We cannot afford to pay more! LG&E-KU is not seriously working towards improving energy efficiency and other programs that help people lower their bills. They are also cutting our

ability to invest in low-cost, rooftop solar that would reduce the need to build expensive power plants in the future. The "large-load tariff" to try and determine who pays for new energy infrastructure built for specific industrial purposes (i.e., when a new data center is proposed and to build a whole new gas plant to power it) does not offer enough protection for residential and small business ratepayers.
