MOTION TO AMEND APPLICATION

Comes now CMTA, Inc. ("CMTA"), by counsel, and hereby requests that the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") allow CMTA to amend its Application filed in the above-styled case. As grounds for this Motion CMTA states as follows:

- 1. On June 4, 2018 CMTA filed an Application for the Commission to enter an Order declaring the provisions of KRS 278.010(3) and KRS 278.495 inapplicable to the project being performed by CMTA for the Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet ("Finance"), ("the Project").
- 2. After filing the Application, Finance identified an additional building that is now included in the Project. The Kentucky History Center (KHC) is a Finance owned building however, it is not served by the Central Utility Plant for chiller and hot water. The KHC currently has its own chillers and boilers for heating and cooling the building. These existing systems will remain unchanged as part of this project. There are (5) natural gas boilers that provide the heating

hot water to the building. These boilers are the only equipment serviced by the existing natural gas service. The existing natural gas service is provided by Columbia Gas of Kentucky.

- 3. In this project the proposed campus natural gas piping, as described in the June 4, 2018 Application, will be extended to the KHC, the piping will service the existing natural gas boilers. Finance is including the Kentucky History Center in the Project for the following three reasons; 1) the proximity to the building included in the original scope. 2) The gas piping and heating system will match the system architecture of the building associated with the main project (TCOB, SOB, Annex, CUP). 3) By providing natural gas from the CUP natural gas meter, the state will realize approximately \$40,000.00 annually in utility rate savings.
- 4. The existing KHC boilers have been and will continue to be owned and operated by Finance, for the sole purpose of providing heating hot water to the HVAC system. Domestic hot water is provided via existing electric hot water heaters.
- 5. The rent for the Kentucky History Center will remain the same as it is today. Rent is calculated pursuant to the statewide formula described in response to Item 10 of Commission Staff's First Request for Information. The Kentucky History Center rent is as follows: Office Rental Rate \$7.17 per square foot and Office Utility Rate \$3.86 per square foot. The Office Utility Rate includes janitorial services.
- 6. CMTA does not believe that adding the Kentucky History Center to the Project would create a "utility" under KRS 278.010 or a "master meter system" under KRS 278.495, and requests the Commission to so declare.
- 7. A map and drawings including the Kentucky History Center are being attached as Exhibit 1 to this Motion.

WHEREFORE, on the basis of the foregoing, CMTA respectfully requests that the Commission enter an Order:

- 1. Declaring that neither KRS 278.010 nor KRS 278.485 is applicable to the Project as amended to include the Kentucky History Center, thereby determining that Finance would not be subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission as a utility or as a master meter system operator;
 - 2. Grant CMTA's Motion to Amend the Application; and
 - 3. Granting CMTA all other additional relief to which it may appear entitled.
