ORDER

On March 3, 2023, MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services (Verizon Access) filed a motion, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878, requesting that the Commission grant confidential treatment for five years for the highlighted information in Exhibit 2 of the application.¹

In support of its motion, Verizon Access argued that disclosure of the highlighted information would permit an unfair commercial advantage to competitors of Verizon Access pursuant to KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1).²

Having considered the motion and the material at issue, the Commission finds that the highlighted information in Exhibit 2 of the application is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary as disclosure of the information would disadvantage Verizon Access. The material, therefore, meets the criteria for confidential treatment and should

be exempted from public disclosure for a period of five years pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13, and KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Verizon Access's March 3, 2023 motion for confidential treatment is granted.

2. The designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order shall not be placed in the public record or made available for public inspection for five years or until further order of this Commission.

3. Use of the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order in any Commission proceeding shall comply with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 13(9).

4. If the designated material granted confidential treatment by this Order becomes publicly available or no longer qualifies for confidential treatment, Verizon Access shall inform the Commission and file with the Commission an unredacted copy of the designated material.

5. If a nonparty to this proceeding requests to inspect the material granted confidential treatment by this Order and the period during which the material has been granted confidential treatment has not expired, Verizon Access shall have 20 days from receipt of written notice of the request to demonstrate that the material still falls within the exclusions from disclosure requirements established in KRS 61.878. If Verizon Access is unable to make such demonstration, the requested material shall be made available for inspection. Otherwise, the Commission shall deny the request for inspection.

6. The Commission shall not make the requested material available for inspection for 30 days from the date of service of an Order finding that the material no

longer qualifies for confidential treatment in order to allow Verizon Access to seek a remedy afforded by law.

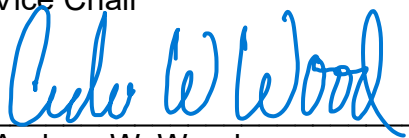
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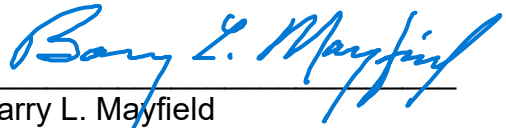
