#### **OPENING ORDER**

Michael Knopf (Mr. Knopf) has been named as a party to an investigation before the Kentucky Public Service Commission (Commission) for allegedly violating the Kentucky Underground Facility Damage Prevention Act (Act).<sup>1</sup>

Pursuant to KRS 278.495(2), the Commission has jurisdiction to regulate the safety of natural gas facilities in Kentucky and to enforce minimum federal pipeline safety standards. Under the Act, the Commission has authority to investigate and assess civil penalties for any violation of the Act that results in excavation damage to an underground facility used to transport natural gas or hazardous liquid subject to federal pipeline safety laws, 49 U.S.C. § 60101, et seq. Any person who violates any provision of the Act is subject to assessment of a civil penalty in the amount of \$250 for the first offense, no more than \$1,000 for the second offense within one year, and no more than \$3,000 for the third and any subsequent offense. Additionally, any person whose violation of the Act results in damage to an underground facility containing any flammable, toxic, corrosive,

or hazardous material or results in the release of any flammable, toxic, corrosive, or hazardous material is subject to an additional penalty of up to \$1,000.

Following receipt of a report of excavation damage to its underground gas pipeline from an operator, Commission Staff (Staff) conducted an investigation and prepared an Incident Report, a copy of which is attached to this Order as an Appendix. In its Incident Report, Staff cites Mr. Knopf for violation of the following provision of the Act:

KRS 367.4911(10) — When excavation or demolition is necessary within the approximate location of the underground facility, the excavator shall hand-dig or use nonintrusive means to avoid damage to the underground facility.

Based on its review of the Incident Report and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds prima facie evidence that Mr. Knopf violated the Underground Facility Damage Prevention Act. The Commission further finds that a formal investigation into the excavation damage incident should be conducted.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Mr. Knopf shall submit to the Commission, via email sent to <a href="PSCED@ky.gov">PSCED@ky.gov</a> with the case number of this proceeding in the subject line of the message, a written response to the allegations contained in the Staff Incident Report within 20 days of receipt of this Order.
- 2. Any partnership, corporation, or business entity (including a limited liability company) must be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in Kentucky, and such representation includes the filing of papers with and appearances at hearings before the Commission.
- 3. An individual may submit a response to the allegations contained in the Staff Incident Report without the representation of an attorney.

4. The Staff Incident Report 42955 in the Appendix to this Order is made a part of the record in this case.

5. Please note that notice of a hearing to be held in this matter will be mailed to Mr. Knopf once proof of service is received by the Commission. Parties who fail to appear after service will be subject to entry of a default judgment against them.

On 06/11/21 an email was sent to the Excavator at MKNOPF14@GMAIL.COM. Mr. Knopf responded to the email via telephone and stated that the markings were off by a foot and he would provide photographs. Mr. Knopf stated that a tree was in the way, the service loop around the tree and the markings did not illustrate the loop.

On 06/11/21, via email, the Operator, LG&E's Mike Jones, stated that the markings around the tree where well within in the approximate location/"tolerance zone" of 18 inches. Mr. Jones provide a pre-excavation photograph and three damage photographs which indicate the damage occurred within the approximate location as defined in KRS 367.4903 (11)(a).

Mr. Jones's email and photographs are include an Attachment 3.

On 06/14/21, via email, the photographs provided by LG&E (See Attachment 3) were sent to Mr. Knopf, options were offered to resolve this incident and a response by 06/18/21.

On 06/21/21 follow up call to Mr. Knopf resulted in a message being left.

Due to no response from Mr. Knopf a Demand Letter offering the Damage Prevention Course and reduced penalty of \$100.00 will be sent.



If you have evidence to indicating otherwise, send. If no evidence is available and this being your first offence there are three options offered for resolution:

- 1. Pay the reduce penalty of \$100.00 and attend the Damage Prevention Course held on line. Typically on the first Monday of each month from 9:00 am to 11:00am (EST).
- 2. Pay the full penalty of \$500.00.
- 3. In writing request a hearing before the Commission.

If you chose option one or two I will draft a letter and send it to 2515 Bradley Ave., Louisville, KY 40217, outlining the details of how to register for the course and/or how to make the penalty payment.
