main runway as a precaution when the jet landed. Ripple said that is the normal procedure for any inflight emergency declared by a pilot.

The fighter wing is a unit of the Ohio Air National Guard.

Dayton boy, 13, dies of possible heroin overdose; dad jailed

DAYTON - Authorities say a 13year-old boy died of a suspected heroin overdose, and his father has been jailed in a previous drug-related case.

Nathan Wylie's father and another man brought the unresponsive boy to a Dayton fire station March 28 and indicated Nathan got into his father's drugs. The boy died Saturday.

Police told the Dayton Daily News on Monday they were awaiting a toxicology report and interviewing witnesses to determine what kind of drugs the boy accessed and how.

His father, 40-year-old Robert Wylie, was arrested on suspicion of child endangerment and remained jailed in connection with a December traffic stop in which he was arrested for drug possession.

Cleveland to continue police

local police agencies won't stop ongoing reform efforts in Cléveland.

U.S. District Judge Solomon Oliver Jr. said during a court hearing in January that the administration of Donald Trump cannot alter the reform plan mandated by a consent decree established in 2015. The decree was established after a U.S. Justice Department investigation found a pattern and practice of Cleveland officers using excessive force and violating people's civil rights.

A statement released Tuesday by the city of Cleveland says Mayor Frank Jackson remains committed to implementing police reforms required by the consent decree.

Sessions' March 31 memo says it's not the federal government's job to manage local police departments.

Carroll Co. sheriff accused of stealing painkillers resigns

LOUISVILLE - The Carroll County sheriff has resigned after pleading guilty to charges stemming from the theft of painkillers from a terminally ill cancer patient.

WDRB reported tat Carroll County Sheriff Jamie Kinman resigned Monday after pleading guilty to 11 charges related to the theft of painkillers.

Kinman's plea required him to enroll in a one-year rehabilitation program and resign. He was sentenced to five years of probation and could have the convictions dropped if he doesn't get into any legal trouble.

The charges spanned incidents from December to February. Kentucky State Police initially arrested the former sheriff on charges that he stole from the terminally ill patient's home while in uniform.

FBI investigates police

Habich says he can't further comment on the case.



INDIANA

Indiana lawmakers OK letting Statehouse staffers carry guns

INDIANAPOLIS - Indiana lawmakers in both chambers have voted to allow legislative employees to car-



ry guns at the Statehouse.

Under the bill by Republican Sen. Jim Tomes of Wadesville, employees of the Senate, House, Legislative Services Agency and Indiana Lobby Registration Commission may be armed. Judges, police officers and members of the Legislature can already carry deadly weapons at work.

The Senate voted 39-7 to approve changes made in the House, sending the bill to the governor's desk.

The National Rifle Associationbacked measure is part of an effort by guns rights supporters to chip away at gun laws and restrictions.

A similar bill by Tomes passed the Senate last year.
