Grayson follows RUS Bulletin 183-1 for its depreciation policies and procedures. RUS requires a depreciation study to change rates outside of the minimum and maximum rates for distribution plant accounts. RUS does not include general plant items in depreciation studies. With the detail available in computer systems for general plant items, RUS allows that each individual general plant item be given a life that matches the useful life. Therefore, in each general plant account, there are assets that have different lives assigned for their estimated useful life. The updated Exhibit 3 reflects that actual depreciation accrual for the 12 months ended November 2018.
