Request 1: Refer to the response to Staff's Initial Request for Information, Item 6. Explain why you do not offer the low-income energy efficiency demand-side management program known as Community Assistance Resources for Energy Savings as developed and offered by East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc.

Response 1: Clark Energy Cooperative is aware of the Community Assistance Resources for Energy Savings (CARES) program that is offered to all cooperatives for participation. Upon introduction of the CARES program, East Kentucky Power Cooperative (EKPC) invited area Community Action Agencies (CAA) and cooperatives, including Clark Energy, to an informational meeting. Clark Energy also met with a CAA prior to the EKPC-hosted meeting. Afterwards no agencies, those being the Community Action Council (Bourbon, Fayette); Kentucky River Foothills (Clark, Estill, Madison, Powell) and Gate Community Action (Bath, Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, Rowan) reached out to Clark Energy for more information about the CARES program. Therefore, Clark chose not to file a tariff after what appeared to be the lack of interest by the CAAs in our territory.
