The objective of these sessions is to provide useful information to attendees to help them better perform their roles and enhance the operations at their utilities:

Topic: Valves and Hydrants

This session will be a basic overview of valve and hydrants with a focus on maintenance and their use. Topics covered will include how valves and hydrants work, their functions in a distribution system, basic maintenance and servicing. Also covered will be how to properly install hydrants and valves, the importance of thrust blocking, and the dangers of water hammer.

Topic for Session 2 & 3: From the Ditch to the Desk: Paperwork and Recordkeeping's Role in Compliance Presenter: Randall Kelley, Kentucky Rural Water Association

Most managers of water utilities have worked their way up through the ranks and often haven't had training on the management and administration of their utility. Drinking water utilities have a bewildering array of items to keep track of in order to maintain compliance with State and Federal regulations. This session will cover some of the basics of drinking water compliance regarding MORs, CCRs, and Public Notices. Included will be the requirements, as well as common errors and sources of violations, from MORs, CCRs, and PNs.

Bio: Randall Kelley has been with Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) since January, 2006. Since joining KRWA, Randall has held the positions of Wastewater Circuit Rider, ARRA Circuit Rider and Training Specialist. Prior to joining KRWA, Randall worked for the University of Louisville at the Center for Watershed Research as a Research Biologist. He participated in numerous projects on small headwater streams, stream restorations, Tri-halomethane formation in natural waters, and numerous other projects. Randall's experience also includes working for a contractor to the USEPA in Cincinnati, Ohio as an aquatic macroinvertebrate taxonomist. Randall received a B.S. in both Biology and Environmental Science from Western Kentucky University and an M.S. in Biology from the University of Louisville.
