Request of Scott Norman to Intervene in this Matter

On or about December 13, 2017, I, Scott Norman sent a letter to the Kentucky Public Service Commission commenting on the above matter. I am now requesting that I be allowed to intervene in this matter so I can provide important information to the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

I believe I have a special interest in this matter as I am a local resident and familiar with the area. I am also familiar with the rates that are currently being charged by carriers in the area and the quality of coverage and service.

AT&T in their application says that they need this tower so they can lower their costs and improve their coverage. My experience in this area is that the current coverage is excellent for both AT&T and Verizon. My phone has five bars of coverage. Also, if AT&T is placing another tower in an effort to cut costs, what kind of reduction in monthly bills should customers expect to see?

Tillman sent me a response to my letter and I noticed that they referenced Kentucky regulations on cell towers. I looked up the regulation in their letter and it became very clear that they are not following the law. In particular, they allege that they do not have a "reasonably available opportunity to collocate" because SBA does not make its tower available on reasonable terms. This makes no sense, AT&T has been

on the existing tower for over ten years. So I don't see any proof in the application that the tower is not reasonably available for collocation. They are on the tower and provide cell service in same exact area as the proposed tower. Again, I didn't see any proof in the application of any unreasonable terms and I think there should be a public hearing where AT&T proves to everyone why this tower doesn't work.

I, Scott Norman respectfully request:

1. I be allowed to intervene as a party to this matter.
2. That the Kentucky Public Service Commission hold a public hearing to discuss the specifics of this application and allow for a full public discussion and comment.
