This is to give notice that the Letcher County Water & Sewer District (LCWSD), under 24 CFR Part 58, has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its project in the floodplain and wetland will have on the human environment for the WWTP for Federal Prison at Roxana Project under the Economic Development Administration and Appalachian Regional Commission Grant Programs.

The WWTP project will focus on sewer. The project will install a .500 MGD decentralized aeration package treatment plant in the community of Roxana, which will be used to support the 1216-inmate federal prison facility planned for construction by the Federal Bureau of Prison (FBoP) on a site adjacent to the WWTP. Collection lines will be installed from the prison facility to the WWTP. The plant will be constructed on a 2-acre site adjacent to the prison and collection lines will extend to the plant from the prison camp.

Schematics for the WWTP include an influent duplex submersible pumping station as well as an influent screening structure, a grit collection and dewatering system, two SBR basins, and a biosolids pump station. The decentralized aeration package treatment plant is proposed due to the rural location and mountainous terrain in the area. The project will allow for economic development in the region as the prison is expected to create 300 immediate FT federal jobs and attract a number of new businesses and industries to the area. The project will generate an anticipated \$3 million dollars in the local economy annually. Easements and Rights-of-Way will be obtained. ## Kentuckians who faced foreclosures to join settlement against company

### Beshear: Nearly 550 Kentuckians eligible for payments from firm

FRANKFORT, Ky. — Attorney General Andy Beshear is calling on the nearly 550 Kentuckians who faced foreclosures on their homes from New Jersey-based PHH Mortgage Company to sign-on to a multistate settlement against the company.

The deadline is Jan. 28, 2019.

Beshear said a third-party administrator handling payments for eligible Kentuckians mailed final notices Dec. 21.

Beshear, 48 other state attorneys general, the District of Columbia and over 45 state mortgage regulators reached the \$45 million settlement earlier this year with mortgage lender and servicer PHH Mortgage Corporation, the nation's ninth largest non-bank residential mortgage servicer.

The settlement resolves allegations that PHH impropr-

Jan. 1, 2009, through Dec. 31, 2012. Allegations of servicing improprieties included, but were not limited to, failing to timely and accurately apply payments made by borrowers; charging unauthorized fees for default-related services; and failing to properly process borrowers' applications for loan modifications.

The \$45 million settlement includes \$30.4 million in payments to borrowers.

In Kentucky, 548 borrowers are eligible for a payment:

- A total of 300 who lost their property – 66 Kentuckians in 2009; 80 Kentuckians in 2010; 97 Kentuckians in 2011; and 57 Kentuckians in 2012. These Kentuckians will qualify for a minimum \$840 payment from the settlement.

- A total of 248 whose foreclosures had not been finalized – 28 Kentuckians in 2009; 55 Kentuckians in 2010; 62 Kentuckians in 2011; and 103 Kentuckians in 2012. These Kentuckians will receive a

PHH to adhere to comprehensive mortgage servicing standards, conduct audits and provide audit results to a committee of states. The settlement does not release PHH from liability for conduct that occurred beginning in 2013.

"As Attorney General, I am committed to protecting Kentucky families, and I encourage those affected by this company to sign-on to this settlement before the deadline," Beshear said. "Besides relief for Kentuckians, the settlement holds PHH accountable for its past abusive practices. Tough standards will also require PHH to treat people fairly in the future."
