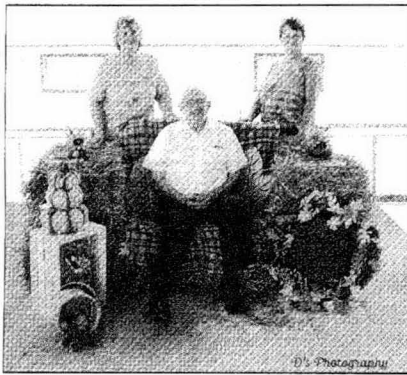

## AEP awards funds for Eastern Kentucky online learning project

INEZ — Kentucky Power President and CEO Matt Satterwhite announced Oct. 25 a \$500,000 American Electric Power Foundation grant for a virtual learning project for Eastern Kentucky students.

Satterwhite, who is a former school board member and whose wife is a teacher, said that when he first took the job as Kentucky Power president, he emailed superintendents in the 20 counties that the company serves to see what they could do to improve education.

Satterwhite said he spoke with former Lawrence County Superintendent and Kentucky School Boards Association Executive Director Mike Armstrong, who put him in contact with Kentucky Educational Development Corporation (KEDC) CEO Nancy Hutchinson, who applied for the grant for the Go Online and Learn (GOAL) project.

The GOAL project unites 36 high schools in Eastern Kentucky and assists about 22,400 students in the counties served by Kentucky Power. KEDC will administer the program, which links high schools with virtual field trips to places such as the Great Barrier reef in Australia and the 911 Tribute Museum in New York.

The program also connects Eastern Kentucky students with distinguished professors and learning institutions, such as Harvard and MIT, as well as students in other countries, all at no cost, a press release

from Kentucky Power said.

"We are both honored and excited to partner with AEP and Kentucky Power to bring innovative technology instruction to our high schools," Hutchinson said. "Preparing our students for the 21st Century is the key to helping them compete."

The grant was announced at Sheldon Clark High School in Martin County, where

President Lyndon Johnson visited in 1964 to generate support for his War on Poverty.

"The lesson of the War on Poverty is education is transformative," Satterwhite said. "Still today we hear of barriers that keep students in Eastern Kentucky from moving on to higher education and reaching their career aspirations. This grant is a major investment in our children, our communities and the future

of eastern Kentucky and it supports our long-term strategy to bring economic development and jobs to eastern Kentucky."

Satterwhite and Hutchinson challenged students to utilize the technology to learn and to learn more about what is available to them and help themselves to figure out what they ultimately want to become.

SCHS sophomore class president Braxton Hardin spoke at the announcement event, telling students that it is exciting to anticipate the ability to have the entire world at their fingertips.

Two teachers, Jason Rose and Courtney Butcher, have already received the necessary training. SCHS Principal Martha Williams said the grant will help her school reach goals she set to expand STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) opportunities.

"The American Electric Power Foundation grant will provide multiple resources to assist us in achieving this goal," Williams said. "With the declining coal industry, our community is redefining how we train the future workforce. Being one of the eastern Kentucky schools to benefit from this grant is a tremendous honor."

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
