**APPLICATION**

Kentucky Power Company (“Kentucky Power” or “Company”) applies to the Public Service Commission of Kentucky (“Commission”) pursuant to KRS 278.020(1), KRS 278.183, 807 KAR 5:001, Section 14, 807 KAR 5:001, Section 15, 807 KAR 5:011, and all other applicable statutes and regulations, for an order granting: (1) a certificate of public convenience and necessity (“CPCN”) authorizing the Company to make the capital investments necessary to continue taking 50% of the capacity and energy from the Mitchell Generating Station (“Mitchell Plant”, “Mitchell”, or the “Plant”) after December 31, 2028; (2) approval of its 2025 Environmental Compliance Plan; (3) approval of amendments to its Tariff Environmental Surcharge (“Tariff E.S.”) to reflect its 2025 Environmental Compliance Plan and amended environmental cost recovery surcharge; (4) deferral authority for the approximately \$20.1 million share of environmental costs that have been charged to West Virginia customers; and (5) all other required approvals and relief.
