Dear Ms. Pinson:

I am in receipt of the filing deficiencies letter dated July 17, 2018 in the above referenced matter. However, I believe the letter is sent in error.

The deficiencies cited in the letter refer to KAR 5:001: Section 15 which pertains to the purchase of a franchise pursuant to KRS 278.020(3). The district is not applying to bid on a franchise but instead, is purchasing a new building in order to move its office from the current location to the proposed location and is requesting approval pursuant to KRS 278.020(1). As explained in the Application filed on behalf of the District, the District is currently renting office space in downtown Lawrenceburg for handling all billing, customer/public interactions, and other administrative matters. The purchase of the building will allow the District to own the building rather than renting, provide parking which is currently unavailable. More importantly, the District will not be borrowing funds or increasing rates to purchase the building and lots.

Based on the above as well as other facts set out in the Application, I request that the notice of deficiencies be withdrawn and the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity be granted.
