Dear Ms. Sanders:
In response to your request yesterday, this letter should provide you and the Commission with additional information that I would hope would help them make their decision on our request.

The old existing building that we have been using for years is a $40 \times 60$ foot building with two (2) bay doors and is located in downtown Simpsonville, which is landlocked by city streets preventing us from ever expanding this facility in the future. It was built about 20 years ago and because of the rapid expansion of our customer base and water demand coming from new housing and industrial developments we have had to purchase more equipment and supplies, thus our need has increased for more storage.

The new structure, which we are proposing and requesting your permission for certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, will be $40 \times 80$ and have three (3) bay doors. This will be built on land owned by the water district and there is plenty of additional room for future expansions of this building if the need would arise.

As you can see the new building will be bigger and provide for future expansion, and this is a structure that is needed by the water district to store vehicles and equipment to protect from the outside elements.
