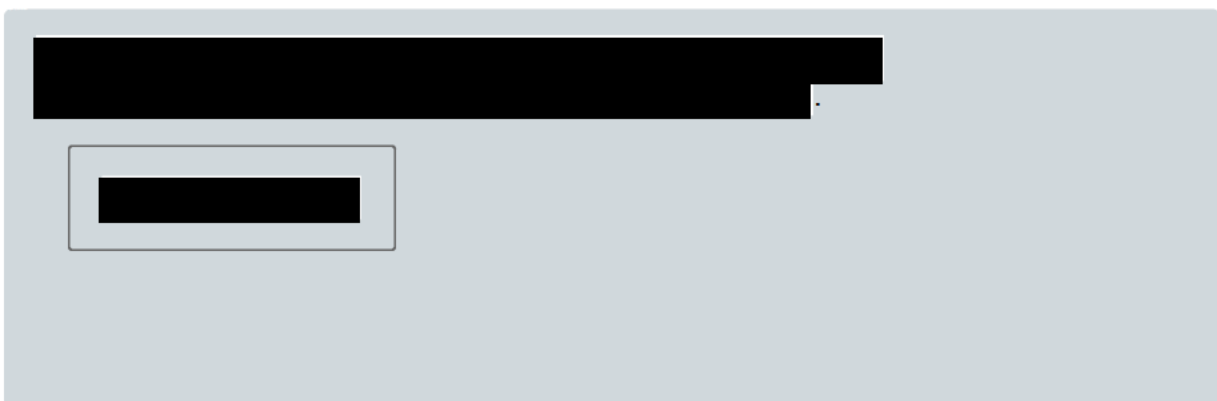

As a customer of Kentucky Utilities Company (KU) I received a notice from them that they had applied to the Kentucky Public Services Commission for a rate increase to be effective July 1, 2025.

The information provided by KU stated that the proposed annual increase in revenue to KU would be about 11.5 %. What immediately jumped out at me was the fact that residential customers would be facing 13.55% and 13.05% increases, while other customers were all under the 11.55% increase. Thus, residential customers would be paying a greater portion of KU's increased revenue. This certainly isn't equitable and adds to the cost of living of the individual customers. The rate increase shouldn't burden the most vulnerable residential customers more than others; the rate increase needs to be equitable for all.
