ORDER

The Kentucky Rural Water Association (“KRWA”) applied for accreditation and approval of its Continuing Education Training for Oldham Co. Water District Commissioners held on February 13, 2018, in Lagrange, Kentucky. KRWA requests that the program be approved for six hours of continuing education credit. The program consists of six separate presentations, each one hour in length, including Utility Litigation Update, Recent Developments in Utility Regulation, Duties and Responsibilities of Board Members, and Ethics: A Practical Exercise. Attendees were provided copies of the PowerPoint slides for the presentations, which were also included with the application, and the program concluded with a question and answer session. The presenters were Damon R. Talley and Gerald Wuetcher, both of whom are members of Stoll Keenon Ogden’s Utility & Energy practice group.

Having reviewed KRWA’s application, the Commission finds that the presentations at the training program will enhance water district commissioners’ understanding of their responsibilities and duties, and therefore, the Commission conditionally accredits the Training for Oldham Co. Water District and approves it for up to six credit hours of water district management training.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The Training for Oldham Co. Water District held on February 13, 2018, in LaGrange, Kentucky is conditionally accredited and approved for a maximum of six credit hours of water district management training.

2. KRWA shall retain a record of all water district commissioners attending the accredited and approved presentations.

3. Within 30 days of this Order, KRWA shall file with the Commission:

a. A sworn statement attesting that the accredited instruction was performed;

b. A description of any changes in the presenters or the proposed curriculum that occurred after KRWA's application;

c. The name of each attending water district commissioner, his or her water district, and the number of hours that he or she attended; and

d. A copy of any written material given to water commissioners attending the presentations.

4. Upon receipt of the materials identified in Paragraph No. 3 and provided there are no material changes to the program, the Commission shall issue a final order approving and accrediting the Training Program.
