Re: *Low-Income Weatherization Tariff Filing of Big Rivers Electric Corporation*

Dear Ms. Pinson:

In its order dated December 12, 2018, in *In the Matter of: Demand-Side Management Filing of Big Rivers Electric Corporation on behalf of Itself, Jackson Purchase Energy Corporation, and Meade County R.E.C.C. and Request to Establish a Regulatory Liability*, Case No. 2018-00236, the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") approved Big Rivers' proposal for a Low-Income Weatherization Support Program. Per Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of that order, the Commission's approval was subject to Big Rivers filing "*a tariff setting forth the program details, including a list of weatherization initiatives, support for the proposed initiatives, guidelines, and any contracts and agreements.*"

Big Rivers is filing with this letter, using the Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System, new tariff sheets to implement the new program (DSM-14 – Low-Income Weatherization Support Program), as well as related revisions to other tariff sheets. To assist with the Commission's review of these tariff changes, Big Rivers is also filing redline versions of the tariff sheets showing the changes it is making.

Under the new program, Big Rivers will provide funding to Community Action Agencies ("CAA's") in Kentucky that provide weatherization assistance to low-income retail members of Big Rivers' member distribution cooperatives (the "Members") pursuant to the United States Department of Energy's Weatherization Assistance Program ("WAP"). The CAA's will utilize the funding from Big Rivers to complete weatherization-related measures that otherwise would not be accomplished under the WAP due to limitations of government funding for (i) health and safety measures (such as standing water; mold; deteriorated lead-based paint surfaces or other hazardous materials; evidence of infestations of rodents, insects, and/or other vermin; presence of sewage or animal feces in the home; electrical or

plumbing hazards; or structural failures); and (ii) high efficiency heating, ventilation and air conditioning (“HVAC”) upgrades.

In administering the new DSM program, Big Rivers will utilize WAP forms to communications between Big Rivers and the CAA’s. Big Rivers is filing examples of those forms with this letter.

On this date, Big Rivers has provided notice of this tariff filing to its three Members – Jackson Purchase Energy Corporation, Kenergy Corp., and Meade County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation – by mailing them a copy of this letter and the other documents being filed with this letter, including the proposed tariff sheets. See 807 KAR 5:011 Section 8(2)(a). Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011 Section 8(4):

- a. The new and revised tariff sheets are expected to be filed with the Commission on May 15, 2019, and the proposed effective date is June 15, 2019.
- b. The only Big Rivers customer class to which the DSM tariffs apply is Big Rivers’ Rural class. The rates under the DSM tariff sheets are incentives and not charges. The only incentive changes in this tariff filing result from the new program. The proposed incentives under the new program are up to \$1500 per project for the cost of completed health and safety measures, and up to \$1500 per project for residential HVAC improvements. As there are presently no incentives under the program, Big Rivers is unable to calculate a percentage change.
- c. Because the incentives paid under the new program are not dependent on usage, Big Rivers is not including in this customer notice the amount of the average usage and the effect upon the average bill for each customer class to which the proposed tariff changes will apply.
- d. A person may examine this tariff filing and any other documents Big Rivers has filed with the Public Service Commission at the offices of Big Rivers located at 201 Third Street, Henderson, Kentucky 42420, and on Big Rivers’ website at <http://www.bigrivers.com/regulatory-affairs>. A person may examine this tariff filing at the Commission’s offices located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Eastern), or through the Commission’s website at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Comments regarding this tariff filing may be submitted to the Public Service Commission through its website or by mail to Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602.

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- e. The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Big Rivers, but the Public Service Commission may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates contained in this notice. A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, establishing the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the mailing of this notice, the Commission may take final action on the tariff filing.

An affidavit from an authorized Big Rivers representative verifying the contents of the customer notice, that the notice was mailed to all customers, and the date of the mailing is being filed with this letter. *See* 807 KAR 5:011 Section 8(3)(a).

WHEREAS, both the Agency and the Landlord agree to participate in the Weatherization Assistance Program for the rental property located at:

I agree to make a cash contribution in the amount of \$_____ to assist with weatherization repairs and improvements on the above referenced property.

I authorize _____,
(Agency/Service Provider)

To make the weatherization repairs and improvements to the property identified above.

In consideration of the weatherization work to be performed, the parties agree:

1. "Rent" is defined as the tenant's monthly payment to the owner (non-subsidized housing) or the contract rent (subsidized housing).
2. That the Landlord/Owner/Agent will submit a current rent schedule prior to completion of weatherization work upon request of the agency.
3. That there will be no increase on rent on any unit weatherized for a period of eighteen (18) months from the date of the final inspection as documented by the WX-710, Completed

Dwelling Report. Furthermore, the owner shall not alter any other rental agreement that is in place for an eighteen (18) month period beginning with the date of the final inspection. An exception to the rent freeze stipulation is given for those premises leased under a state or federal rent subsidy program which restricts the amount of rent the owner may charge, in which case the actual contract rent charged by the owner shall conform to the standards of the rent subsidy program.

4. That the present tenants, or any successor tenants during the term of this agreement, are the intended beneficiaries of this agreement and shall have a right of enforcement.
5. That in the event the agency determines that the owner/agent has violated the terms of this agreement, the owner/agent shall repay the agency the full value of materials and labor as documented by agency work records.
6. That in the instance that a tenant pays for energy through the rent or the instance in which the tenant does not pay directly for energy (e.g., energy costs are paid through rent, or under certain housing assistance programs, energy cost are paid for through a voucher), the landlord/owner/agent shall submit sufficient detail and explanation to allow a determination that the accrual of benefit requirements in 10 CFR 440.22 have been met. Benefits that could be combined but are not limited to: a) continuation of protection against rent increases beyond that required under the WAP regulations (10 CFR 440.22(b)(3)(ii)); b) Improvements to the head and hot water distribution, and ventilation, to improve the comfort of the tenants; c) Longer term preservation of the property as affordable housing; d) Investment of energy savings in facilities or services that offer measurable direct benefits to tenants; e) Establishment of a shared savings program; f) Investment of the energy savings from the weatherization work in specific health and safety improvements with measurable benefits to tenants; and g) other.
7. That the agency shall provide a copy of this agreement and a synopsis explaining its terms to the tenants. That the owner shall provide a synopsis explaining the terms of this agreement to subsequent tenants of the above rental units, or to the new and subsequent occupants of rental units vacant on the effective date of this agreement.
8. If at any time the owner terminates participation in this agreement the owner/agent shall repay the agency the full value of materials and labor as documented by agency work records. The owner/agency recognizes that if the owner terminates participation in this agreement without such repayment, KHC shall pursue all available legal actions to secure repayment, which shall include all court costs and attorney fees.
9. The owner shall immediately, upon entering into a non-contingent agreement of sale of premises, inform both the agency and tenants by written notice. In the event the owner sells the premises within one (1) year and six (6) months (18 months) after weatherization work is completed, the owner will comply with one of the two following conditions:
 - a. The owner shall repay the agency at the date of sale an amount equal to the amount of the labor and materials used for weatherizing the property listed in this document.
 - b. The owner shall obtain in writing prior to sale the purchaser's agreement to assume the owner's obligations under this agreement.

10. That the property owner will verify ownership of the dwelling(s) at the address indicated.

11. That the property owner will allow the residence to be inspected and will permit full access to the property and its immediate surroundings by weatherization staff and subcontractors of the service provider during all phases of work related to this program.


