Concerning: Order #4 not to give confidential protection for names, addresses, and county of residences on Exhibit #1. I petition the Kentucky Public Service Commission to reconsider their Order and grant protection for all information on Exhibit #1.

According to KRS278.400 I have 20 days after the Service of an Order to apply for a hearing with respect to any of the matters determined. I am requesting a hearing in the matter of Order #4 which did not grant confidential and protection for the names, address and county of residents on Exhibit #1.

As Kentucky citizen we are protected by KRS 61.878(1)(Å) which protects personal information. The names and information on the petition Exhibit #1 was intended to be used by the Kentucky Public Service Commission to aid them in making their decision to grant an audit or not. The 8300 plus names was not meant to be made public. If this information is made public and goes on the Kentucky Public Service Commission website:

- 1. It could possibility be viewed all over the world, endangering each signee's identities even more and for years.
- 2. By the Kentucky Public Service Commission not giving complete confidential protection of Exhibit #1, signee's names, addresses, and county of resident: anyone can use this information left on Exhibit #1 to get their phone numbers from the internet.
- 3. Procedures, habit, process of doing business such as signing a document or such when confidential protection is not requested does not override the protection given to Kentucky citizens according to KRS 61.878(1)(A) when confidential protection is requested from Kentucky Public Service Commission. KRS. 61.878(1)(A) "reads public records containing information of a personal nature where the public disclosure thereof would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy."
- 4. People's identities are stolen everyday on the internet. Their bank accounts are robbed, false income tax claims are filed and their lives are destroyed.
- 5. This information could be used in many ways not mentioned.

There are 8300 plus signatures and personal information on Exhibit #1 which is a lot of personal information to be made public and put on the internet endangering the signee's identities. I am not sure that every signee of the petition of Exhibit #1 realized that their information would be made public on the internet; when there was no warning statement written on each petition stating that this

information would be made public. I ask the Kentucky Public Service Commission to reconsider the Order #4 pertaining to Exhibit #1 and grant complete confidential protection for each signee's names address and county of residents. I ask the Kentucky Public Service Commission to help protect the information on Exhibit #1 which belongs to citizens of Kentucky.

If my request for the Kentucky Public Service Commission to grant complete confidential protection of 8300 plus signees' of petition on Exhibit #1 is denied. I request that extra time be given to me to comply with #6 Order or Case # 2018-00297.
